Winter Storm Leaves Area Without Milk & Bread

A winter storm moved through Mississippi and other southern states last week and with it came many complications for residents and businesses alike. Ice and snow accumulated bringing hazardous conditions to our area.

The postal service for example was unable to carry out its normal duties and mail delivery halted for much of Mississippi. The Tishomingo County News was affected when papers were not delivered to subscribers on the last week despite our best efforts.

Snow continued to fall on Thursday, February 18th covering the already existing layer of ice which formed earlier in the week. This prolonged the clearing of highways, city streets and county roads leaving many unable to travel safely. It did, however, leave the perfect snow/mix to make beautiful snow pictures. We have featured many in this week's paper - enjoy!

The Tishomingo County School District continued virtual learning for all students Monday, February 22, the district implemented a delayed opening on Tuesday due to poor road conditions on county roads. Heavily shaded areas prevented the snow and ice from melting away.

Unlike the ice storm of 1994 it came and went in one day, leaving many without power, the storm lingered leaving snow accumulations similar to those

like we haven't seen since the 1960's.

The Tishomingo County Electric Power Association reported very few power outages during this winter weather event so fortunately most residences maintained power throughout the whole week without issue.

Businesses were affected during the storm as most were closed completely or had adjusted hours of operation to coincide with the weather. Local grocery stores were not able to receive truck deliveries on time which left shelves empty of items such as bread, milk and other essentials. Most items related to cold weather like heaters were also hard to come by and finding propane gas for sale in the

county was an impossibility.

One aspect of the storm which was consistent in the county and not to be overlooked was the willingness of neighbors to help each other through the difficult times. Some delivered groceries, others gave rides to and from work, and some individuals were out helping with vehicles that became stuck in ditches and in icy areas. Many spent their days checking on those unable to leave their homes due to the weather or illness. Some even spent their time clearing roads to make travel safer. Tishomingo County is truly a special place to live because it is full of good people who are willing to lend a helping hand.



Elderly Burnsville Man Dies in House Fire

A house fire claimed the life of a Burnsville man on Saturday, February 13th 2021.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilmon, Lonzo Wayne "Bud" Wilkins age 74, was pronounced dead at his residence after emergency responders arrived at the scene.

A resident staying at the home woke in the early hours of Saturday morning to find the house was burning; she and Wilkins were able to get out of the house at that time. Apparently Wilkins then reentered the home in an attempt to extinguish the blaze himself; he was unable to make it back outside to safety.

Emergency responders were contacted around one a.m. The fire was reported on County Road 300, west of Grissom Chapel Road, near the Alcorn County line.

Burnsville, North Crossroads, and Harmony Central

Fire Departments responded to the call.

Funeral services for Lonzo Wayne "Bud" Wilkins, 74, was held at 2 pm Saturday Feb. 20, 2021, with Bro. John Renfro and Bro. Melvin Laster officiating. Interment was in Shady Grove Baptist Cemetery.

He was born on August 2, 1946, in Tishomingo County, Mississippi to Troy and Wrethea Gray Wilkins. He was a construction worker and a member of Shady Grove Baptist Church.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his siblings: Lawrence Wilkins, L.C. Wilkins, Lester Wilkins, Lois Morton, Lola Puckett, and Lonie Parker.

Those to carry on his memory include his wife, Lavern Woods of Burnsville, his daughters: Andrea Norval husband Denny of Corinth and Susan

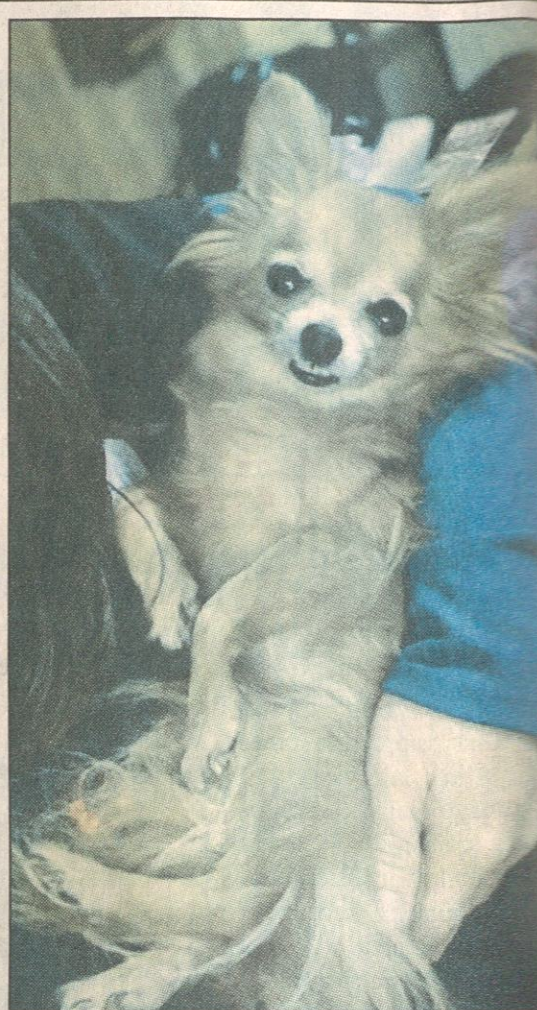
TCHS Cheerleaders Receive State Championship Rings

