



field goal to seal the vic-


In college he plans to major in physical therapy; he stated he is also looking forward to the collegiate coaching and seeing what he can become in the following years.

to the next free basketball game. I also stressed "if you misbehave the next time we go to the game, I'm going to paddle you. Do you understand?" About half of the class raised their hands that they understood and the rest just sat and acted nonchalant!

When we went to the game the next time, I carried a pencil and notepad, I didn't get to enjoy the game. I was too busy taking names. The girls were just as rowdy as the boys. Probably more so because I had Danny Mc-Clung, Edith Nichols, Billy Young and a few more that loved basketball and could sit and watch, but about half had a "recess" and I had names.

When we got back to the room I unlocked my door, stepped inside and got my paddle.

As they came to enter I checked to be sure if I had their name. If I did, I gave him or her three licks on their bottoms. For those who had never had a paddling, you'd think I was killing them. A couple of the girls couldn't wait to get home to tell their moms on me. That was fine with me. Their moms thanked me and then they were mad at their moms!

A little paddling works on lower grade children for the rest of the time I taught at Paden. Good kids, well behaved, support of moms and dads and a joy to teach. They believed I would do what I said. The word got The same thing hap-

pened to me at T.H.S. Every day I carried my 9th grade English class of boys to lunch. I noticed they were racing from the cafeteria back to the high school building. I saw how dangerous this was because there were lower grade children outside at

On this particular day when we got back to the room, I explained the danger of running over a child and we were never to go racing again. If they did I was going to paddle them. Remember, this group of

boys were football athletes - big and stout. Great stu-

For two or three weeks they walked. Then "out of the clear blue sky" one day they ran faster than ever. When we got to the

room I asked a question, "Boys, what did I say I was going to do the next time you ran from the cafeteria to class?" A kindly weak answer

from one said, "You said you were going to paddle Thank you. That's ex-

actly what I said. "Step out in to the hall and line up down the wall." Some got right up and started kindly, gingerly, while some who had never been paddled at school lingered but followed suit.

I gave each boy three licks on their bottoms and they'd return to their seats.


About half-way down the row of 30+, my arm was getting tired and I just knocked on the door across from my room and asked the science teacher to please come and finish paddling these 9th graders for me. He just took the paddle and continued with the three licks he'd been hearing without asking me why? We had worked together and he knew they

needed it if I said so. His licks were hotter. The boys learned a lesson. Don't try to be first because Tom Mitchell, an ex-Marine and a wonderful teacher believed in discipline.

I didn't know until two years ago why these 9th graders decided to run again. Shannon Edmondson, principal of the school and Tishomingo Alumni President shared

their incident with the alumni present. "We got together and decided to see if Mrs. Dawson was as good as her word." I thanked Mr. Ed-

mondson for enlightening me as why I had to paddle this fine class of boys. They have made me proud to be a small part of their

rael is the same problem that America and most of the world has today; it is the problem of "empty ritual" that is being passed off as true worship! Of course this kind of message is hard to swallow, so was the "castor oil" that my mom gave me as a child, yet the results were good. God has to hit people between the eyes with His indictment against them, before they will

see that they have "missed the boat" concerning what really pleases God. No, I am not saying that we should call off our church services, but I am saying that we should examine them to see if God is really getting the glory from them, or if they are merely a stage act that glorifies the actors! When God gets "a belly full" of empty worship, He has a way of letting His people know that they have missed the mark. This is what happened in Israel. Notice our verses above start with a question: "What is the purpose of your sacrifices" God asked Israel.

Then He gave a statement saying that He was full of their empty animal sacrifices. Next He asks a question as to who has required their treading of His temple courts, as they come in a kind of mockery to "attend the worship service". But the last thing we see in our verses is quite interesting, for God says, in essence, "stop it, do not bring any more empty offerings". He told them that the very matter of assembling for a worship service was more than He could stand, in fact, He said it was sinful, as He used the word "iniquity" to de-

> House Bill 997 would ove the Department of nue from being a wholedistributor of alcoholic rages within the state allow for wholesale perto be issued to private panies. The Department Revenue currently operthe Alcoholic Beverage rol warehouse in Gluck-The bill passed by a tisan vote of 104-3 and been sent to the Senate onsideration.

another bill that would ge alcohol laws was se Bill 1135. The bill d create a delivery ser-Dermit to allow the holdcontract for the delivery coholic beverages from ensed retailer to a conr. HB 1135 passed the Se by a vote of 71-38.

