Hollingsworth Wins 2021-22 Most Beautiful Title at NEMCC

COONEVILLE, MISS. -- (11/12/2021) Northeast Mississippi Community College first-student Chloe Addison Hollingsworth of Tishomingo was crowned the college's Most Beautiful at the school's annual Parade of Beauties pageant on Tuesday, November 9, 2021.

Hollingsworth's crowning meant that the Tishomingo freshman became the seventh first-student in the last eight years that the pageant has been held to win the one-night affair.

Chloe, the daughter of Tina and Lance Hollingsworth, topped a 43-person field on Tuesday, November 9 to take home the title of Most Beautiful.

She was crowned by the college's reigning Most Beautiful for 2019-2020 Kathryn Allen of Memphis, Tennessee and was awarded flowers by the pageant president Dr. Ricky G. Ford.

Contestants in the annual pageant are judged on poise, elegance and beauty.

As part of their on-stage presentation, contestants in the pageant had to tell about their hobbies and answer a question beforehand, with the answers being read by the Parade of Beauties emcee. The contestant presented poise, elegance and beauty on stage.

This year's question was, "What is one thing you enjoy about Northeast?"

Hollingsworth responded with "Chloe enjoys spending time with the new friends that she has made at Northeast and enjoys cheering on the Tishomingo Thursday night during football season."

Hollingsworth listed her hobbies as working on the Tiger football team, being a member of the Northeast cheer squad, singing and making makeovers.

During her time at Northeast, Chloe plans to continue on an area of concentration in chemical engineering.

New Athletic/Activity Pass for Veterans

The Tishomingo County School District is pleased to announce a new athletic/activity pass for veterans (active or past military members). The pass allows any veteran FREE admittance into any MHSAA-sanctioned event in the district. The board and district want to show our appreciation to those who have served our communities that have

served or currently serve in our military. They have sacrificed so much for us. This is a small token to let them know they are appreciated and respected," stated Superintendent Christie Holly. To get a pass, a veteran will simply go to one of the district schools and fill out an application. Proof of military service must be presented at the

time of the application process. Each approved applicant will receive a card that will serve as their Veteran Pass. The pass should be presented upon entry into an athletic event or activity (MHSAA-sanctioned) for free admittance into the event. If anyone has questions, he/she can contact a district school or the district office.


A loyal and dedicated alumna, Rona is also an active member of the MSU Alumni Association through involvement



A 9 year old boy, in the 4th grade, discovered a toy gun flashlight keychain in his coat pocket that someone had left him. When his Principal found out, his Mother was called to pick him up and he was suspended from school for three days. Upon returning to school, he was sent to in-school suspension for FIVE more days. This is where kids sit in a cubicle in isolation all day and interact with no one. Lunch is brought to the cubicle.

I just wonder if other parents or even the school board thinks this punishment is a bit extreme, considering the age of the student and the situation. If he had been known it was in his pocket or intentionally carried a flashlight to school to threaten someone, it would be different. But I am just wondering what they are trying to teach the kid by treating him like a criminal? Is a flashlight a weapon? Are all cases the same where the same rules apply? Is it blanket punishment? 

Iuka Native William Henry "Bill" Slaughter Sr. dies in Junction City, KS at age 101

William Henry "Bill" Slaughter Sr., 101, of Junction City, Kansas, died October 2, 2021 at his residence, and he was buried with full military honors at the Kansas Veterans' Cemetery.

Slaughter, the great-uncle of Iuka Alderman Johnny Southward and home health nurse Janie Tensley, was born May 24, 1920, in Iuka, Mississippi, Tishomingo County, the son of James L. and Litha Mae (Jackson) Slaughter. He was one of five children.

His formal schooling was only to the fifth grade because, like many children during the 1930s, he needed to work to help support the family. However, his learning never stopped.

Slaughter started working at a gas station at the age of 10. By the age of 12, he once said, there wasn't a car that he couldn't fix. He was considered a master mechanic at a young age. He later went to work for Dexter Lumber Company as a truck driver and mechanic. While working for Mr. Dexter, he purchased his first car at the age of 15.

