Presley Approves \$10,980,762 in Broadband Funds for Tishomingo Connect

Tishomingo County, Mis-
sissippi (April 5, 2021) – Today,
Public Service Commissioner
Brandon Presley approved
Tishomingo Connect, the broad-
band subsidiary of Tishomingo
County Electric Power Asso-
ciation, to receive \$10,980,762
from the Rural Digital Oppor-
tunity Fund (RDOF) to pro-
vide broadband access to 4,916
homes and businesses in the
underserved territory of Tishomingo
County.

"Folks in the service terri-
tory of Tishomingo Connect de-
serve the same internet access as
people living in New York, Chi-
cago or Los Angeles. Mississippi
can never move into the modern
world of education, economic
development, health care or
quality of life if our people are
forced to sit at a fast food restau-
rant just to get on the internet. I
am bound and determined that
we fix this issue, and these funds
to Tishomingo Connect are a

big step forward." Commis-
sioner Presley said.

The funds approved are
from the FCC's Rural Digital
Opportunity Fund and are part
of \$9.2 billion announced in late
2020 for broadband expansion
nationwide. Mississippi was
awarded a total of \$495 million
in this round of funding, second
in the nation just behind Califor-
nia.

dent's scholastic achievement.

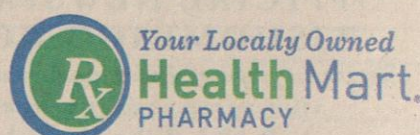
Brady chose Mrs. Sara

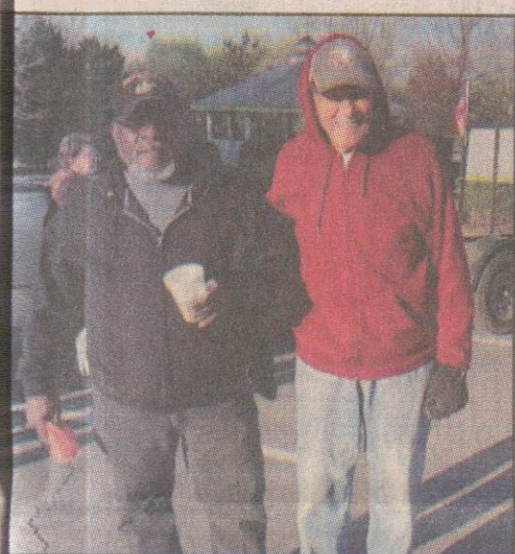

I have read that there have been only about two hundred years in recorded history that have not had a war going on somewhere on the earth. At Christmas we say and sing, "Peace on earth, good will toward men", but we are still awaiting that time of worldwide peace, and it can come only through the Prince of Peace, the Lord Jesus Christ! Isaiah 2:4 says it well: "And He shall judge among the nations, and shall rebuke many people: and they shall beat their swords into plow-

Would anyone dare tell me that this has happened at some point in past history? I am not a history buff, but I have read enough to know that we have never had a time like this. If we have never had this kind of "peace on earth", yet the Scriptures promise it, then it

has to be yet future, or else God's Word would not be reliable, and I am not about to doubt the reliability of God's Word!

Now lets see what we can find in the verse above. First, we see that He shall judge among the nations, and verse three ends with "the word of the LORD from Jerusalem", so we are looking at the Word of the LORD going forth from Jerusalem, but not to see whether

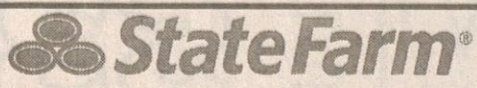

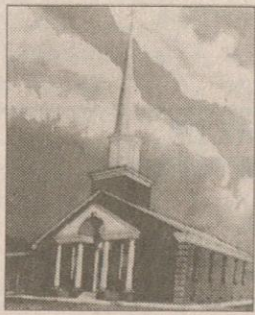

I Remember

What a difference a day makes. How about 100 years?

