In Iuka's 164 years of recorded history, this apparently was the first destructive tornado to enter the downtown area and the heavy populated neighborhoods on the north side of town (north of the railroad). The storm came from the north, which is unusual. Old timers have always said Woodall Mountain prevented tornadoes from entering the rolling hills in which Iuka was settled! The city of Iuka has been spared over the years but there have been several tornadoes north of town in the Harmony/Central area and Goat Island.

The storm "came out of no where" and first hit the area around Sycamore Drive just off Hwy. 25 north and then made a path through our beautiful historic Oak Grove Cemetery before hitting the residential section and downtown, ripping age-old trees up from the roots. Several businesses in the downtown area have damaged roofs, Uncle Shirley's storefront window was broken, and many had overturned signs and property. Several homes received major damage during the storm, while others had minor damage.

The hard work and support shown to and in Iuka has been phenomenal, strangers, family, and friends have come to the aid of those in need. The willingness of the volunteers to drop everything and help out has brought hope to so many.

Our neighbors to the south, Belmont and Tishomingo have been hit hard in the last several years by tornadoes and even Burnsville was hit by a surprise tornado last year.

Community Comes Together After Two Tornadoes Hit Iuka

The community has come together in the aftermath of the tornadoes. Local businesses have made donations; City and County leaders have joined forces to clear debris and assess the damage; and T.C.E.P.A. has been working tirelessly (with the assistance of ACE out of Alcorn County) to restore power to Iuka after lines were knocked down during the storm. Local and state law enforcement has also collaborated in regulating traffic in the affected areas and serving where needed. The Red Cross is in Iuka, if you need help as a result of the tornado, please call 1-800-RED-CROSS and a Red Cross agent will reach out to you. Our local fire departments and first responders have been out working hard since Sat-

urday evening as well.

Iuka City Hall began organizing countless volunteers to see that every area has been reached. Many construction companies have offered services free of charge. Churches are acting as drop-off points for donations and have provided meals for those working and affected. Residents, as well as individuals from surrounding cities and counties showed up ready to work. The cities of Belmont, Tishomingo, and Burnsville all responded to help with the clean-up bringing supplies, equipment and volunteers. The response to Iuka has been overwhelming and everyone in our town is truly grateful for all of the support.



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Drug Trafficking Arrest Made in Tishomingo County

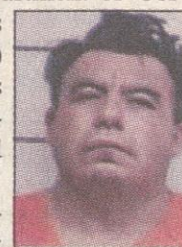
On Monday, August 23, 2021, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department working in cooperation with the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics (MBN), Mississippi Highway Patrol (MHP), Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), and the Iuka Police Department charged Otis Gean Farris age 40 from Iuka, MS with Aggravated Trafficking of a Schedule II Controlled Substance.

Farris was found to be in possession of approximately half a pound of methamphetamine at the time of arrest. Farris is currently on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC) and was out on felony bond as well.

from Byhalia, MS was arrested and charged with aggravated trafficking of a schedule ii controlled substance. Bonilla was found to be in possession of approximately 1.4 pounds of methamphetamine along with a 9mm pistol at the time of arrest. Bonilla was also found to be in possession of approximately 6 grams of cocaine and Xanax pills. Bonilla will be facing enhancement charges for possession of a firearm during the commission of a felony. Bonilla was out on a felony bond from the Tishomingo County Jail where

he was released on his own recognizance. Bonilla is awaiting bond at the Tishomingo County Jail at this time.

The estimated street value of the narcotic that was seized is approximately \$30,000 plus. Seized was approximately \$4,433 in US currency. This investigation was conducted over a 6-month period. The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department would like to thank all Agencies involved for their cooperation. This is an ongoing investigation, and more arrests are expected to be made.

Arrest in Burnsville Takes Large Amount of Ecstasy Off the Streets

On August 23, 2021, Captain Ryan Glover made a traffic stop on County Road 298 in Burnsville, after getting a call of a female on a motorcycle trying to assault another person. The female attempted to flee

and was quickly arrested by Captain Glover. The driver fled on foot. The female later identified as Navarree Moss, fought with Deputy Glover for a moment before being placed in cuffs. Other deputies pulled up to assist. During the arrest, deputies found 121 ecstasy pills and pieces of a few more

ecstasy pills on Navarree. She continued to fight and was transported to the Tishomingo County Jail where she is being charged with felony possession of Schedule one narcotic, with intent to sale.

Also assault on a Law Enforcement Officer and resisting arrest. The public should be aware that the pills look like candy, or vitamins with penguins, and Micky Mouse shapes, in different colors. Please make sure your children know not to take anything without being approved by a parent or guardian.



