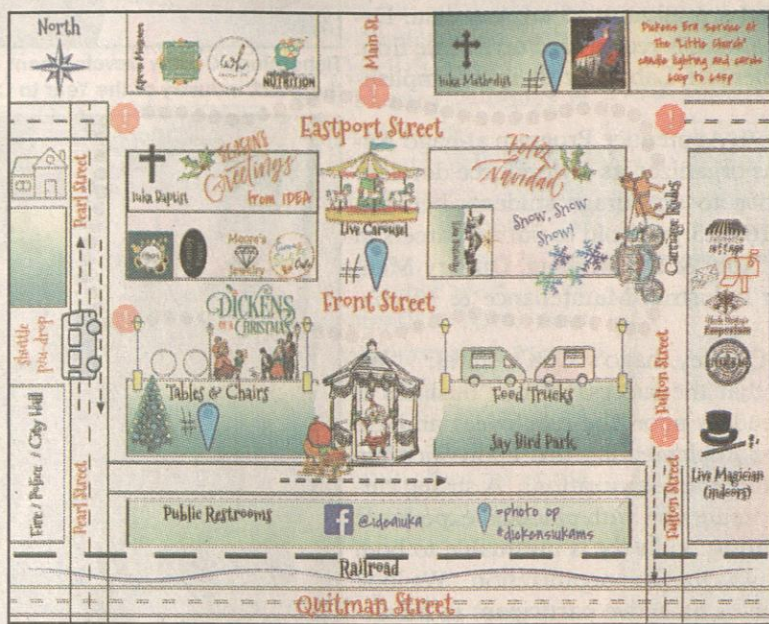

Travel back in time to the life of Charles Dickens and enjoy a fun filled night among the streets and falling snow in his hometown of Iuka, Friday, December 17th from 6 to 8 p.m. Dress in Dickens period clothing or Christmas character costumes, or simply enjoy seeing others in Dickens' attire as you stroll about and enjoy the many activities Dickens's Christmas Celebration has to offer. Downtown merchants will be open during the event and will have special offerings during the celebration (map).

Begin the evening with an opportunity to attend a Dickens service at The Church of Our Lord ("The Little Church") on Eastport Street beginning at 6:00 p.m. and join in singing songs of the season, participate in a liturgy from the Dickens period, take part in a candle light service with a carol of Silent Night. The service will conclude at approximately 6:45 p.m. Activities on Front, Eastport and Fulton Streets begin at 7:00 p.m., including carriage rides, a live nativity, a carousel, magician, crafts, carolers, food and vendors, as well as a visit with Olde St. Nicholas himself! Drop your letters to Santa and place them in the Santa Mailbox located at The Curated Cottage. Take a moment to write your name on the spot and drop it in the Santa Mailbox. "With the destruction of the tornadoes left behind in our city to homes, structures, and trees, it has created a much



needed opportunity for organizations, community leaders, and volunteers to work together to evaluate the future health of the trees in our city and develop a plan to manage and preserve them for future generations." Overall it was a very positive and informative experience which will greatly benefit our area as a whole. The current issues of the damage done to trees in Iuka by the 2021 tornado

were discussed along with planning for future projects. Some organizations and programs were brought to the attention of those in attendance such as Tree City and the Arbor Day Foundation, both of which would involve individuals of all ages in the community who might be interested in creating and supporting environments for trees in Tishomingo County.

Work began last week to repair the rock wall facing Ash Street, which surrounds Oak Grove cemetery in Iuka.