One greatly debated bill Touse Bill 1315. The bill d repeal occupational li-

censes for art therapists, auctioneers, interior designers, funeral home directors and wigologists. Proponents of the bill noted that these professions pose no real threat to public safety and have no need for state regulation, while those opposed argued that this repeal would lead to a lack of oversight in these industries. HB 1315 passed by a vote of 74-36, and the bill is now being held on a motion

House Bill 1302 was another source of much debate among House members. The bill would authorize optometrists who have passed educational requirements and have professional experience to perform certain procedures to treat eye diseases. Proponents of the bill stated that the proposed procedures are already being taught in optometry schools and are allowed in neighboring states. Opponents of the bill debated that these procedures should be performed by licensed physicians who specialize in ophthalmology. The bill passed 90-25 and has been sent to the Senate.

House Bill 1303 would allow advance practice registered nurses, or nurse practitioners, who have met certain experience requirements to practice primary care without a collaborative agreement with a licensed physician. The bill passed the House by

House Bill 122 would authorize expungement for up to three felony convictions if 15 years have passed since a person's last felony conviction. Various felonies such as violent crimes, arson and trafficking would not be eligible for expungement. The bill passed by a vote of 78-42 and is now being held on a motion to reconsider.

A number of noncontroversial bills also passed through the House this week, including a bill naming the firing range at the MS Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy after Lieutenant Colonel Pat Cronin (HB 9); a bill authorizing the sale of pseudoephedrine and ephedrine without a prescription (HB 479); a bill authorizing the Department of Corrections to provide hospice care to terminally-ill patients (HB 1174); and a bill exempting law enforcement officers from concealed firearms permit fees and renewal fees (HB

Floor debate will continue on these general bills until the Feb. 11 deadline. After that, discussion will move to appropriation and revenue bills, as well as bills originating in the Senate.

Welcome Hard-Working Legal **Immigrants** Dr. Glenn Mollette

Americans can expect more immigrants to enter our country in the months and years ahead. Most Americans aren't opposed to more citizens. Many of us are not favorable to undocumented foreigners roaming about our coun-

I've been to Mexico and a few other countries. I've always had to show my passport and answer questions when entering another country or coming back to America. It only takes a few minutes. Many years ago, my sons and I stood in a line of about a hundred people coming back to San Diego from Tijuana, Mexico. We showed our Driver's license back then and came on back into the country. No one even asked for identification when we crossed into Mexico.

I'm happy to see documented immigrants come to America. They will come and they will work. In our area of the country we have a growing population of Hispanic farmers working our farmland. There are Hispanic restaurants popping up in every town. Asian restaurants, nail salons and more are on the increase. The best little food joint in our community is owned by a Hispanic immigrant and his family.

Immigrants who document and come the legal way to America are coming here for a better life. Most of them come to help their families, send money back home and to achieve the American dream. They don't come to be poor Americans. Many of these immigrants who are business owners often struggle and pay the price with many hours of hard work to stay open. For most of them, paying their workers \$15 an hour will mean less hired labor.

Steve Geis, from our town. had this to say recently about his documented grandfather coming to America. Over 100 years ago my grandfather immigrated to the U.S. from Germany. He came here via Ellis Island where it was documented where he came from as well as the destination he was going to. He said, "We know the name of the ship he was on, and names of all of its passengers. He and the many others did what was required of them to become legal citizens. Locally, we found copies of his naturalization process. He and most other immigrants did it correctly! He added, "I would say welcome to anybody who would follow the procedure and become a fellow citizen of our great coun-