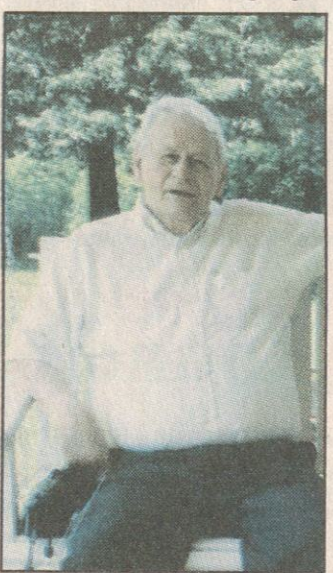

The Critics' Choice Winner is Alex Murillo of Pickwick, TN, who won with a beautiful sculpture of a family of polar bears.

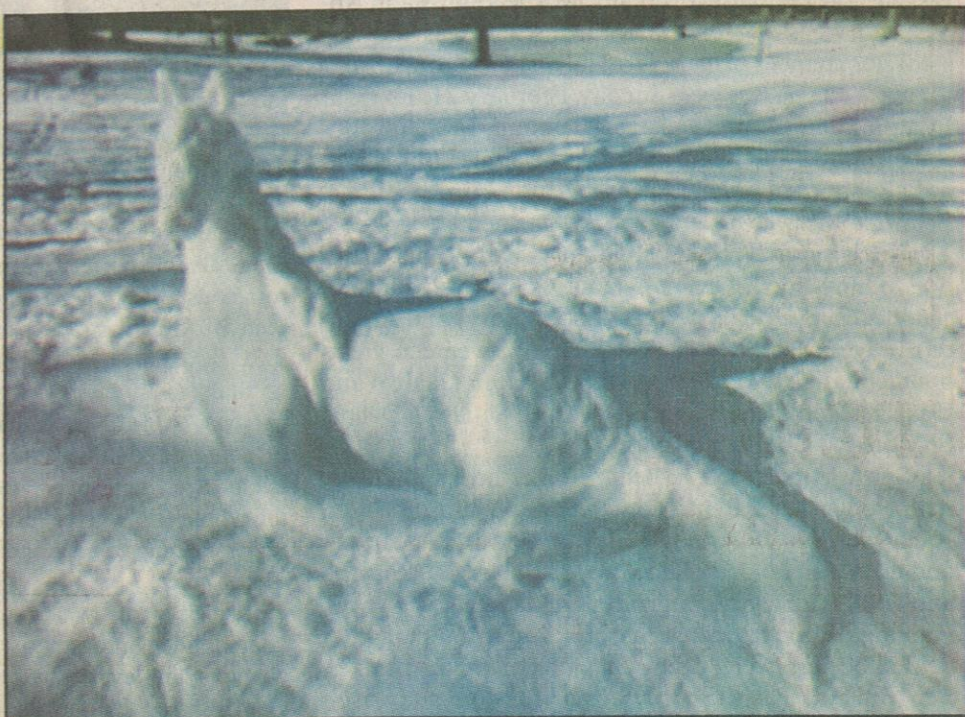
Council chair Brent Bonds explains that TAC was overwhelmed with the positive response of the contest:

"It was a lot of fun," Bonds says, "I look forward to seeing how people build on what they've done when we get another opportunity for this."



