Renovations Begin for New Hotel Coming to Iuka

Arrest Made in Local Car Wash Burglary

On August 11, 2021, information was given to the Tishomingo County Sheriffs Dept. regarding two females in a red Ford Explorer parked at the car wash beside Iuka Walmart in Iuka that possibly had illegal drugs and a weapon in their possession. Upon arrival, deputies found the vehicle and noticed that it matched the description of a vehicle used in connection with a recent burglary of the car wash.

Deputies made contact with Summer Stanfield, a 35 year old white female and Sonia Martinez, a 42 year old white female. Deputies called for Iuka Police Department to come to the scene. A weapon and illegal narcotics along with other evidence pertaining to the burglary of the car wash was gathered.

Both females were arrested and transported to the Tishomingo County Jail. The investigation is still ongoing and both females are wanted for questioning by Alabama Law Enforcement concerning other burglaries.

Temporary Mask Requirement for Tishomingo County Schools

The Tishomingo County School District has implemented a temporary mask requirement for students and staff due to large numbers of students in quarantine. Per the TCSD Board of Education's decision on Friday night (August 13th), masks are to be worn on buses and indoors by staff and students beginning August 16th and ending at the end of school activities on September 3rd. Indoor events will require students and staff of the TCSD to wear masks while other spectators will not be required to mask up. Masks will not be required outdoors. The policy was implemented after discussions about current positive case numbers and quarantine numbers prompted concern over keeping schools open, keeping fall athletics going, and keeping kids in school. "At the end of the first full week of school,

we had 45 positive cases among students in the district with 170 students placed in quarantine due to exposure either inside or outside of school. So, 215 kids were absent due to positive cases and quarantine at the end of the day Friday. We still had other absences related to other illness, specifically a stomach virus that is going through the schools as well," stated Superintendent Holly. "We know we are going to have absences with positive COVID cases and other illnesses, but by MSDH guidelines, we can reduce the absences by quarantine by everyone wearing a mask. The guidelines state that if a positive person is wearing a mask and the exposed person is also wearing a mask, only the positive person would have to leave school as long as the ex-

Plans for a new hotel are underway in Tishomingo County after investors purchased property on Highway 1 in Iuka to open a hotel. Mayor and Raynard LLC, purchased the property and the work immediately, taken an interest in our community. The investors have plans for the area, according to an interview done by Opal Lovelace on Tuesday, August 17th.

This group of investors, including the Mayor of Iuka, Joel Robertson and local businessman, Mario Barnes has confirmed the news that a complete renovation of the existing building is beginning.

The historic property in Iuka was the sight of the building on the property was formally the Sunset Inn, which has been vacant

for many years. The level of disrepair at the sight calls for the entire building to be stripped and redone. Local contractor, Stephen Stewart of Goat Island was hired to perform the demolition phase of the renovation.

Mayor Joel Robertson had this to say, "We are thrilled to have this family oriented business coming to Iuka. Lodging for out of town guests is a great need in our community and it is exciting to see this property being utilized."

Mario Barnes is acting as the construction manager/advisor for the project and is excited to see this advancement happen in Tishomingo County. Barnes stated that with the uncertainty brought about by

the science behind masks is substantiated by some, but ridiculed by others. Some argue it's an infringement of personal rights to require them, while others argue it's an infringement on public health rights of others if the requirement to wear them isn't made. We are not here to argue either side of those arguments. The district and school board want to have kids in school. We are not naïve enough to not think that we may have to shut down and be virtual at some point. However, our board and district want to take a preventative measure that can hopefully reduce our quarantine numbers, give us a chance to stay in school, and increase our likelihood of having fall sports," Holly said. Masks are available at the schools for those who may need one.

