Icy Roads, Freezing Rain, and Extreme Cold Air Hits the South

Storm called "One for the Ages" by Meteorologists

A major winter storm hit a large part of the United States on Monday, with heavy snow and cold temperatures throughout the South. Tishomingo County residents woke up Monday morning to a landscape covered in ice. Rain, sleet and snow throughout the day created hazardous driving conditions. More snow is predicted for the end of the week adding to the already icy conditions.

It is somewhat rare for Tishomingo County to have such extreme winter weather as the front which moved through the area earlier this week. It began sleeting on Sunday afternoon and continued to do so through Monday evening. Temperatures fell to the 20's and ice accumulated on roadways which made driving extremely hazardous for those traveling in Northeast Mississippi.

In preparation for this winter weather event the Tishomingo County School District

made plans last week to have all students move to virtual learning during the time frame of the storm. The weather forecast accurately predicted icy conditions which swept across the state of Mississippi causing the roads and highways to become dangerously slick and impassable.

In the early morning hours of Tuesday, February 16th temperatures plummeted to single digits preventing the ice from melting which would have proven beneficial for motorist planning their commutes.

The weather affected more than just students as most businesses in the cities and towns of the county were closed on Monday and Tuesday in consideration for the safety of employees and patrons alike. Many industries in the area along with local government offices were closed as well for the same reasons. Local leaders urged citizens to stay off the roads as much as possible in order to prevent accidents and services such as trash pickup were delayed till later in the week.

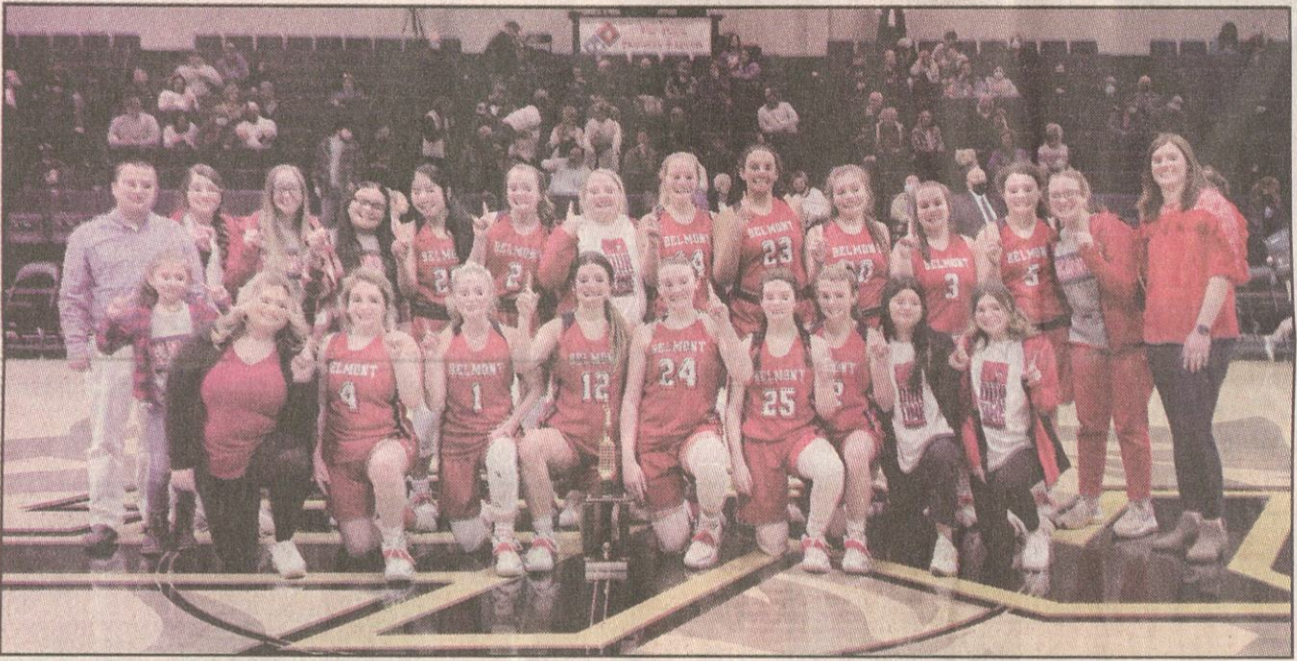
Lady Braves Win Division 1-4A Tournament at NEMCC

