Graduation for TCHS & Belmont this Weekend

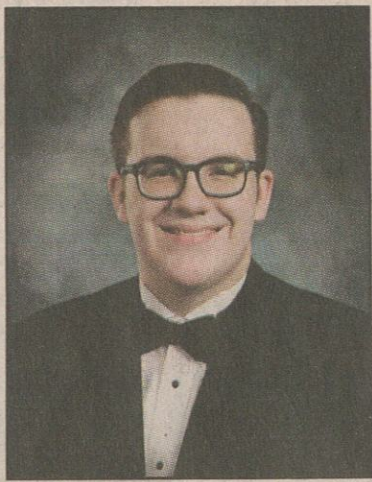

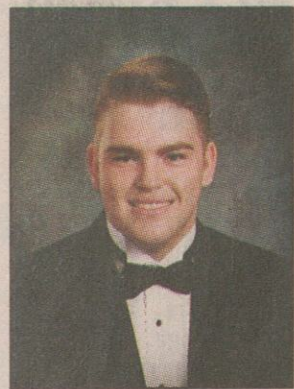

Interest Free Money Available by NMPDD

Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development District has a revolving loan fund to help local small businesses recover from the pandemic.

Business owners may apply for a loan with up to two years interest free. Loans below \$10,000 may be eligible with a personal guarantee. Loans from \$10,000 to \$35,000 may

require collateral. Loans above \$35,000 will require real estate collateral. The revolving loan fund will waive the 5% owner equity requirement.

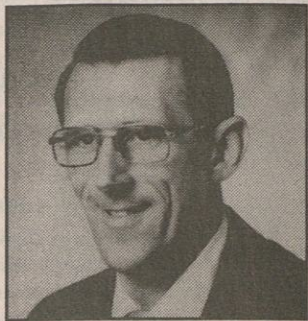

Luke Jay McKinney, 55, known to us as Daddy, Pop, Uncle Jay or Chief Boneagle, slipped into Jesus' arms Friday morning, May 14, 2021, at his home in West Point. He was born on August 12, 1935. His parents were Luke and Evie Kingsley McKinney.

L. J. graduated from Mooreville High School in 1953 and joined the United States Army traveling to Germany under the Marshall Plan. He spent three years touring and having a grand ole time while also serving as Military Police Officer and personal guard to General Eisenhower. When he returned to the United States, he accepted a basketball scholarship at Belmont University in Nashville where he played then transferred to Mississippi State and obtained his degree in education. I Remember

I remember seventy-nine years ago today (May 2) at Rutledge Salem all day singing with "dinner on the ground." It was also a time of decoration for those who had lost loved ones and friends. This is not why I remember it so vividly. It was my first date with a good-looking young man destined to be my lifetime mate.

I was seventeen. World War II was raging. My sister was in Florida to be near her husband who was training to go over-seas shortly. We went to Salem in a wagon but Mom let me ride home with Chester in a truck.

We stopped and visited Lyman and Ava Hill on the way home. This gave Mom and Dad plenty of time to get home in the wagon. I went to my "Scraps" and pulled out a calendar for 1942. From May 2nd until December 31st, we had had eighty-eight dates. Pretty regular. We attended church, school activities and maybe a couple of movies. I was a junior.

I had to be home by a certain time. One night we went to the Majestic Theater in Iuka (where BancorSouth drive-through is) and it was already full. We couldn't wait for the 2nd show and took seats in the balcony. When I sat down, Chester asked to change seats with him where I could see. It was dark but when I sat down, the seat was broken and my head hit the floor behind me between a man's feet. I said an "ugly saying," giggling erupted and there was a lot of scrambling trying to get me up.



Needless to say that was all I remembered about that movie trip, but that was enough.

With the pandemic none of those out-of-town, who usually come, and we congregated at my house showed up. I ate by myself, enjoyed the Daily Journal and slept all evening.

The phone woke me up. It was Angie checking on me. She had posted pictures of Abbey Grace Langley, my great-granddaughter, age eight, performing at her recital concert. We won't know what's going on so, "I'm not leaving a lot of orders." Let them have some closure by having to take care of business. Having to stay home for the past year has ruined my voice. I just look forward to when we can have our choir and Sunday School classes back normal. I want to thank my daughter-in-law for teaching her S.S. class every Sunday on zoom. It has been good but there is just something better about meeting together.

Today when I got home from preaching I felt ashamed of myself. I wanted to hug every person who had greeted me and didn't miss many. And to cap that off? How could I keep my distance?

I didn't even wear my mask. So help me. I'll try to keep my outstretched arms to myself and suffer. I love all of you so much. God is so good to me!

I didn't, as you observed go to Rutledge Salem today, but Angie and I went yesterday and decorated. Larry and Edith Cox keep the cemetery so clean and pretty. While there I broke all the Covid 19 restrictions. That's the reason we don't need to congregate. I pray I'll do better and remember to keep the rules. Covid 19 is still out there taking a toll for people who refuse to take the shots or follow the safety rules set for us. Be an example for others and I'll try.

Because they were originally written on a sheep's skin. Early paper was pretty fragile and difficult to make, but parchment was both plentiful and durable. Parchment, of course, is made from the skin of a sheep, goat, or calf, and its durability made it ideal for a keepsake like a diploma.