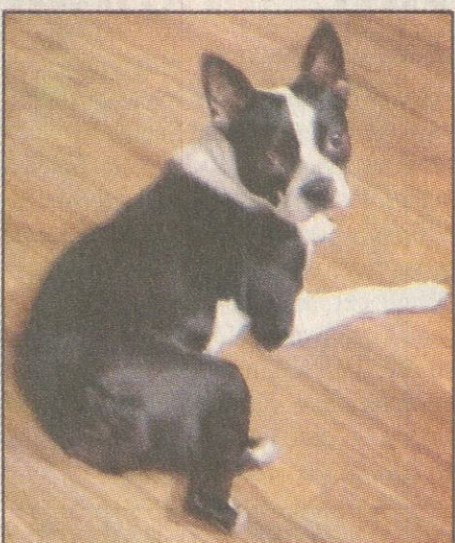

Many pups in the world are born with defects or other issues but can live full happy lives with the right care. Although Gracie's special nubs cannot be fixed,



having her eyes repaired made her much more comfortable. Cherry eye is a prolapsed gland of the nictitans. It occurs after a tear gland in a dog's third eyelid becomes inflamed. It appears as a small red mass protruding from the corner of the eye. While it is usually not extremely painful, sometimes a dog will rub at it as if it were itchy. Leaving it untreated can cause decreased tear production which can lead to eye infections, pain and possible blindness. If you notice this or any issue in your pet call Dr. Jim Perkins at 423-3470. He will examine your pet and get them on the road to a healthy life.

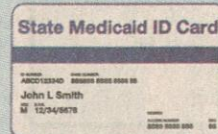

What will Happen On Earth When Israel Is Restored?

One might say that Israel has been restored since 1948, and there is a truth in that, yet there is a time of peace that will come to Israel that has not yet come. Even though there is now a nation called Israel, and even though it does have its own government, yet no one would be likely to say that Israel has peace without any disturbance at this time. It may not have occurred to some people that God still has a special work to do in the nation of Israel, for she is yet to recognize Jesus as her Messiah! I never seek to write articles to offend others, but I do seek to bring others to the place to examine what the Bible says on a given subject. For example, we had several centuries of Bible "scholars" who sought to make much of the Bible an allegory, but most of the Bible is to be taken literally. When there is a story that is being told to illustrate something else,

there will be a "key hanging by the door" of that parable or story. For example, when the Bible is using figurative speech, it may say something like: "The kingdom of heaven is likened unto", meaning that there is something in the story that has a likeness to the kingdom of heaven. If no such "key" is there, then it is wise to take each statement at its literal meaning.

Isaiah 54:1-3 says of Israel (see the context for this): "Sing, O barren, thou that didst not bear; break forth into singing, and cry aloud, thou that didst not travail with child: for more are the children of the desolate than the children of the married wife, saith the

LORD. Enlarge the place of thy tent, and let them stretch forth the curtains of thine habitations: spare not, lengthen thy cords, and strengthen thy stakes; For thou shalt break forth on the right hand and on the left; and thy seed shall inherit the Gentiles, and make the desolate cities to be inhabited." Perhaps some will say, "Why write about the nation of Israel? I am writing about the nation of Israel, because it figures so largely into the events of the times that are yet to come on earth. One big mistake many good men have made is to equate the church with Israel and call it "the new Israel", for there is absolutely no Bible foundation for this. Romans chap-

ter 11 shows Israel being "grafted in" again to the olive tree in the latter days. Our verses above show a barren nation (Israel) that is to sing for joy because of her many "children". We do have some figurative language here, for the word "tent" is used to describe the habitations of Israel at a still future date. It is picturing her growth to that of a tent that is enlarged. Her stakes are to be strengthened, like those of a tent, so that the nation of Israel will be strong, but this will not happen until after the church age is finished and Jesus has returned to finish His work in Israel. Should this seem "foreign" to some people's Bible studies, I would simply plead for a closer study of what God has in mind for earth and His earthly people, Israel, who will have her eyes opened concerning Jesus at a future date. 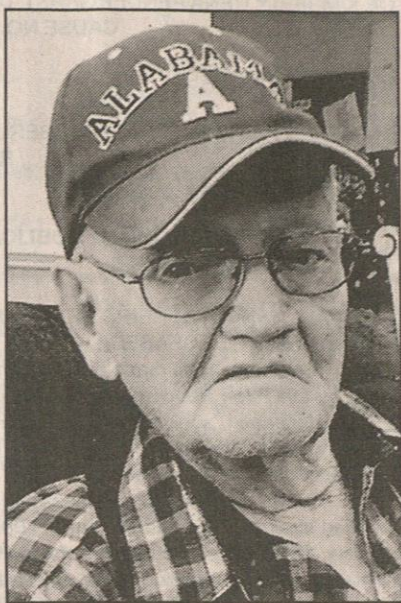