Slaughter served in the U.S. Army during World War II, from 1942 until 1945. He served a full tour in England as a driver for his captain. He was one of seven Black soldiers for the 89th Medical Detachment. Upon returning to Iuka after the war ended, he found it was hard to find work in Mississippi, so he moved to Kentucky and found work with the railroad.

Slaughter moved to Fort Riley, Kansas in 1949 and became a tank mechanic. Within seven years he was promoted to shop foreman, where he worked for 32 years, then retired in 1980.

Slaughter worked to the end of his life. He single-handedly planted and gathered a garden of butter beans, green beans, ice potatoes (his made-up name for them), turnip greens and corn, and the week of his passing he canned 12 jars of fresh pear preserves.

He continued to do all of this gardening after the loss of his right leg, which was amputated in 1917. He often was quoted as saying, "I lost my leg, not my mind," and was known for his resourcefulness.

William Slaughter met and married Hattie Bell Thompson, also of Iuka, on May 3, 1941. From this union, eight children were born. She predeceased him July 31, 2000. He also was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers and two sisters.

Proper Disposal of Deer Carcass

by James L. Cummins With the passing of each year, there appears to be an increasing number of deer carcasses appearing on roadsides in streams or rivers. These dumping practices are not only illegal, but also unhealthy. I am an avid hunter and spend most of my spare time trying to enjoy the sport of hunting and the conservation of natural resources of our state and our nation. Not everyone feels like I do. Some spend as much, or more, time trying to outlaw hunting as I do trying to further it. While I totally disagree with those in our society with such beliefs, we as a group of hunters, should not do anything to further the cause of the anti-hunting public, give those that are in-ferent about hunting, a reason to oppose it. In other words, we should not read the byproduct, or carcass, of a successful hunt in areas where other people have to view it or areas that could cause a public health issue. There is already a law prohibiting such activity. Section 971529 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 prohibits the dumping of dead fish and wildlife, or parts, or waste on Mississippi's roadways or on the right-of-ways or on private property without the landowner's consent. Caught, an offender can be charged with a misdemeanor and fined up to \$100.

Deer carcasses dumped in streams and rivers can pose a human health risk. This risk comes from the drinking of water contaminated by decomposing deer carcasses. Roadsides, streams, and rivers are not open areas. Two recommended methods of disposal are to dig a pit in which to place the carcass or take it to a deer processor who will properly dispose of or compost it. This is legal and respectful to the sport. And if you can't do that, place the carcass in an area where it cannot be viewed and it is not near your homes. It won't take long for the coyotes and buzzards to salvage the rest of it.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, DECLARING THE INTENTION TO ISSUE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY, TO ISSUE A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND OF THE COUNTY FOR SALE TO THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT BANK, OR TO ENTER INTO A LOAN AGREEMENT WITH THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT BANK, IN PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$6,000,000, IN ONE OR MORE SERIES, TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, RECONSTRUCTING, AND REPAIRING ROADS, HIGHWAYS, AND BRIDGES, AND ACQUIRING THE NECESSARY LAND, INCLUDING LAND FOR ROAD BUILDING MATERIALS, ACQUIRING RIGHTS-OF-WAY THEREFOR, AND FOR THE PURCHASE OF HEAVY CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT AND ACCESSORIES THERETO REASONABLY REQUIRED TO CONSTRUCT, REPAIR, AND RENOVATE ROADS, HIGHWAYS, AND BRIDGES AND APPROACHES THERETO WITHIN THE COUNTY; AND PURCHASING MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT WHICH HAVE AN EXPECTED USEFUL LIFE IN EXCESS OF 10 YEARS; DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "County"), acting for and on behalf of the County, hereby finds, determines, adjudicates, and declares as follows:

1. It is necessary and in the public interest to issue debt obligations of the County to provide funds for the purpose of (i) constructing, reconstructing, and repairing roads, highways, and bridges, and acquiring the necessary land, including land for road building materials, acquiring rights-of-way therefor, and for the purchase of heavy construction equipment and accessories thereto reasonably required to construct, repair, and renovate roads, highways, and bridges and approaches thereto within the County; and purchasing machinery and equipment which have an expected useful life in excess of 10 years (the "Authorized Purpose"); (ii) funding a capitalized interest account, if necessary; and, (iii) paying the costs of the authorization, issuance, sale, validation, and delivery of the debt obligations (together, the "Project")

2. The County is authorized by Sections 1991 *et seq.*, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "County Improvements Act"), to issue general obligation bonds of the County in an amount not to exceed the principal amount of \$6,000,000, in one or more series (the "Bonds"), for the Project, and for which purpose there are no other available funds on hand.

