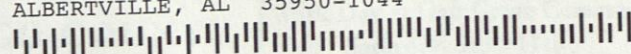

Message from the Mayor of Iuka

Dear Friends,

These past two weeks have been a mountain of activity in the city and what we have come to realize with an even deeper understanding is that the people of Iuka are truly a genuinely amazing group of folks. The number of volunteers who turned out to offer help, from clearing roads to placing tarps on roofs, to housing those who couldn't stay in their homes, stated that together, we would get through this difficult time.

There continue to be so many issues that must be addressed and we are working to prioritize these issues. Our city department heads and city workers are stretched to the limit with the work before them, but they have worked tirelessly to address the needs.

One issue that continues to arise is the work to be done in Oak Grove Cemetery. All roads have been cleared and many of the trees and much of the debris have been removed. However, there is so much work left to be done. Several large trees are left to be cut and there is so much debris that must be removed. To that end, we are asking that volunteers assist us again on Saturday, September 11, beginning at 7:00 am in the cemetery. We need folks with heavy equipment, as well as people with rakes, weed eaters and push mowers. There is so much small debris that has to be removed before the cemetery can be mowed.

We are also asking that families who have flower arrangements or other adornment around the graves that are not either in vases attached to the monument or in a saddle arrangement attached to the top of the monument, please remove those items prior to the Saturday workday. This will help us to more efficiently clear and clean the area. If those items are not removed prior to the Saturday workday, they will have to be removed by the workers. This will make the work in the cemetery more efficient and much easier for those who are mowing.

We have been in contact with a company in Memphis who may be able to right the hundred+ year old monuments that were toppled. We'll keep you posted on that inquiry. We do ask that you not try to pick up any family monuments that may have been blown off their bases. Please contact a company in our area to do that. The likelihood of further damaging the monument or injuring yourself is great. It is the responsibility of each family to see that the monument is returned to its base. We suggest that you check with your homeowner's insurance to see if this might be covered.

We are in the process of investigating potential grants that may be available to us because of the historic nature of Oak Grove. The 31st and 33rd governor of Mississippi, John Marshall Stone, is buried there, as well as, Dr. Miles A. Simmons, creator of "Dr. Simmons Liver Pills." There are many soldiers who fought in the Civil War buried in Oak Grove too.

We continue to ask for your patience as we navigate the best way to serve our city in this time of upheaval. We assure you that every effort is being made to see that Iuka is not only restored to its original state, but is restored in a way that each citizen of Iuka will be proud of what we, together, have accomplished.

Thank you to all who have lent a helping hand. Your gracious gift of time and effort is truly appreciated.

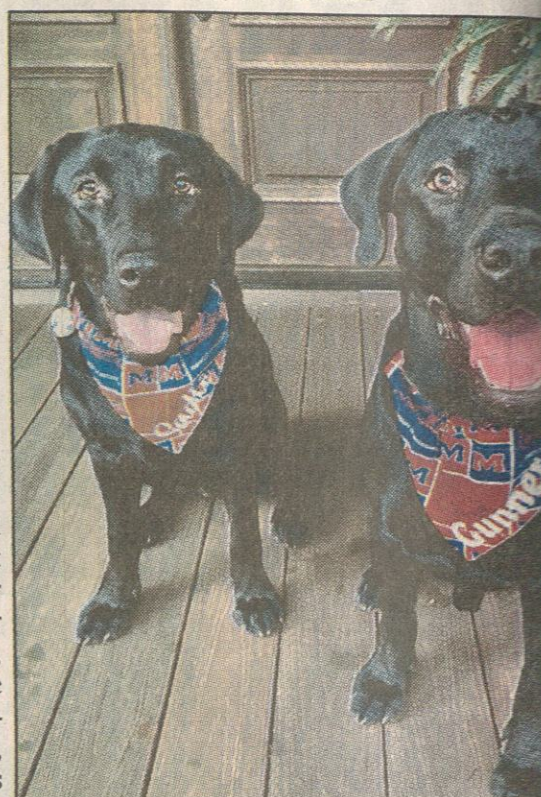

NOTICE OF NO TAX INCREASE AND A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED BUDGET AND PROPOSED TAX LEVIES FOR THE CITY OF IUKA

The City of Iuka will hold a public hearing on a proposed ad valorem revenue increase for fiscal year 2021-22 and on its proposed budget and proposed tax levies for fiscal year 2021-2022. The hearing will be held on September 14, 2021 at 6:30 p.m., in the Boardroom at Iuka City Hall.