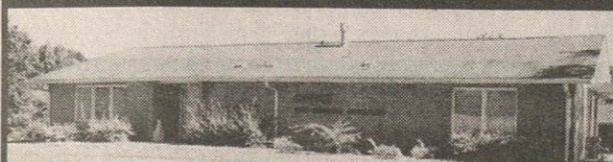

We had difficulties when we were growing up in Martin county, Kentucky but overall, we thought we were doing okay. President Lyndon Johnson came to Inez, Kentucky in 1964 to let us know we weren't doing very well. He began his campaign in our community and we became the poster child for American poverty. We hadn't really thought of ourselves as poor until we started hearing about ourselves in the news.

I had numerous friends who didn't get much for Christmas. Often it was one or two small gifts or nothing at all.

Several classmates at my elementary school in Tomahawk, Kentucky were fortunate if they had a coat to wear in the winter. Ragged looking shoes on a kid's feet during the winter was a common sight.

Several classmates came to school to wash their faces and hands in the boys' bathroom. The school lunch was the only decent meal some of the kids ate during the week.

It was a while before President Johnson's 1964 promises started helping our area. Even with the roll out of government assistance many families subsisted until the coal boom of the seventies which has almost died. Today our county is reinventing itself with agriculture, a service center to aid bitcoin mining, tourism and small businesses.

I don't remember every Christmas, but I remember one. My dad broke his back falling off a barn when I was a child. He was out of work for several months and in those days, we didn't have government safety nets to see us through tough financial times. Christmas came as usual and we did put up a tree. Our family gathered on Christmas Eve and we had food, fellowship and laughter. We always raised a garden and my parents stored food so it came in handy during tough times.

I expected nothing for Christmas that year because the heaviness of

family financial was obvious to every child. Surprisingly, my mother handed me a wrapped box that was mine and mine. It was Christmas. I was because I expected that year. Opened the box, I found a pair of shoes. I had numbers that were in the dark. It cost \$5 but it was to me. I was the one who wore it every year. I look at the glow of the shoes.

Dad was real. That Christmas, a temporary disability financial stress was gloomy for us. Yet, here I am remembering that Christmas as one of the best of my life during that Christmas. I remember the love of family. Mom was alive. We had to eat. We had our heads and our heads and our heads and our heads.

This may be the best Christmas I've ever had, just maybe you have Christmas.

The empty painful. Depressed. Financial personal difficulties have disabled many lives have died. Covid-19. Thousands suffering from tornadoes and hurricanes have us in the East. In the midst of inflation eats away at our paychecks. Checked malignant.

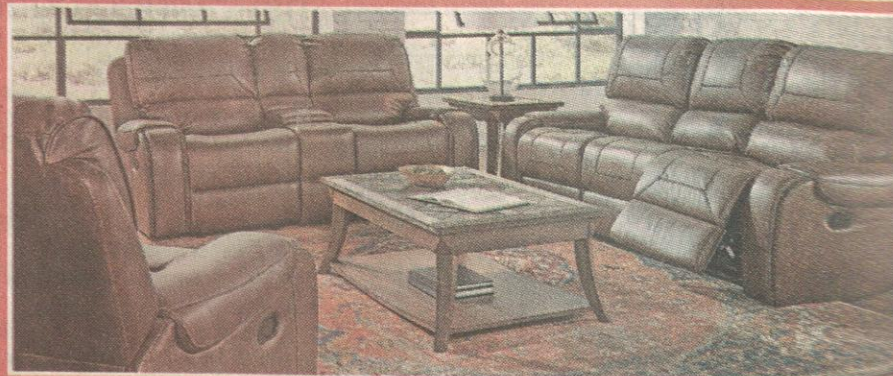