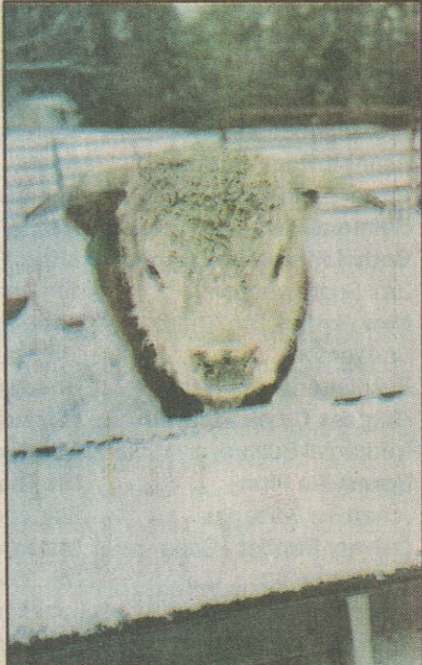

Lessons On Life From The Prophet Isaiah (part 11)

I have heard many people who profess to know Christ say, "I just do not read the Old Testament; it is too hard to understand." All 66 books of the Bible were inspired by the Lord, and II Timothy 3:16-17 says, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." My personal Bible study is that of going through the entire Bible over and over, for the whole Bible gives more understanding to each individual part.

Isaiah wrote what was later divided into sixty-six chapters, and every chapter was inspired by the Lord and can profit us. Isaiah 1:17-18 is very profitable: "Learn to do well; seek

judgment, relieve the oppressed, judge the fatherless, plead for the widow. Come now. And let us reason together, saith the LORD: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool." Can any person read these two verses and conclude that God does not care about sinning mankind? We all have sinned and come short of the glory of God, so I am not writing as one who has never sinned, but I have been forgiven! Our verses start with a command to do well, but one must learn what is "well" before he can do well. If the stream of information becomes polluted, we will be confused about what is right and wrong, thus we must go to the God's Word to find the pure stream of informa-

tion that will set us on the right track. We are commanded to seek judgment, or to seek right judgment. The very word "judgment" carries a bad connotation in the minds of many, but it should not, for if there were no right judgment, it would not be safe for us to go to bed tonight! Then God commands that we relieve the oppressed, administer right judgment to the fatherless and plead the cause of the widow. Are not these good admonitions?

Next we see the solution to our own sins. First there must be the matter of coming to God and accepting His reasonable offer of forgiveness based on the shed blood of Jesus. Then we see that our sins, though red as scarlet, can be washed as white as snow! Our crimson stains can become as clean as pure wool.

This sounds too simple to many people, because they have listened to the wrong teachers who have perhaps heard evolutionist, who say we all came from one at the bottom of the ocean along with a ship and other nonsense. If God and His plan of creation and see if they really the kind of life we should live. Look at pride, greed and selfishness of many unbelievers see that there must be a change to life than this. Many scoff at the Bible; they call God a myth; they teach self-help philosophy but none can ever find peace and hope for beyond this vale of tears. side of faith in Jesus.

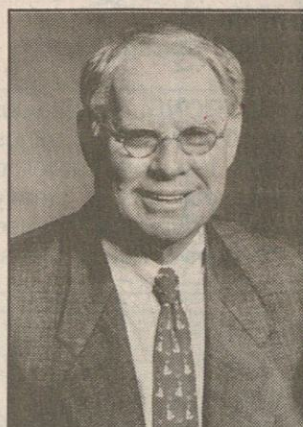

Spring Break is right around the corner-March 8-12. Don't forget to bring in your spare change for the Tegrita service project!



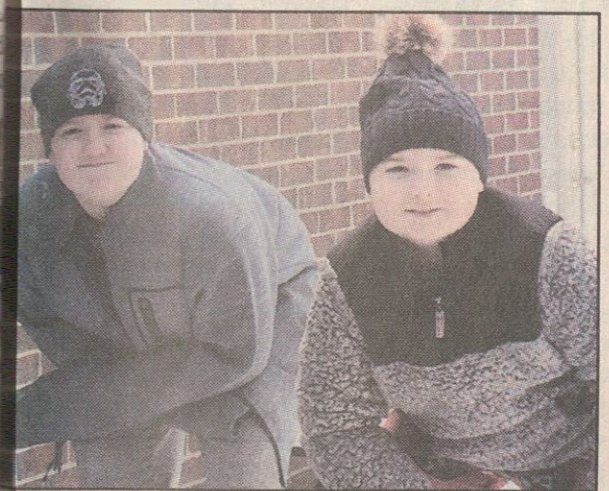

The 7th grade Cyber Foundation classes recently finished code.org unit 1. They learned that Problem Solving and Computing is a highly interactive and collaborative introduction