3. The assessed value of all taxable property within the County, according to the last completed assessment for taxation, is \$187,733,636. The County has outstanding bonded indebtedness subject to the 15% debt limit prescribed by the County Improvements Act, in the amount of \$3,780,000, and outstanding bonded and floating indebtedness subject to the 20% debt limit prescribed by the County Improvements Act (which amount includes the sum set forth above subject to the 15% debt limit), in the amount of \$3,780,000. The issuance of the bonded indebtedness hereinafter proposed to be issued, when added to the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the County, will not result in bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid 15% debt limit, of more than 15% of the assessed value of taxable property within the County, and will not result in indebtedness, both bonded and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid 20% debt limit, in excess of 20% of the assessed value of taxable property within the County, and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by the County.

4. Under the provisions of the County Improvements Act, Sections 31-25-1 *et seq.*, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Bank Act"), and other applicable laws of the State of Mississippi (the "State"), the County is authorized to undertake activities for the Project and to provide for the payment of the costs thereof, or any portion of such costs, by issuing a general obligation bond or general obligation bonds of the County in an amount not to exceed the principal amount of \$6,000,000, in one or more series, for the Project (the "Qualified Obligation"), for sale to the Mississippi Development Bank (the "Bank"), or entering into a loan agreement and obtaining a loan from the Bank for the Project in an amount not to exceed the principal amount of \$6,000,000, in one or more series (the "Loan").

5. The County reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures for the Project for which the County will advance internal funds prior to the issuance of the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan, and that it should declare its official intent to reimburse itself for all or a portion of such expenditures of the Project made in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. This resolution is adopted pursuant to the County Improvements Act, the Bank Act, and other applicable laws of the State (together, the "Act").

SECTION 2. The Governing Body, acting for and on behalf of the County, does hereby declare its intention to issue and sell the Bonds or the Qualified Obligation or enter into the Loan, pursuant to the Act.

SECTION 3. The Bonds or the Qualified Obligation, if issued, will be general obligations payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a tax to be levied annually, if necessary, upon all the taxable property within the geographical limits of the County, which tax, together with any other moneys available for such purpose, shall be sufficient to provide for the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Bonds according to the terms thereof. The Loan, if issued, will be payable from the legally available revenues of the County. Other funds available to the County which may be lawfully used for payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, Qualified Obligation, or the Loan, if issued, include, but are not limited to, use taxes remitted from the State to the County as a result of the Infrastructure Modernization Act of 2018, House Bill 1, 2018 First Extraordinary Session.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations (the "Reimbursement Regulations"), the Governing Body hereby declares its official intent to reimburse expenditures made for the Project prior to the issuance of the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan with the proceeds of the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan, to the extent permitted by the Reimbursement Regulations.

SECTION 5. The Governing Body proposes to direct the issuance of the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan in the amount, for the purpose, and secured as aforesaid, at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place and time in the Courthouse of the County located at 1008 Battleground Drive in the City of Iuka, Mississippi, at 8:30 a.m. on December 6, 2021, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If 20%, or 1,500, whichever is less, of the qualified electors of the County shall file with the Chancery Clerk of the County a written protest against the issuance of the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan shall not be issued unless authorized at an election to be called and held as provided by law on the question of the issuance of the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan. If no sufficient protest is filed, then the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof at any time within a period of 2 years after the date above specified.

SECTION 6. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least 3 consecutive weeks in the *Tishomingo County News*, located in the City of Iuka, Mississippi, a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in the County and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than 21 days prior to the date fixed herein for the issuance of the Bonds, the Qualified Obligation, or the Loan, and the last publication shall be made not more than 7 days prior to such date.



Region 1-4A Football Awards Announced



TCHS Basketball the week Nov. 9th - Nov. 12th