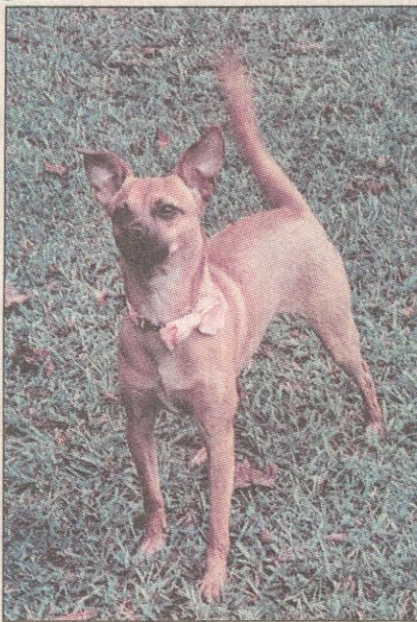

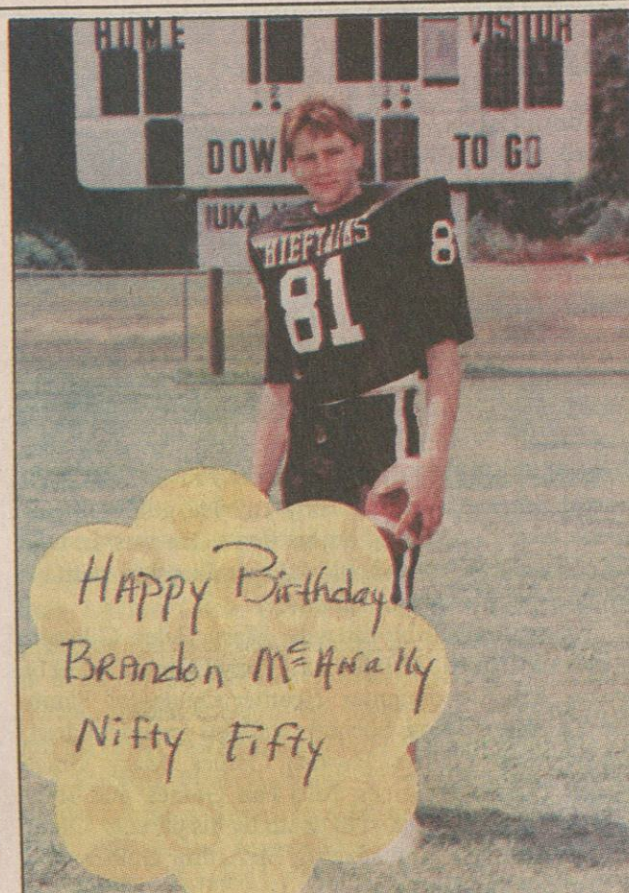
Child Find Program for Tishomingo County School District

IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM THE TAX ASSESSOR

The Tishomingo County Tax Assessor's Office will be conducting their annual Tax Assessment Appeal Week on September 7th-13th, 2021. This week is designated for the citizens of Tishomingo County to ask any questions regarding their tax assessment. This assessment is from which the 2021 tax bill will be generated. These assessments include land, garages, houses, shops or other structures that may be on your property. According to Miss. Code Ann. # 27-35-143, there are certain criteria that must be met in order for changes to be made after the State Tax Commission has approved the final roll after September 31st. This is the reason that it is of utmost importance for you to come by or call if you have any questions about your 2021 tax bill. Although we have set aside this specific week, we encourage you to come by anytime between now and September 24th. This is the final deadline in which changes can be made. As a reminder, it is the tax payer's responsibility to make sure their taxes are paid and their property is assessed correctly. With this in mind, please take this opportunity to call our office, at 662-423-7059, with questions or stop by and let us check your assessment for you.

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED BUDGET AND PROPOSED TAX LEVIES FOR THE UPCOMING FISCAL YEAR FOR THE TOWN OF BURNSVILLE

The Town of Burnsville will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget and proposed tax levies for fiscal year 2022 on September 7, 2021, 6 p.m. at Burnsville City Hall.

The Town of Burnsville is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$1,900,900. 3.69 percent or \$70,000 of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$3,743,700.00. Of that amount, 1.9 percent, or \$70,000 is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

The decision to not increase the ad valorem tax millage rate for fiscal year 2022 above the current fiscal year's ad valorem tax millage rate means you will not pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures and equipment and rental real property, unless the assessed value of your property has increased for fiscal year 2022.

Any citizen of the Town of Burnsville is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed budget and tax levies for fiscal year 2022 and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

A millage rate of 22 will produce the same amount of revenue from ad valorem taxes as was collected the prior year. The millage rate for the prior year was 22.

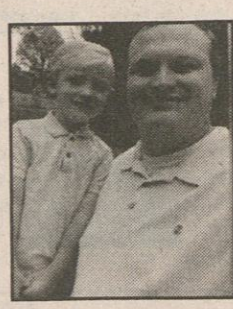

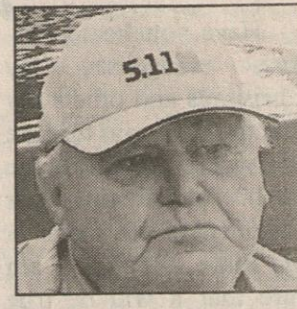

When The Wolf And The Lamb Will Dwell Together

Have you heard pastors, evangelists, lay Christians and others say that the Bible says that the lion will lie down with the lamb? Actually this exact statement is not made in the Bible, although I am sure that it will be true that the lion and the lamb will lie together during the millennium. What is actually taken to mean that the lion will lie with the lamb is found in Isaiah 11:6. but it says: "the wolf shall dwell with the lamb". Then it says "the calf and the young lion and the fatling together", so this evidently includes the lion and the lamb lying together.

