Two Injured in **Electrical Accident**

Two employees of S & G Gutter Repair Company out of Corinth were seriously injured last Friday afternoon as they were working on the gutters of the Iuka Baptist Church. They were flown to Tupelo and later transferred to the burn center in Memphis where they are both still recovering.

Alabama Woman Arrested for Embezzlement

On February 23, 2021, a report was filed with the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Officer pertaining to an alleged embezzlement that had been discovered through a routine audit at Hellum's Trucking by the owners of the corporation. Investigators began working with the company and received documentation from the accounting firm that conducted the audit. Copies of the documented missing funds were also provided to investigators as well as a potential suspect. During the investigation, it was learned that approximately \$10,000.00 had been embezzled and multiple payroll checks were forged, as well as hidden under false entries in the company's payroll ledger. 



I have longed all of my life to see our earthly home and its people living in peace and joy, but I have not yet seen it. Oh, we all have seen periods of time when things were going pretty well on planet earth, but that still does not "fill the bill" of what Isaiah prophesied in chapter two of his book. But before we get further into the time of peace that this chapter promises, we must see the time of sorrow in Isaiah 2:6-8: "Therefore Thou hast forsaken Thy people the house of Jacob, because they be replenished from the east, and are soothsayers like the Philistines, and they please themselves in the children of strangers. Their land is full of silver and gold, neither is there any end of their treasures; their land is also full of



horses, neither is there any end of their chariots: Their land also is full of idols; they worship the work of their own hands, that which their own fingers have made." Does this also have a "familiar ring" concerning our own country?

First we see that Isaiah says that God had forsaken His people, the house of Jacob, meaning that He had forsaken Israel. May I ask a pointed question? If God had forsaken the nation that He called the "apple of His eye", would it be possible that He might forsake

"soothsaying", which is a consulting of "familiar spirits" or demons, as in fortune telling, which their neighbors the Assyrians and Philistines practiced. Second, they were finding pleasure in the "children of strangers", meaning that they were evidently involved in wrong marriages or ungodly sexual practices. Third, the land was full of wealth and weapons, neither of which is necessarily wrong, but Israel had made them wrong by their dependence on the wealth and military preparedness, rather than depending on God. Does this sound familiar in our day and concerning our own nation? Fourth, their land was full of idols, for Israel was worshiping the works of their own hands. This is done in

ways that are more hidden in our nation, but we have plenty of idolatry, for a failure to worship the true God winds up in worship of a false god, whatever "dress" that god may wear! It is hard to imagine that anyone would worship something that he has made himself, but it happens all of the time and around the world! In America it sometimes takes the form of the children produced from the very bodies of parents, for those children sometimes come to be idolized, so that they"rule the roost" in the home concerning almost everything, including worship, as to where and how! 

In October, 2018, bridge inspectors, contracted through the Mississippi Department of Transportation, deemed National Bridge Inventory System (NBIS) Structure SA71-049 and Structure SA71-051 located on County Road 961 (Crows Neck Road) to be unsafe for crossing and placed the two structures in a CLOSED status. Critical Finding Reports recommended full replacement of the structures. Timber piling supporting both structures was experiencing severe deterioration and rot.

Due to estimated high costs to replace the structures, in October, 2019, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors searched for alternative funding and submitted an application to the Eastern Federal Lands Access Program (EFLAP) to replace NBIS Structure SA71-049 and Structure SA71-051, both located just south of MS Hwy 30 on County Road 961 (Crows Neck Road) in District No. 4.

The Federal Lands Access Program was created by the "Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act" (MAP-21) and continued in the "Fixing America's Surface Transportation" (FAST) Act of 2015 to improve state and local transportation facilities that provide access to and through federal lands for visitors, recreationists, and resource users. The Tishomingo County project application was sponsored by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

(Crows Neck Road) Structure SA71-051, closest to MS Hwy 30, crosses over Panther Creek and is proposed to be replaced with a 55'long Double 16' by 8' Box Bridge Culvert and Structure SA71-049, located further down CR 961 (Crows Neck Road)and crosses over King Creek, is proposed to be replaced with a 31'-40'-31' Precast Concrete Bridge. Both existing structures were constructed in year 1955. The 2019 capital cost for the project was estimated to be \$1,254,900; the EFLAP funds are projected to cover \$991,371 and the Office of State Aid Road Construction funds are projected to cover remaining costs estimated at \$263,529.

The County was notified in mid year 2020 that the project had received funding through the EFL Program and funding was appropriated for FY21 - FY22 years. Due to recent changes in administration requirements of federal funds for these projects, the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) is administering the project. Tishomingo County just recently received a Project Activation Number from the MDOT for the project to move forward; however, the County must continue to follow guidelines of the MDOT's Local Project Applicant (LPA) program, a program normally used by municipalities rather than counties.

Tishomingo County and the County Engineer are currently following the MDOT process related to preliminary engineering, environmental clearances, and development of bid documents. The County is hopeful that the project will be ready to advertise for construction bids by year end 2021. Construction is anticipated to take approximately 7 months.



Tishomingo Arts Council is Celebrating National Poetry Month this April in a big wa

The local arts council has reached out to poets laureate from across the United States to each contribute to one grand celebratory project centered on Tishomingo County, and the response from poets has been huge!

"This is an important time for us," explains TAC Chair Brent Bonds, "it was about this time last year that we responded to CO-VID by moving all of our projects to a digital platform. Our celebration of National Poetry Month in April was our first digital campaign, so this is kinda like a birthday for us -- we wanted to do something big.'

TAC began reaching out to poets laureate in early November of last year.

"We hadn't seen at that time a project that pulled all the poets laureate -- the poets appointed by each state to serve as ambassadors of the arts -together. Around November, there was a lot of worrying and a lot of division. We wanted to build something that underscored unity and still celebrated the differences from place to place inside the country. We were working on a project with our own Mississippi Poet Laureate, Beth Ann Fennelly, about that time, so we decided to expand on that--we had no idea what the response would be."

The response was swift and positive. After only a few days, more than half the nation's state poets laureate had expressed commitment to the project. By January, over fifty poets laureate at the level of state, regional, and Native American nation had signed on to submit readings of their poetry addressed specifically to North Mississippi.

Nebraska's Matt Mason was one of the first:

"Being asked by an agency in another state to son Staiger, "I love seeing fellow Poets Laureate read their work on Facebook and witness the diversity, energy, and love for the power of poetry to bring people together.'

Heather Lang-Cassera, Poet Laureate of Clark County, NV has also enjoyed watching the readings: "Witnessing

month-long video exhibit unfold has been a highlight of National Poetry Month ... and because so many wonderful projects take place during the month of April, I mean this as especially high praise! Thank you to the Tishomingo Arts Council for gathering a diversity of poets. It is a delight to watch the Laureates I know as well as to become introduced to those whom I have not yet heard or read. I haven't been to Mississippiyet-but now I'd really

love to visit!" "It's a beautiful thing, I think," Bonds says, "to see all these poets -- these are people with a lot of weight in their field -- and they're calling out our little corner by name. And, it's been nice to see the project shared back into these states. We've seen a lot of our audience participation from out of state. We have people from across the country learning to pronounce Tishomingo and then wanting to come see the place they now can say. We've seen participation from Maine to California...and we're hoping to get Alaska involved if they select their
