students in hand washing effectiveness as it relates to killing viruses. While hot water is not necessary, proper hand washing for 20 seconds is necessary. So we felt adding the hot water with our K-4 students would encourage them to wash longer to meet that 20 second goal," explained Holly. "We are looking to install touchless toilet flush kits district-wide with ESSER funds as well, to not only help with the health of our staff and students, but to also assist in water conservation." Other plans for ESSER funds include upgrades to many of the district's aging HVAC systems in an effort to improve the air quality in school buildings and gyms, after-school programs, kindergarten assistants, tutors during the school day, and some additional technology needs with projectors, speakers, and device refresh purchases over the next three years.

While plans have been made all summer to return to more normalcy, the COVID-19 delta variant still needs to be taken seriously. The Mississippi State Department of Health has recommended in its latest guidance

(issued on July 30th) that all individuals, vaccinated and unvaccinated, should wear masks while indoors. At this time, that will be the parents' decision for their children in the district. "We encourage parents to do what they feel is best for their children when it comes to their health and protection as it pertains to wearing a mask. While masking is recommended, it is not required at this time. The CDC and MSDH have stated that if both a COVID-positive person and a person deemed a close contact to that positive person are wearing masks, and the individuals are at least 3 feet apart, the close contact would not have to be quarantined. The guidance also states that vaccinated students and staff do not have to quarantine if exposed, but should monitor for symptoms. All of the new guidelines and protocols are on our district website, and we will communicate to parents if anything changes," explained Holly. "We are going to continue to clean, to wash hands, to teach proper hygiene, to encourage social distancing, and to protect our staff and students as best we can."

Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley to Hold Town Hall Meeting Tonight

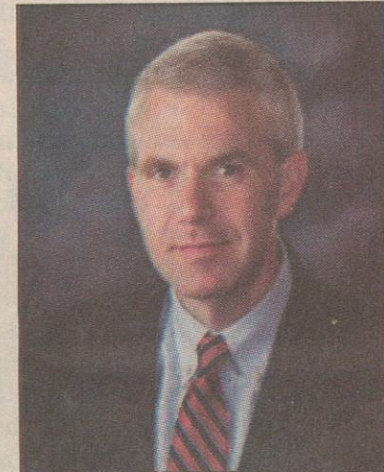
Special Invitation to the Public: Thursday, August 5th at 6:00 p.m.

He is also a member of the Trail of Tears Association which is dedicated to preserving the history of the forced removal of the Cherokee and other tribes from the southeast during the 1830s.

Kim Richardson, Genealogist Southern Heritage Genealogy Professional genealogist. Kim Richardson founded Southern Heritage Genealogy from her love of family history. She is passionate

about her work and enjoys serving the genealogy community by teaching and enabling others to do their own research successfully. Richardson lives in Oxford, Mississippi, and graduated from Mississippi State University in 1996 with a BA in Communication. Since then, she has been serving the state of Mississippi, working in highway safety programs and as an advocate for victims of violent crimes. In her role as a genealogist, she not only helps her clients achieve their own genealogy goals, but she has also researched for Finding Your Roots and Who Do You Think You Are?

John Ware is retired from Schering-Plough/Merck Pharmaceuticals, where he was employed as a Research Chemist and Project Systems Analyst. John has been married for over 46 years to his high school sweetheart and they have two children and two grandchildren. He began family research with his mother in the 1960's and took over the effort in the mid 1990's. Additionally, after his parents' death, he began researching his biological line, which begins in Stephens County Minnesota and traces to Soro, Denmark. He served as Vice President of the Tennessee Genealogical Society for four years and is presently a Director at Large for TNGS. He is also a member of the Minnesota, Georgia, and Augusta Genealogical Societies.

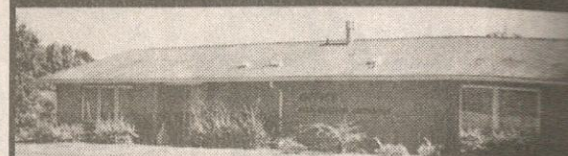

Feemster and Johnson, architects and engineers, installed our present water works system in Feb. 1946.

Cole Manufacturing Company erected the steel water tank and tower in 1947.

In 1947 Layme Central Co. drilled a deep well on the A. C. Gardner place. Today (1977) the town is supplied by spring water from the Andrew Jackson Spring.

In 1953 Blue Bell, Inc. opened a manufacturing plant that employed several hundred. H. M. Day was manager from 1953 until 1976 when he retired.

J. G. Murry and Lymon Ray erected Tishomingo Grain and Elevator in 1956.

In 1957 Mr. George Norton took over the business and was owner until his death in 1976. Today James Ray and brother-in-law operates this business. In 1960 Mid South Telephone Co. went into operation.

The sewer system (lagoon) was constructed in 1964. Natural gas was installed in 1971.

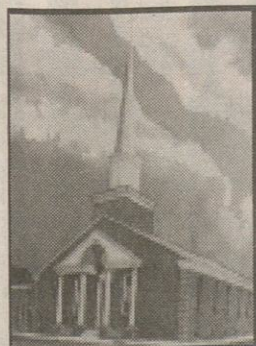
