"Gestalt Gardener"

by Felder Rushing

I'm not the name police; when I get the "What's this plant called" question, I'm of two minds. Does it really matter that the antique shrub officially named Philadelphus is more commonly called both mock orange and English dogwood?

On one hand, I prefer precise Latin names, but sometimes I just go with what Aunt Mamie calls it. Even when she's adamant that daf-

fodils are yellow and Narcissus is white, I keep to myself that that Narcissus is the overarching Latin name for all

Here's another: That common-as-muck spring bulb with flowers of white-with-green dots your mama called snowdrops? Nope, the real snowdrops (Galanthus) don't flower in Mississippi; what we grow are snowflakes (Leucojum). The name makes no difference to anyone, until you purchase real snowdrops and wonder why they

don't flower here. Right now it's all about "naked ladies" which is an heirloom bulb with midsummer clusters of big pink flowers on leafless stems. Polite garden club ladies refer to Lycoris squamigera as either surprise lily or magic lily; its close relative, the later-blooming red "spider lily" (Lycoris radiata), is sometimes called hurricane lily be-

cause it flowers after heavy rains in late summer. Both kinds of Lycoris grow exactly like daffodils: Winter sunshine, not in standing water, and leave the foliage alone 'til it turns yellow. Lycoris are easy to transplant as soon as they finish flowering, or plant storebought bulbs by November, so they can get a head start on winter.

But back to what folks call it. Over half a century before Carl Linnaeus published our current "official" plant naming system, Juliet Capulet seemed just as ambivalent, asking her ill-fated secret lover, "What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other word would smell as sweet."

Standardized Latin taxonomy is essential for horticulturists and people from different cultures and languages to communicate precisely. And yet proper Latin names, which are sometimes actually Greek or English, are themselves occasionally changed; Hosta used to be Funkia. Sheesh.

But amongst gardeners, with some bit of confusion, vernacular names roughly work. As nature writer Richard Mabey put it, "Latin names are fine for textbooks, but the beautiful common names we give to our flora and fauna are part of a shared poetry stretching back thousands of years."

There are dozens of folk names for dandelions, which itself is derived from the French dent de lion, or lion's tooth, in reference to the jagged margins of the lance-shaped leaves; I've heard its seed heads called dandy-puffs. Ever wonder where lungwort got its folk name? The Doctrine of Signature, dating back thousands of years, held that herbs resembling various parts of the body could be used to treat ailments of those body parts - a pseudoscience that has led to many deaths.

In England okra is called ladies' fingers; prickly pear isn't a pear, not all muscadines are scuppernongs, asparagus fern isn't a fern, tiger lilies are spotted not striped, Rose of Sharon isn't a rose, and blackberry lily is neither.

Shall I continue? Just a few descriptive or fanciful names we use: buttercup, foxglove, honeysuckle, snapdragon, wormwood, angel trumpet, goldenrod, blazing star, daylily, touch-me-not, lamb's ears, bluebells, toadstool, lacebark elm, buckeye, cypress vine, monkey grass, cast iron plant, elephant ears, milk and wine lily, violets, sunflower... And none are official.

Some don't even make sense. Shouldn't four o'clocks name be adjusted during Daylight Saving Time? And who in their right mind changed snake plant, a folk name for Sansevieria, to mother-in-law tongue?

Meanwhile, my garden's naked ladies are showing out as usual. What a magical surprise!



2021 TCHS Braves Football Preview

The Vidette was able to sit down with TCHS Head Football Coach Richard Russo for a preseason preview of the GridIron Braves. Russo said, "This year's version of the Braves has tremendous potential. I have not been this excited about the prospects of a team's season in a while. However, potential is just that, it is the possibility of a high ceiling, everyone must Row in the same direction from the players, the coaches, the managers, the support staff, the boosters, and all three towns. If that occurs and we take it one rep at a time, one practice at a time, one game at a time, and one play at a time, we have a chance at a very successful season. The boys have had a tremendous offseason and 39 members of our roster made the elite Super Brave Summer Workout Club."