It was 100 years ago today, March 27, 2021, that George Robert Page and May Belle Luttrell were married on Pleasant Hill Road by Mr. W. T. Phillips while they were sitting in a buggy. There were a few extras who had gotten word of what was going to take place (who and where) and they just timed their trip to Iuka just in time to be their witnesses. Smile!

This couple had 48 years of marriage. Their children honored them on their 45th wedding anniversary. They were afraid Dad wasn't going to make it until their 50th, and he didn't. Their marriage was a great love story. During the Great Depression from 1922 until 1940, they raised seven children. I'm the 2nd one and the only one left.

Sunday, Easter Sunday, the love of my life died exactly 18 years ago. For ten years he had battled heart problems and diabetes. His passing was on April 4, 2003.. exactly 59 years and 4 months to the day from when we married, 8-4-43. He's been gone, looks like eighteen years – a long time.

As you who read my articles know, I was honored on my 96th birthday by over 200 of my family, students and friends. What an honor. Thank you. It surely made my birthday. I tell everyone it was my best birthday ever. Since October 10th, I have read each of these cards, notes, letters, messages, three times. (Angie copied each iPhone message, made a little book and I enjoy these, too.

Happy Easter to each of you. I want to write a little about how Easter was spent in the 1930's. Each of us got new slippers and socks and Mom made each of us a new outfit. She made my brother short pants and a shirt. It was hard to get him to wear these. He wanted to wear "overalls" and if Dad hadn't known how hard Mom had worked to make his outfit? It would have been overalls.

Off to Mt. Glory Church in the wagon. Mom and Dad always let us know how proud they were of us. Some of our friends always went home with us from church. After a delicious dinner we had an egg hunt, not one but they were hidden two or three times. Then we carried them to school on Monday and hid them again. A few ate them but not me.

In Acts 12: 4 KJV this special day was called Easter but correctly translated Passover in the A.S.V. the day on which the Church celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ. There is no celebration of the resurrection in the New Testament. The Jewish linked it with the Passover and observed it on the 14th day of Nisan March/April regardless of the day of the week. But Gentile believers believed it should be celebrated on Sunday, the Lord's Day.

In 323 A.D. this difference was settled by the Council of Nicaia. It was ruled that Easter should be celebrated on the first Sunday after the first moon following the Vernal Equinox. This is the system followed today, the day of Easter varying between March 22nd and April 25th. (The Bible and the Zondervan Pictorial Bible Dictionary)

I got up the other night, it was so light outside I had to make myself satisfied that there was not a car light shining in the yard. All I had to do was look up into the sky. My how bright that full moon was. Beautiful!

Up from the grave He arose! We have a risen Savior. He arose and He's in the world today. Thank Him. Praise Him and above all Serve Him.

PUBLIC NOTICE CROWS NECK ROAD

In October, 2018, bridge inspectors, contracted through the Mississippi Department of Transportation, deemed National Bridge Inventory System (NBIS) Structure SA71-049 and Structure SA71-051 located on County Road 961 (**Crows Neck Road**) to be unsafe for crossing and placed the two structures in a CLOSED status. Critical Finding Reports recommended full replacement of the structures. Timber piling supporting both structures was experiencing severe deterioration and rot.

Due to estimated high costs to replace the structures, in October, 2019, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors searched for alternative funding and submitted an application to the Eastern Federal Lands Access Program (EFLAP) to replace NBIS Structure SA71-049 and Structure SA71-051, both located just south of MS Hwy 30 on County Road 961 (**Crows Neck Road**) in District No. 4.

The Federal Lands Access Program was created by the "Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act" (MAP-21) and continued in the "Fixing America's Surface Transportation" (FAST) Act of 2015 to improve state and local transportation facilities that provide access to and through federal lands for visitors, recreationists, and resource users. The Tishomingo County project application was sponsored by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

(**Crows Neck Road**) Structure SA71-051, closest to MS Hwy 30, crosses over Panther Creek and is proposed to be replaced with a 55'long Double 16' by 8' Box Bridge Culvert and Structure SA71-049, located further down CR 961 (**Crows Neck Road**) and crosses over King Creek, is proposed to be replaced with a 31'-40'-31' Precast Concrete Bridge. Both existing structures were constructed in year 1955. The 2019 capital cost for the project was estimated to be \$1,254,900; the EFLAP funds are projected to cover \$991,371 and the Office of State Aid Road Construction funds are projected to cover remaining costs estimated at \$263,529.