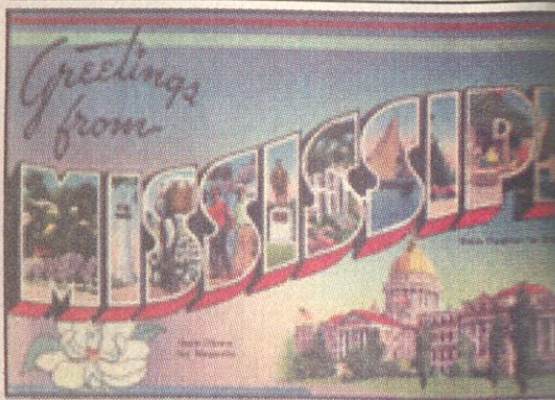
National Bird Feeding Month

 Established in 1994, National Bird Feeding Month brings attention to the plight of our wild birds. Since February is typically one of the harshest months of the year, there couldn't be a better time to help birds survive the elements.
 It is estimated that one in three American households feeds wild birds. These birds may be the only wildlife that many people see any more. This is a great way

to maintain a connection with nature and reap the benefits of stress-relief and enjoyment from something as simple as putting out food for birds.
 Feeding wild birds is easy. Birds aren't picky about what holds their favorite food, especially during the winter months. It can be as simple as scattering stale bread in the yard or placing birdseed on a tray or plastic plate. Of course, you could also place some type of feeder in your yard or trees.

If you place a feeder in your yard, keep it full so the birds will have a dependable supply of food during the cold weather. Also remember to keep it clean. Don't be discouraged if you put up a new feeder and the birds don't flock to it immediately. It can sometimes take a while to locate a fresh source since they find food by sight.
 Tree feeders can also be very helpful. A very simple feeder can be made by tying a string on a

pine cone, spreading the cone with peanut butter, then rolling it in birdseed and hanging it on a tree branch. Bird feeders do not have to be expensive, complicated, or even purchased at a store.
 You need to be sure to avoid placing your feeder in or too close to areas where dogs, cats, and squirrels frequent. They can possibly harm or chase away the object of your new hobby.

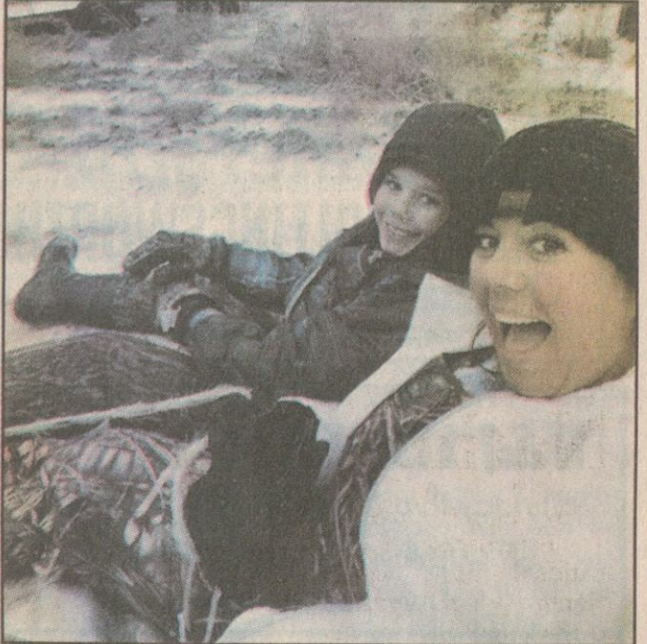

Lessons On Life From The Prophet Isaiah (part 10)

It might seem strange to some people that the prophet Isaiah, along with all of the other prophets, often spoke and wrote about negative things. We have come to an interesting period in the present world, for more and more we hear people saying, "Do not talk to me about anything negative".

This is equivalent to saying, "I do not want to hear even what the Bible says, if it is negative." It may be worth noting that much of the Bible speaks of negative things and coming judgment. Isaiah was no exception to this, for much of his book is a warning of coming judgment and concerns

negative things.

Isaiah 1:15-16 says, "And when ye spread forth your hands, I will hide Mine eyes from you: yea, when ye make many prayers, I will not hear: your hands are full of blood. Wash you, make you clean; put away the evil of your doings from before Mine eyes; cease to do evil." You may call this negative if you wish, for it is! The call of God upon His people, and

especially upon His ministers of the Word, is to give His message. It is not for us to seek to alter His message, rather to give it just as it is. Some people say that God will hear all prayers, but our verses above say that this is not true. Prayer is not a magic wand that one may wave and get what he wants. Prayer is speaking to God, but even then it must be acceptable to Him, and prayer is not ac-

ceptable to God when the one praying keeps living his life by his own rules! Some people think that there are certain postures or certain phrases that are bound to get the attention of God, but that is not true either. Notice that the spreading forth of hands in our verses simply causes God to hide His eyes, if the one praying is not willing to obey God's Word. The multiplication of prayers means nothing, when the one praying has hands that are full of blood. This means that these hands have shed the blood of the innocent, and you can apply that to any innocent human's blood, unborn baby

