Dr. Hastings lives in Gainesville, GA with her husband Christopher and







Isaiah 3:24-26 gives us details of the judgment that God would send on Judah because of her sins: "And it shall come to pass, that instead of sweet smell there shall be stink; and instead of a girdle a rent; and instead of well set hair baldness; and instead of a stomacher a girding of sackcloth; and burning instead of beauty. Thy men shall fall by the sword, and thy mighty in the war. And her gates shall lament and mourn; and she being desolate shall sit upon the ground." It seems that most people in our modern age do not want to hear much that "sounds negative" in writing, teaching or preaching, yet the Bible writers gave perhaps more negative information than positive. Most of us who speak for the Lord do not get any glee out of speaking, or writing, about negative things, but we are duty bound to deliver God's message as He gave it, not as the people want it to be given. Again I want to say that God has

absolutely nothing against her! beauty, even when it is accompanied by jewelry etc., but God's gripe is with the pride with which some people wear these items. In our lessons from Israel, it was an entire nation that was so proud of who they were that they forgot that God was the One Who made them great. As a consequence, their greatness ceased to be greatness, and their beauty ceased to attract the attention of other nations, and especially of God! It needs to be emphasized again that "beauty is as beauty does", or "pretty is as pretty does". This is true of individuals and nations. If Judah had really been beautiful in the sight of God, He would not



The verses I gave above show that the sweetness that Judah once possessed had become a stinking smell. The girdle (actually a belt here) had become more like a rope around the waist, which is deplorable. The hair that had been well set was now replaced with baldness. The stomacher, probably a figured mantle worn on holidays, had now become a girding with sackcloth, which was a cheap cloth worn during mourning. Beauty had been replaced with burning. Now the men of Judah would lose in the battle with the enemy; the gates of Judah's cities would be filled with mourners and Judah would sit on the ground in desolation, for her cites

any think that this could not happen to countries in our day, I would remind them that Judah was once the apple of God's eye; her beauty in God's sight was remarkable, but now she was coming to ruin. All of this is pictured in the "beautiful woman", whose beauty had become deplorable, because she was filled with pride and other sins against God. Do you know any nation, or nations, that might be in danger of facing God's judgment for doing the same things that the nation of Judah and its cities were doing? It would be good if we could learn from the history of nations and cites that fell for doing exactly the same things that most of the nations of the world are doing right now, including our beloved nation!







EXHIBIT A - COUNTY GOVERNMENT RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

The Board of Supervisors, acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County"), took up for consideration the matter of authorizing and approving a loan ehalf of the County from the Mississippi Development Authority (the "MDA") for the purpose of assisting existing industries deploying long term fixed assets that through new pologies will improve productivity and competiveness and to assist existing industries through the purchase of land, buildings and equipment.

Thereupon Supervisor Brandon Grissom offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE A LOAN ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY FROM THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN A MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THREE MILLION DOLLARS (\$3,000,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF MODIFICATION OF EXISTING BUILDING TO MEET MANUFACTURING REQUIREMENTS: such as new HVAC, air compressor, fencing, improvements to an existing door, driveway modification, electrical upgrades, crane upgrades, and other building improvements.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "County"), does hereby find order and resolve, determine, adjudicate and deas follows:

- The Mississippi Existing Industry Productivity Loan, constituting Sections 57-93-1 et. seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), was enacted for the purpose of noting business and economic development in the state of Mississippi (the "State") through investment by private companies locating in the State.
- 2. Pursuant to Section 57-93-1 of the Act, the MDA is authorized to make interest-bearing loans to state, counties or incorporated municipalities for the purpose of making loans to ting industries to deploy long term fixed assets.
- 3. The County will agree to assist existing industries and will request the MDA to finance a portion of the cost associated with the development of these improvements (the "Project").
- Pursuant to the Act and guidelines adopted by the MDA, the County will file an application with the MDA for a loan to be used for the development of the Project in the amount ree Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) (the "Loan").
- The County and the Authority will enter into a Loan Agreement (the "Agreement") with the MDA wherein the County agrees to borrow the proceeds of the Loan subject to and d ca the terms and conditions of the Agreement.
 - In order to secure the Loan, the County will execute and deliver to the MDA a Promissory Note (the "Note"). Failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result e forfeiture of homestead exemption annual tax loss reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due pursuant to Section 57-93-1 of the Act.
 - 7. The Loan shall not be deemed indebtedness within the meaning specified in Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Governing Body of the County does hereby declare its intention to authorize and approve a Loan from the MDA in the principal amount not to exceed Three Million rs (\$3,000,000) for the purpose of making loans to existing industries to deploy long term fixed assets.
- Pealection 2. The Loan will be secured by a Note executed and delivered by the County to MDA. Pursuant to Section 57-93-1 of the Act, failure of the County to meet its repayment tions shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption exemption annual tax loss reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as the indebtedhas been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the MDA have been made.
- ded section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the MDA in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be ust lat its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse in luka, Mississippi at 9:00 a.m. on the 2nd day of August, 2021, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If twenty percent or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, of the qualified electors in the County shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the County against the authorization and approval for oan on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Loan shall not be entered into unless authorized at an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan. Such tion shall be called and held as provided by law. If no protest is filed, then the Loan may be entered into without an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan at time within a period of two (2) years after the date above specified.
 - Section 4. This Resolution shall be published once a week for at least four (4) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in the City of luka, mingo County, Mississippi and having a general circulation in the County and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first cation of this Resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to August 02, 2021 and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such said Resolution to be published on July 08, 15, 22, and 29, 2021.
 - section 5. The Clerk of the County shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of said publication of this Resolution have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 3 hereof.