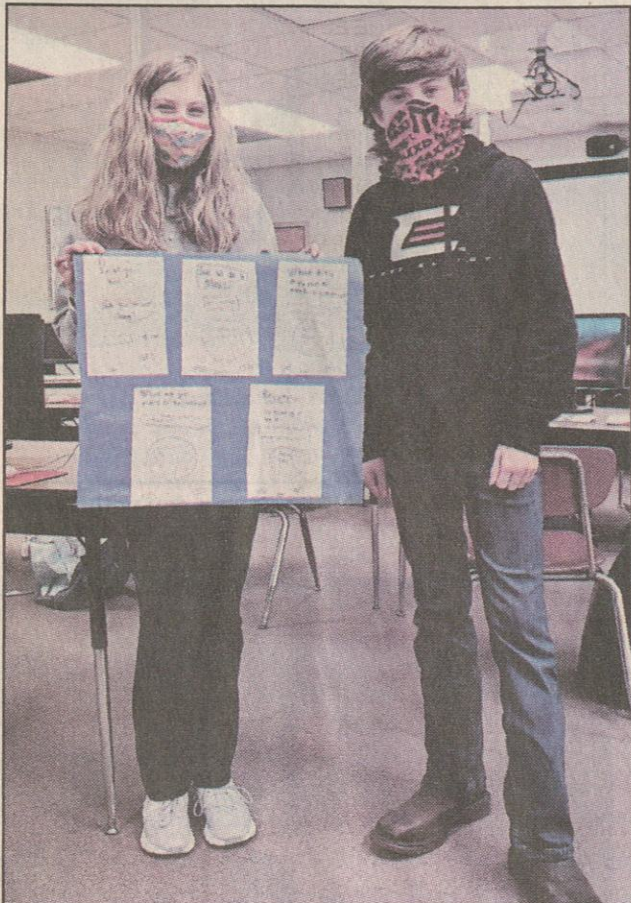
to the field of computer science, as framed within the broader pursuit of solving problems. The 7th grade practiced using a problem solving process to address a series of puzzles,

challenges, and real world scenarios. They learned how computers input, output, store, and process information to help humans solve problems. The unit concluded with a project

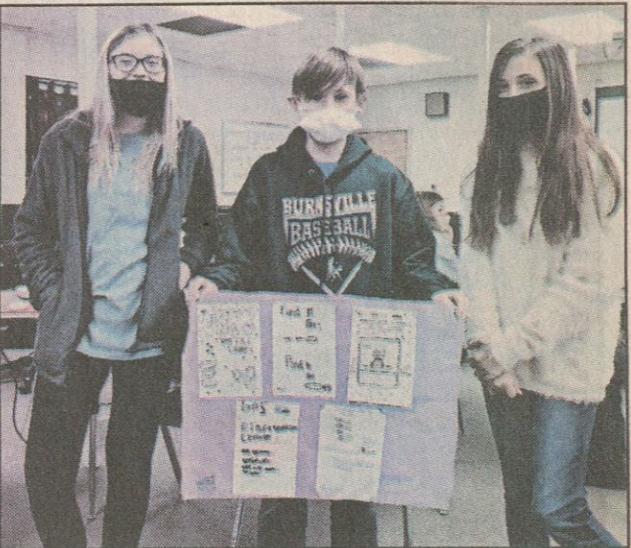
in which they designed an application that helps solve a problem of their choosing.

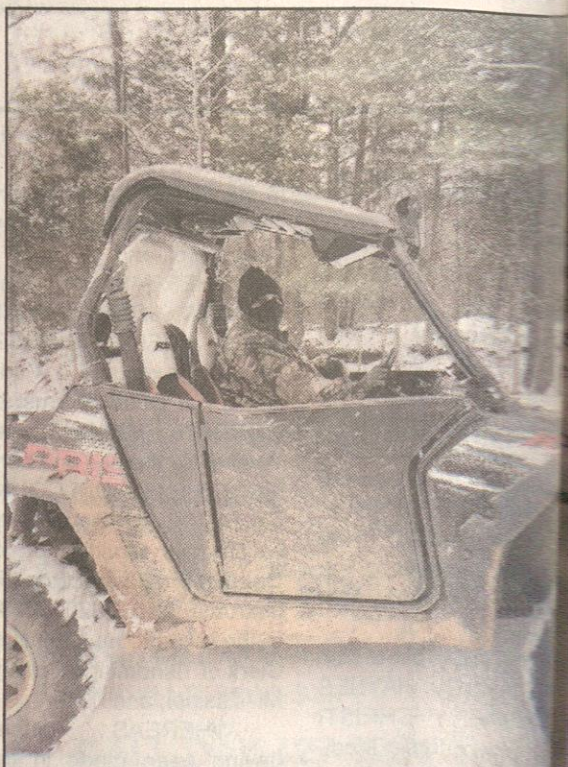