The County was notified in mid year 2020 that the project had received funding through the EFL Program and funding was appropriated for FY21 - FY22 years. Due to recent changes in administration requirements of federal funds for these projects, the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) is administering the project. Tishomingo County just recently received a Project Activation Number from the MDOT for the project to move forward; however, the County must continue to follow guidelines of the MDOT's Local Project Applicant (LPA) program, a program normally used by municipalities rather than counties.

Tishomingo County and the County Engineer are currently following the MDOT process related to preliminary engineering, environmental clearances, and development of bid documents. The County is hopeful that the project will be ready to advertise for construction bids by year end 2021. Construction is anticipated to take approximately 7 months.

Conservation Corner The History of the Wild Hog in Mississippi

The wild hog is both loved and hated. For some of Mississippi's wildlife enthusiasts and landowners, it provides a challenging hunting experience and some of the best table fare this side of the Mississippi. For others, it causes thousands of dollars in damage to agricultural crops and out-competes many native species of wildlife for valuable food resources. In this article, we will explore the history of one of the most controversial animals found in the Magnolia State.

The first wild hogs in the state can be traced back to Hernando De Soto. In May 1539, De Soto landed at what is now present-day Tampa Bay, Florida, with his army of conquistadors. To help feed his army, De Soto brought along with him a herd of swine from Cuba. The exact number of the herd is questionable; however, several accounts put the herd anywhere from 11 animals to well over 300. However, all accounts point out that the breed was very hardy and multiplied very rapidly.

De Soto's expedition traveled through Mississippi from 1539 to 1541. Along the way, swine escaped, were traded and/or taken by the natives. It is from these animals that our first feral populations were established.

Hernando De Soto was not the only European explorer to bring swine to Mississippi. Pierre le Moyné, Sieur d'Iberville, a French explorer, brought swine along with other livestock to what is present-day Biloxi in 1699. Swine from d'Iberville's herds later spread throughout southern Mississippi and Louisiana.

Following the early European explorers, early settlers to the state brought along with them livestock, including swine. A common practice of the day was to allow the swine and other livestock roam free until the fall when it was necessary to capture them for slaughter. However, many of these animals escaped to the deep swamps and river bottoms where they roamed wild.

In the early 1970s, the Mississippi Game and Fish Commission released wild hogs into an enclosure on the Copiah County Game Management Area where they were allowed to breed and populate. In September of 1971, six of these wild hogs were captured and released into the Pearl River Game Management Area for hunting purposes. The population there has since grown to the extent that hogs have caused damage to the nearby Natchez Trace Parkway and nearby agricultural fields. The remaining wild hogs in the Copiah enclosure were captured and moved.

In 1973, an unknown number of wild hogs were released near Port Gibson. These animals have since spread throughout southwest Mississippi and southern Louisiana. Since the early 1970s, wild hogs have been released around the state specifically for hunting purposes. To help deter the spread of wild hogs, the state passed a law making it illegal to transport and release wild hogs into the wild. Spurred on by illegal releases and their prolific breeding, the wild hog is now found in at least 65 of Mississippi's 82 counties.

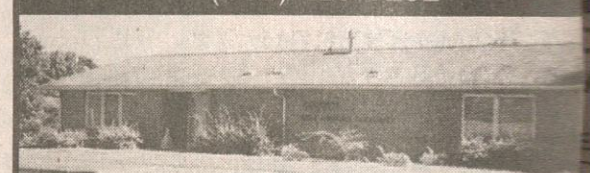

PUBLIC NOTICE CROWS NECK ROAD

In October, 2018, bridge inspectors, contracted through the Mississippi Department of Transportation, deemed National Bridge Inventory System (NBIS) Structure SA71-049 and Structure SA71-051 located on County Road 961 (**Crows Neck Road**) to be unsafe for crossing and placed the two structures in a CLOSED status. Critical Finding Reports recommended full replacement of the structures. Timber piling supporting both structures was experiencing severe deterioration and rot.