Happy belated Fourth dom, since July 4, 1//6! It looks like 300 years. We know that our freedom has not been free. It has cost in lives more than I can conceive, but America is still the greatest, free nation in the world. God has so blessed us even with all our failures. How long will He continue to have mercy on America? Only God knows.

Now, back to the history of the churches in Tishomingo:

The Tishomingo Church of Christ held it first meeting in a bush arbor on the high school campus. Soon after the tornado in 1913, Mr. Fred Belue and Mr. Ward Glasgow were instrumental in building the first church building. Mr. Steve McDougal furnished the team of mules and wagon and Mr. George McRae drove them to Bay Springs to pick up the sills for the building. Years later this building was torn down and a new one was built. It now stands on the original site but has been remodeled twice. (Remember those stats were written in

Bro. John Smith and T. B. Lattimore were among the first ministers.

In 1977, Mrs. George McRae is the only known charter member living today (1977) who saw the beginning of the church. Although Mrs. McRae is blind, she still attends church faithfully by walking along, alone, using a walking stick on a wire that leads her from the house to the church. I got to witness this. Such love of worship.

Digress: I had the privof July to all of you! Get ilege of talking with Mrs. up. Get out and don't for- McRae. My sister, Hilda get to celebrate our free- and Norman Holman, had an apartment in her home for a few years and they were just like familv. Norman was the Post Master and Hilda was secretary to Mr. Hubert Day at the Blue Bell Clothing factory that employed several hundred in 1953. This plant really gave

> a boost to the local economy. Most of the workers were women. This helped their husband and boosted their income. I was teaching at Paden School and it really helped all the children. There was money for school lunches and extra materials for the classrooms. I bought a home copy machine and the school was able to furnish the papers.

This copy machine was made in a pan about like a cookie pan only a little deeper. I bought a can of this "jelly," put in on the stove in the small cooker and kept it in hot water until it became liquid. Then I poured it into the pan. By the time I would get home from school it would be a hard jelly. This was for reproducing Mimeograph sheets. (Today sounds crude but sure helped the teacher as well as the students.) Prior to this, I had chalk most of the time and always a Bible on my desk. In the back of most of the books in the classroom was a dictionary. We were as deprived of all these wonderful aids teachers have today but we didn't know it. All these wonderful aids hadn't been thought of in Tishomingo at this time (1950's).

The last church is the United Pentecostal




William Church. Bro. Hayward Burcham started services in a store building about 1970. Then about one year later they built a church on Hwy. 25 North. Bro. Burcham was pastor then and he is still the pastor (2021). Wonderful!

No more history from 1977, but they have built behind the first church a beautiful, large church. The new church faces Hwy. 25, too, and the old church is a nice fellowship hall. The new church has a large foyer and I would guess it has the largest sanctuary of any church in the county. They have a large attendance. How do I know? The Nelson Brothers in World War II

Taken from Tishomingo County, Mississippi: History and Families, 1836-1997. Rose Pub., 1997.

Omer Callicott (O.C.) Nelson, first son of James Omer and Altye Callicott Nelson, was born in Tishomingo County, MS. on December 24, 1920. He spent his early years on the family farm at Holcut, MS. and attended school in Iuka, MS. where the family resided during the school term each year. Following graduation from Iuka High School he spent two years at Mississippi State University before entering the U.S. Army Air Corps as an Aviation Cadet. He graduated from flying school in 1944 and was commissioned a 2nd Lt. O.C. remained in the U.S. Air Force for 30 years and retired from active duty on August 1, 1972 as a Command Pilot with the rank of Colonel. He logged over 10,000 pilot hours in B-24, B-17, B-25, C-54, C-47, C-119, C-123 and C-130 type aircraft.

His decorations include the Bronze Star, Meritorious Service medal, Air Medal with 5 Oak Leaf Clusters, AF Commendation Medal, Presidential Unit Citation, AF Outstanding Unit Award, Korean Service Medal with 6 Battle Stars and many other service medals and awards. O.C. saw action in Germany flying the Berlin Airlift, the Korean Conflict and in Vietnam.

Colonel Nelson married Elizabeth June (Bette) Switzer, daughter of George Vernon and Grace Ansley Switzer of Miami, Fla. They lived in many places during the years of active military service including 2 foreign countries. After retirement from the Air Force they made their home in Iuka, Ms. in Tishomingo County. O.C. owned and managed Nelson's Marine and Hardware Co. in Iuka from 1972 until the business was sold in 1988. O.C. also served on the Board of Directors for

Bank for many years. O.C. and Bette are the parents of three sons, Gary Allen, James Omer (Jim) and Robert Lee (Bob) Nelson.

Merle L. Nelson is the younger of the two sons. He was born May 11, 1924 at Holcut, MS. where he spent most of his early life. The family would spend some winters in Iuka where Merle attended school and at Holcut but returned to Holcut to graduate in January 1943.

Serving in the Pacific Theater, Merle left Riverside, CA for Kauai in the Hawaiian Islands, then Palawan in the Philippines, then to Clark Air Force Base in Manila on the Island of Luzon. He then went to Okinawa, near Japan, and Osaka and Tokyo in Japan.

Flying mostly reconnaissance missions he attained the rank of First Lieutenant. When the war ended Merle entered the Active Reserves.

In May 1953 Merle and Helen purchased Mill Creek Boat Dock and operated it until they sold it in 1967. They also owned and operated a loan office, Nelson Finance Company, from 1963 to 1985 when the company was dissolved.