or old adult. We have no right to "redefine" what God calls sin! Now we see a remedy, and God has always offered a remedy for all of us concerning our sins. He commands, not suggests, that the sinner wash himself, or accept the only cleaning remedy available, the blood of Jesus! I love the fact that God loves humanity! He is not trying to make life hard for any of us, rather He is trying to tell us that the only real life is in Jesus, and the only way to have that life is an act of repentance and faith! Our verses above show that God demands that people put away the evil of

their ways and ce do evil. The evil of mankind are the eyes of God, He sees and what every person doing, thus He ca repentance and as the means by those sins can be away. Man-made edies will not whether it be attendance, social vices or whatever of these can be but none of these ever take the place repentance and for the forgiveness sins!

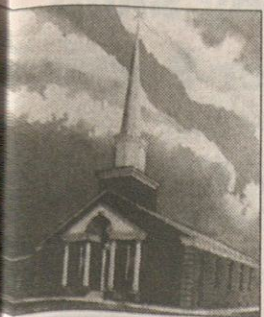

the 101st birthday of my aunt Eunice Page Quinn (Edward). She was Will and Mae's baby and my dad's sister.

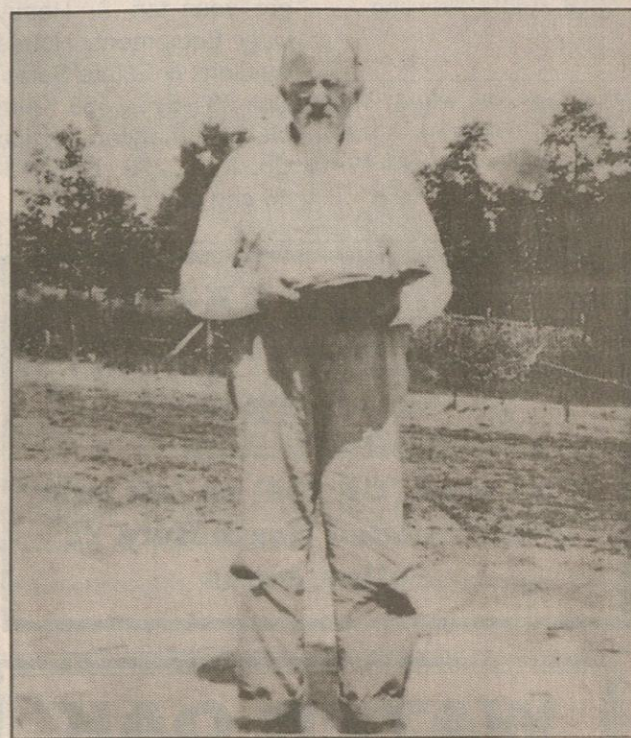

We got out of our car and asked one of the young "guys" working the ground where to go "Just go inside." When we walked in there, there were only two ahead of me at the registration desk. Angie said, "Ruth Dawson" she quickly found my registration form and handed it to Angie and a nurse was waiting at the door and said, "Follow me." We went straight to a room, answered a few questions and the nurse who gave the shot asked me two or three questions while she got the shot ready and I got my sleeve up high. She gave me the shot deep into the muscle. Hurt? I've had worse, and it never even became sore. I was so happy to the Moderna. It was not the one the F.D.A. had approved, but it had been tested and approved and ordered to start. I will get my second shot the 10th but we are all still advised to wear a mask, and stay at a distance after that. They are not 100%.

Please, when it becomes available take advantage of the opportunity to stop the spread of Covid 19, and maybe we'll see the eradication of this deadly virus. Measles, mumps, diphtheria, typhoid, small pox, polio, and many other contagious diseases, today are rarely heard of that were once affecting children and adults. Similar to what we are experiencing today. We didn't have communication 100 years ago like we have now. In 1918 an epidemic of flu killed so many here in our own county. 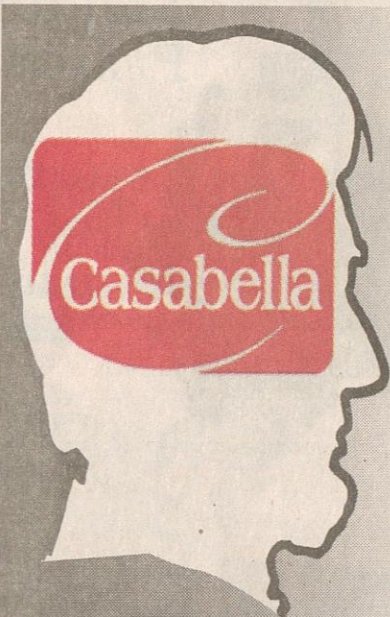