Due to estimated high costs to replace the structures, in October, 2019, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors searched for alternative funding and submitted an application to the Eastern Federal Lands Access Program (EFLAP) to replace NBIS Structure SA71-049 and Structure SA71-051, both located just south of MS Hwy 30 on County Road 961 (**Crows Neck Road**) in District No. 4.

The Federal Lands Access Program was created by the "Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act" (MAP-21) and continued in the "Fixing America's Surface Transportation" (FAST) Act of 2015 to improve state and local transportation facilities that provide access to and through federal lands for visitors, recreationists, and resource users. The Tishomingo County project application was sponsored by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

(**Crows Neck Road**) Structure SA71-051, closest to MS Hwy 30, crosses over Panther Creek and is proposed to be replaced with a 55'long Double 16' by 8' Box Bridge Culvert and Structure SA71-049, located further down CR 961 (**Crows Neck Road**) and crosses over King Creek, is proposed to be replaced with a 31'-40'-31' Precast Concrete Bridge. Both existing structures were constructed in year 1955. The 2019 capital cost for the project was estimated to be \$1,254,900; the EFLAP funds are projected to cover \$991,371 and the Office of State Aid Road Construction funds are projected to cover remaining costs estimated at \$263,529.

The County was notified in mid year 2020 that the project had received funding through the EFL Program and funding was appropriated for FY21 - FY22 years. Due to recent changes in administration requirements of federal funds for these projects, the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) is administering the project. Tishomingo County just recently received a Project Activation Number from the MDOT for the project to move forward; however, the County must continue to follow guidelines of the MDOT's Local Project Applicant (LPA) program, a program normally used by municipalities rather than counties.

Tishomingo County and the County Engineer are currently following the MDOT process related to preliminary engineering, environmental clearances, and development of bid documents. The County is hopeful that the project will be ready to advertise for construction bids by year end 2021. Construction is anticipated to take approximately 7 months.

Conservation Corner The History of the Wild Hog in Mississippi

The wild hog is both loved and hated. For some of Mississippi's wildlife enthusiasts and landowners, it provides a challenging hunting experience and some of the best table fare this side of the Mississippi. For others, it causes thousands of dollars in damage to agricultural crops and out-competes many native species of wildlife for valuable food resources. In this article, we will explore the history of one of the most controversial animals found in the Magnolia State.

The first wild hogs in the state can be traced back to Hernando De Soto. In May 1539, De Soto landed at what is now present-day Tampa Bay, Florida, with his army of conquistadors. To help feed his army, De Soto brought along with him a herd of swine from Cuba. The exact number of the herd is questionable; however, several accounts put the herd anywhere from 11 animals to well over 300. However, all accounts point out that the breed was very hardy and multiplied very rapidly.

De Soto's expedition traveled through Mississippi from 1539 to 1541. Along the way, swine escaped, were traded and/or taken by the natives. It is from these animals that our first feral populations were established.

Hernando De Soto was not the only European explorer to bring swine to Mississippi. Pierre le Moyne, Sieur d'Iberville, a French explorer, brought swine along with other livestock to what is present-day Biloxi in 1699. Swine from d'Iberville's herds later spread throughout southern Mississippi and Louisiana.

Following the early European explorers, early settlers to the state brought along with them livestock, including swine. A common practice of the day was to allow the swine and other livestock roam free until the fall when it was necessary to capture them for slaughter. However, many of these animals escaped to the deep swamps and river bottoms where they roamed wild.

In the early 1970s, the Mississippi Game and Fish Commission released wild hogs into an enclosure on the Copiah County Game Management Area where they were allowed to breed and populate. In September of 1971, six of these wild hogs were captured and released into the Pearl River Game Management Area for hunting purposes. The population there has since grown to the extent that hogs have caused damage to the nearby Natchez Trace Parkway and nearby agricultural fields. The remaining wild hogs in the Copiah enclosure were captured and moved.