We need, however, to go back to Isaiah 11:1-2 to learn more about "when" the time of peace will come, and Who will bring it: "And there shall come forth a rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots: And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest

upon Him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD." I will not be able to exhaust the meaning of these two verses, but I will give a part of what is included here. First, we see that a rod, or a twig, will grow out of the stem of Jesse, meaning that Jesus will be a descendant of Jesse through David. A Branch shall grow out of the roots of Jesse, thus indicating that Jesus will be a fruitful "Branch" from Jesse's family through David. Now we see a seven-fold description of the work of Jesus in the words: (1) The Spirit of the LORD;

(2) The Spirit of wisdom; (3) The Spirit of understanding; (4) The Spirit of counsel; (5) The Spirit of might; (6) The Spirit of knowledge; (7) The Spirit of the fear of the LORD. Revelation 3:1 says that Jesus has "the seven Spirits of God", seemingly indicating the seven attributes of His Spirit as described in Isaiah 11:2. (Revelation 4:5; 5:6 also indicate the "Seven Spirits of God.") All of this simply indicates the complete work of the Spirit of God in Jesus!

Isaiah 11:3-4 continues with the work of Jesus in the millennium: "And shall make Him of quick understanding in the fear of the LORD:

and He shall not judge after the sight of His eyes, neither reprove after the hearing of His ears: But with righteousness shall He judge the poor, and reprove with equity for the meek of the earth: and He shall smite the earth with the rod of His mouth, and with the breath of His lips shall He slay the wicked." These verses shows that the Son of God will return to earth someday to set things right here for a thousand years (Revelation 20:1-6). This time has never come yet, so it has to be still future! Notice that the One Who comes has to be David's descendant, as Luke 1:32-33 says: "He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of his father David: And He shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of His kingdom there shall be no end."

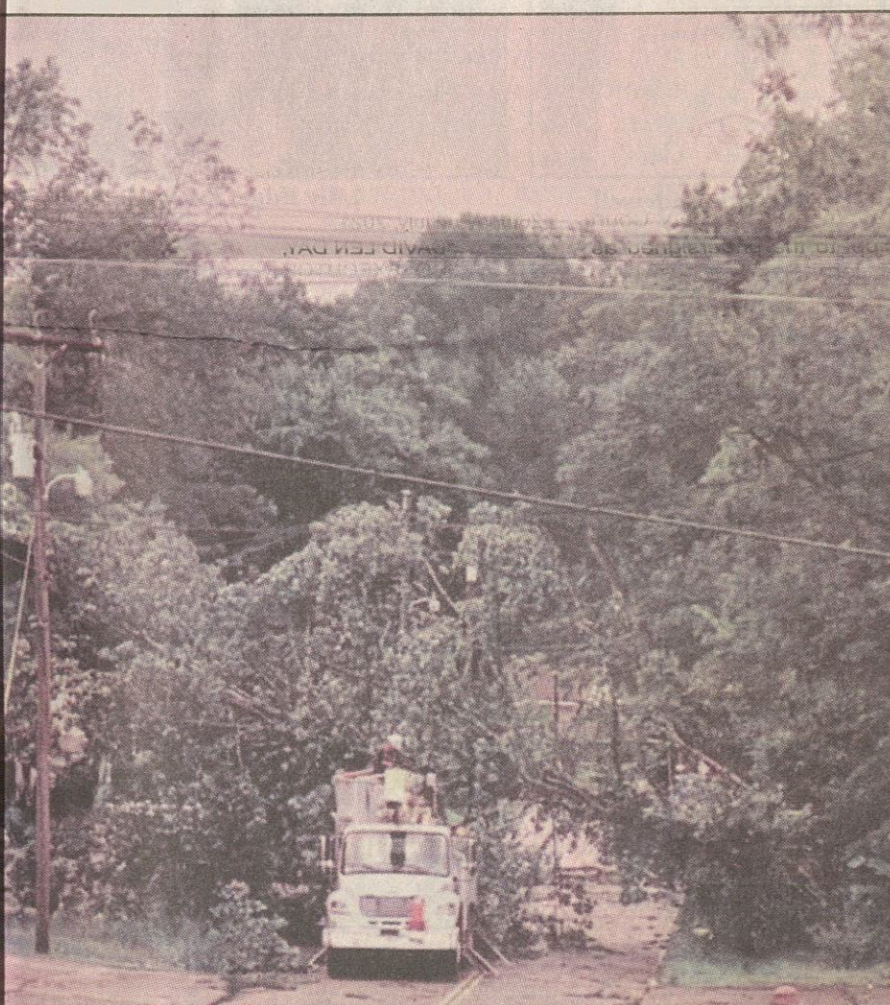