Quarterbacks

Second year starter Senior Blake Counce returns to the helm after an impressive season as a first-time signal caller. Counce's decision making, and arm had an impressive three game run against Belmont, East Union, and Lewisburg in 2020. Russo stated that he should flourish in their new offense which they have built around Counce's skill set and what he does well. Expect Counce to be more balanced and have more of an impact in the ground game than in the past. Backing him up will be Junior Chandler Williams, Sophomore Eli Edwards, and Freshman Thomas Barnes.

Running Backs

Russo stated that the Braves will base out of two back sets a lot more than the 2020 version did. The tailback duties should see Junior Chandler Williams getting the bulk of the carriers. Seniors David Tiernan and Bryan Scales will back him up. The Fullback position will see Sophomore Triston Stanford, Junior Jaxson Pryce-Jones, Senior Konnor Tuders, and Senior Landon Osborn on a rotation.

Offensive Line and Tight Ends

Gone is 2020 Standout Jim Riley who is now on an SEC Roster in Starkville. The coaches are hoping that Senior Austin Hairrell, just as good of a frame as Riley, will step up and be the anchor of the "Hawgs" Offensive Line. As of press time, Russo states that McKinley Davis, Shea Harwell, Caleb Curtis, and Cade Bishop are the current starters. However, Clint Phifer and Logan Johnson will push each of these young men to be in that starting rotation. The Braves new Offense will utilize a Tight End this season rather than the H-Back they featured in 2020. There will be a youth movement at the position with Sophomore Houston Richardson and Freshman Wesley Baker seeing the bulk of the reps early. Senior Seth Stidham will push these young men hard for playing time.

Wide Receivers

Senior Mason Daniel really flourished down the stretch for the Braves. He will anchor the Split End position in their Heavy sets, while he will operate out of the Slot in their Spread Sets. Junior Rylee Weeks will serve as the Flanker in the Heavy Sets, while Senior Chase Hopkins and Junior Austin Hankins will relieve him in the Spread Sets.

Defensive Line

The self-proclaimed "Wrecking Crew" Defensive Line will be anchored by three Seniors, Jackson Stuart, Caleb Bonds, and Seth Stidham. Junior Caleb Norman came on strong during Spring Tryouts to earn the fourth spot. The X-Factor is Senior Move-In Eli Ledbetter. The coaches are anxious to see what he can do. On third and long packages, Scales, Pryce-Jones and Stidham serve as rush ends, or Psycho Ends as Russo called them.

Linebackers

2020 leading tackler Tyriek Duckett has moved on to college. To fill that void, Russo moved the most productive Defensive Back Senior Bryan Scales to the "Nasty Corps" Linebacking crew. Scales should anchor the weak-side while Junior Jaxson

Pryce-Jones is penciled in at the Strong Side. The surprise of the spring was the emergence of Freshman Linebacker Tristan Poling. He not only earned the starting spot but led the Varsity in Tackles in the Spring Game at Saltillo. Also competing for playing time will be Stanford, Freshman Owen Nash, Freshman Nick Colley, Sophomore Gavin Ross, and Sophomore Layton Monroe.

Defensive Backs

The Secondary is inexperienced, but very talented as they return no starters with Scales moving to the Linebacking Corps. The Corners are expected to be Hopkins and Hankins, while the Safeties are expected to be Senior Gage Tackett and Senior Joshua Moore. Williams will provide quality depth. Nickels are expected to be Dan-

iel, Williams, and Tuders. Russo says this group will get better and better as the season progresses.

Specialists

Gone are Scott Robinson's booming Kickoffs and Punts, as he now kicks for the UNA Lions. Replacing him will be a battle between Daniel and Weeks at all positions. Luckily for the Braves, Harwell, an All-Region Long Snapper as a true Freshman, returns. Punt Snapping duties will be a battle between Stuart and Bonds. Holding duties could range from Williams, to Edwards, or possibly Gavin Ross.