In 1973, an unknown number of wild hogs were released near Port Gibson. These animals have since spread throughout southwest Mississippi and southern Louisiana. Since the early 1970s, wild hogs have been released around the state specifically for hunting purposes. To help deter the spread of wild hogs, the state passed a law making it illegal to transport and release wild hogs into the wild. Spurred on by illegal releases and their prolific breeding, the wild hog is now found in at least 65 of Mississippi's 82 counties.

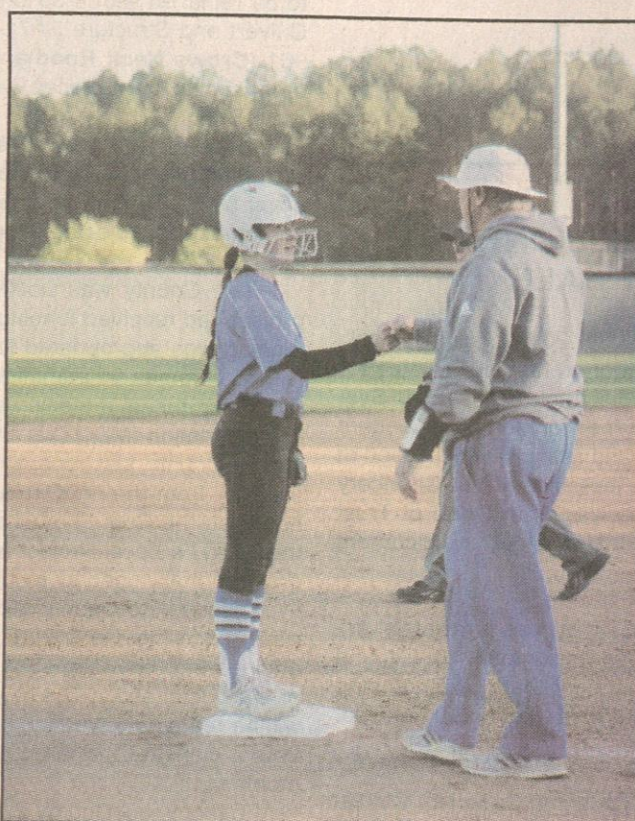

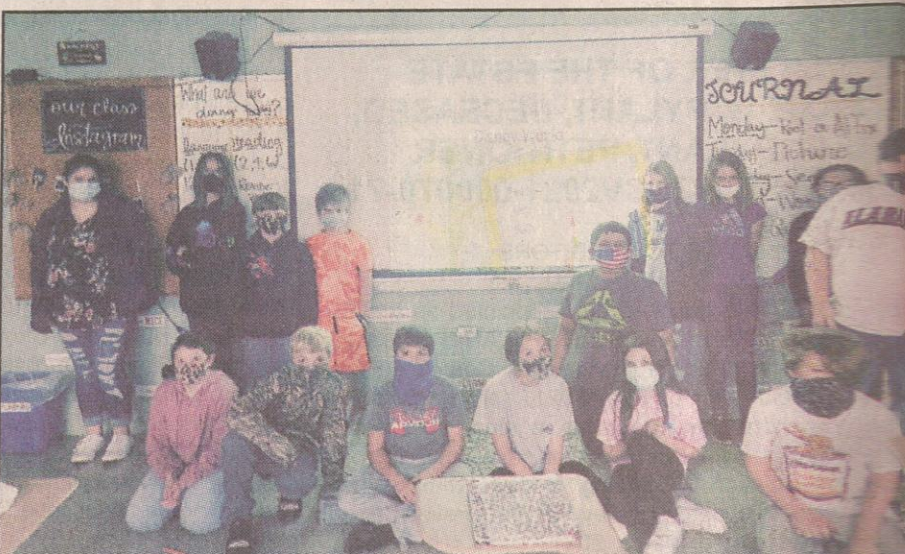