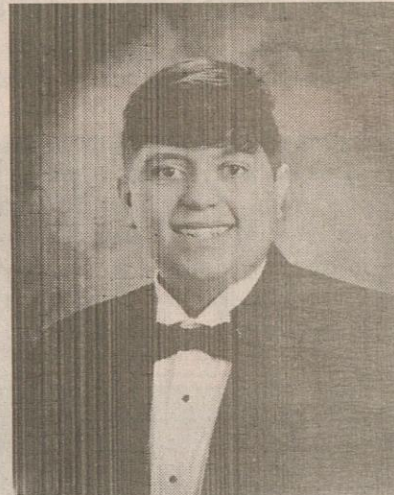
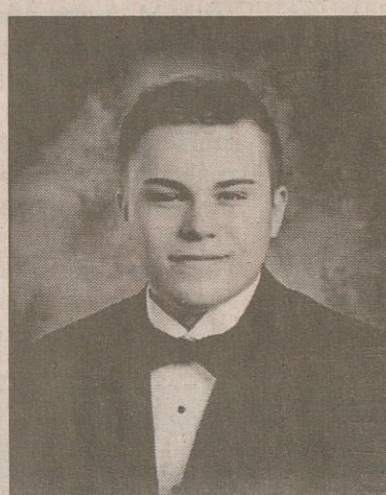
Roberts is among approximately 30,000 students, faculty, professional

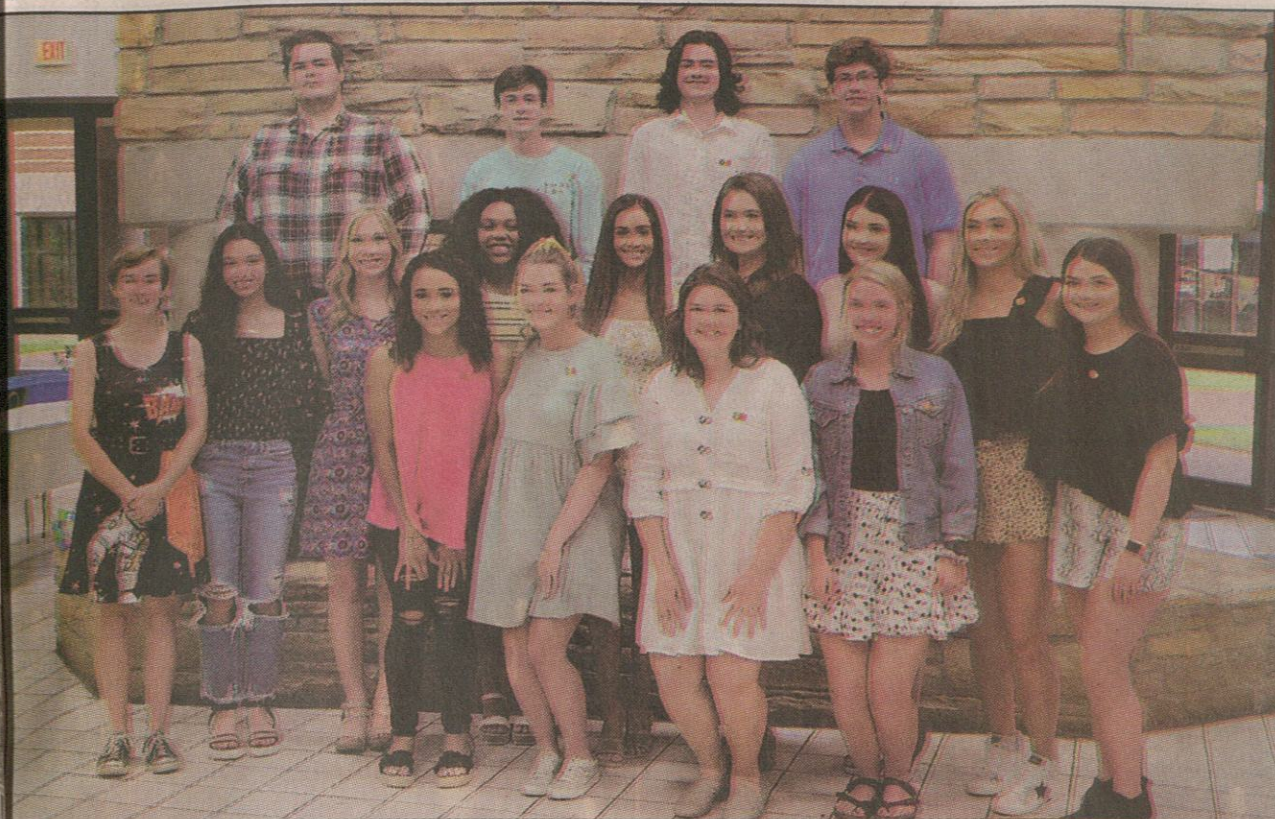

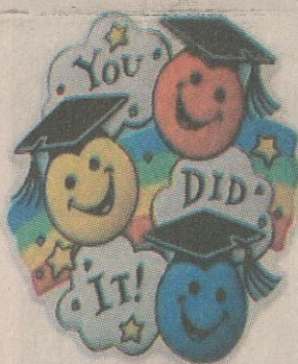

Pomp and Circumstance

Also known as "Land of Hope and Glory" was written in Sir Edward Elgar in 1901. The title of "Pomp and Circumstance" comes from a line in Shakespeare's Othello, "Pride, pomp and circumstance of glorious war!" In 1902, lyrics were written by poet and essayist Arthur Christopher Benson to celebrate the crowning of King Edward the VII.

It first became associated with graduation ceremonies in 1905 when Elgar received an honorary doctorate from Yale University and it was played. Other schools such as Princeton and Columbia picked up the tune as well, before it spread to nearly every college and university in the U.S. Today the piece is often played as processional or recessional music for commencement ceremonies across the country. It has become so widely used that it's rare to attend a graduation event without it.