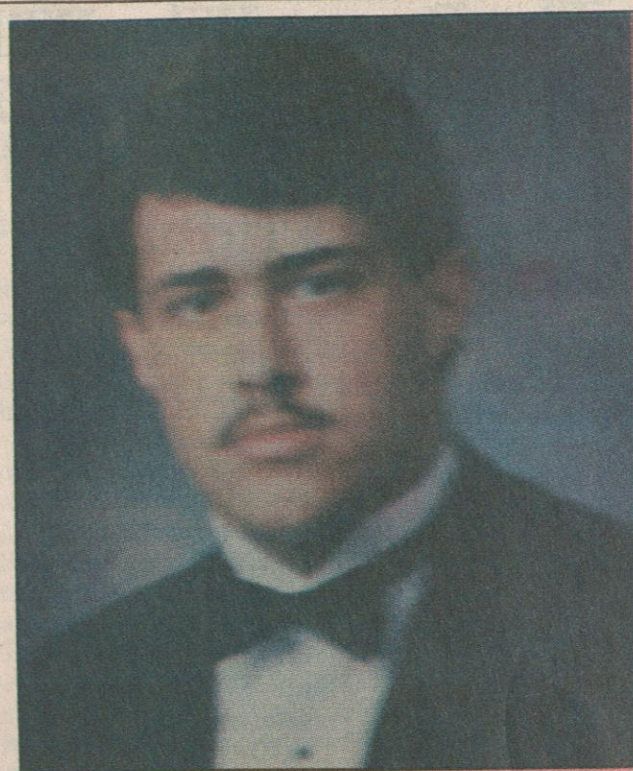

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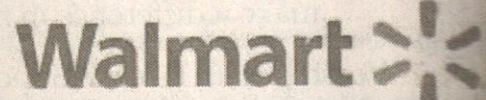
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Frances Madine Flurry

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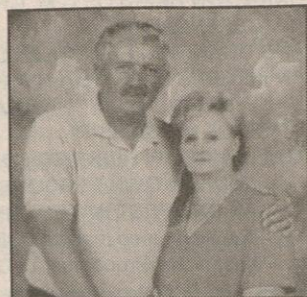

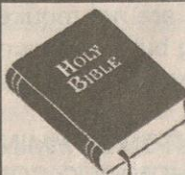

NEMCC SETS FLAT RATE TUITION FOR DUAL ENROLLED STUDENTS

BOONEVILLE, Miss. - High School students who desire to complete college classes at Northeast Mississippi Community College while maintaining their status as high school students may now do so at a reduced cost.

At Northeast the tuition and fees for dual enrolled students are set at a flat rate of \$50 per class for in-state residents and \$100 per class for students living outside the state of Mississippi.

Students completing more than 15 credit hours will be charged at the current part-time rate.

A one-time fee of \$320 will be charged for

an iPad, which is required if taking seated courses on any of the Northeast campuses. Students may register a personal iPad by contacting the Help Desk at helpdesk@nemcc.edu.

iPads are not required for online classes or classes taught at the high school.

To enroll, students must complete an Admissions application and request an official transcript and letter of recommendation from the high school counselor before contacting the Northeast Admissions Office regarding registration.

An ACT score is required. A minimum sub score of 17 in English (or

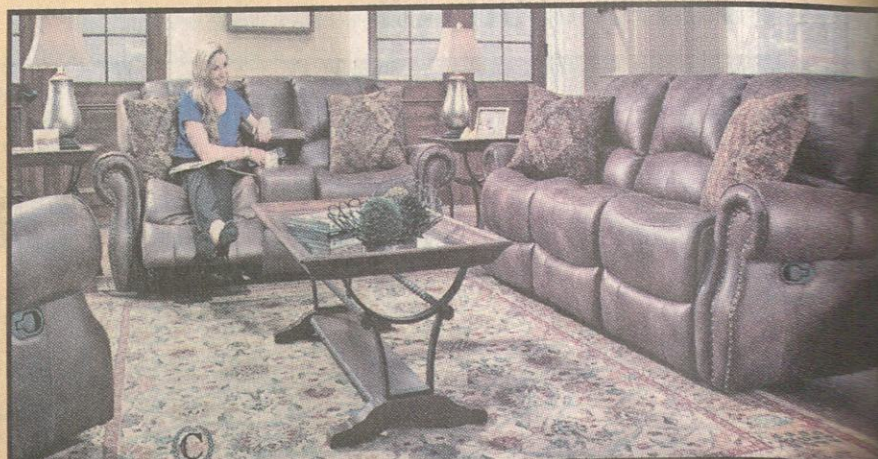
Essentials for College Success) or a sub score of 80 or above is required for enrollment in English Comp I. Students with a sub score of 19 (or above) are eligible for College Algebra and Calculus. A sub score of 19 (or above) is required for enrollment in Anatomy and Physiology I. A minimum ACT composite score of 19 or above is required for enrollment in Career and Technical programs.

Students in Career and Technical programs must have a minimum grade point average of 2.0 or above.

Fall semester classes begin Monday, August 16. Online classes begin Monday, August 23.