The City of Iuka is now operating with projected total budget revenue of \$6,784,925.00(2022). (4.62 percent) \$313,500.00 of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$5,916,000.00(2021). Of that amount, (5.45 percent) or \$307,000.00 is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For next fiscal year, the City of Iuka proposes to increase your ad valorem millage rate by -0- mills and will remain at 17.23 mills; it will not result in a tax increase. Any citizen of the City of Iuka is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed ad valorem tax increase, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any decision is taken."

When The Wolf And The Lamb Will Dwell Together (part 2)

Old Presbyterian Church Damaged by Tornado

In the recent tornado that swept thru Iuka, the old Presbyterian Church located on Eastport was badly damaged by a falling tree that hit the back portion of the church. The structure is no longer used as a church and has been sold several times.

The church has much history, which was reported in Charlotte's Attic last year. It was originally built on the south side of the railroad tracks, but because of flooding water, it was moved to its present site. In 1908, J. C. Gracey, an elder, donated land on the north side of town and the church was put on rollers and moved to the present location.

Sunday School was held in the church but it was damaged in the move. A new church was built but due to faulty construction this building was torn down in 1954 to make way for the present building (on Eastport Street). The original building was designed by a famous architect, Mr. Beardsley, and was built more like an Episcopal than a Presbyterian Church but with its tall belfry tower, the beamed ceiling would now be a sight of beauty.

Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Spinks moved to Iuka a few years later and found the church in a bad state of dilapidation due to faulty designing. Mr. Spinks had the church repaired and replaced the brick veneered base with Tishomingo County stone and walls of white asbestos siding. The interior was beautiful, Cathedral light fixtures added and the stained glass windows replaced.

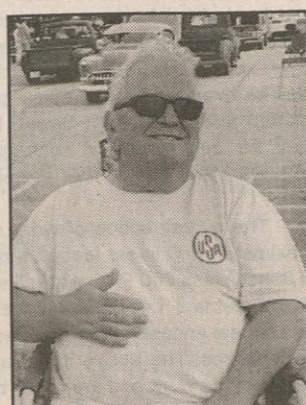

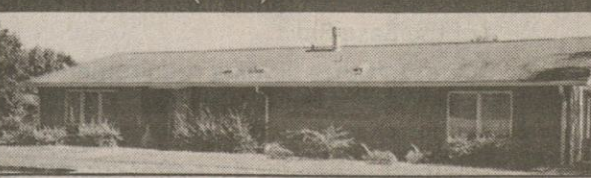

I'm not going to re-hash Sonny Scott's article, "Church isn't always the most kid-friendly environment," in Sunday's 8-8-21, Daily Journal, but it reminded me of an incident that happened at the little country church where I grew up, Mt. Glory Missionary Baptist Church. (Missionary because we believed in missions - giving).

My younger sister, Flora Mae, about three, kept whamming and Mom couldn't get her to be quiet. Just as they

started to audibly pray, Mom got up and started toward the door with her. She, kicking and screaming shouted, "Don't you blister me all over!" It was so true. S niggers from the congregation erupted. I was eight or nine years old and old enough to have empathy for her. That trip was no laughing matter. I went to Carter's Branch several times when I was growing up. Some of the Powell's lived on the Walter and Beulah Stanford's place and farmed. When they had revivals at Carter's Branch the Stanford's would carry a truck load to Carter's Branch, their home church.

As a little girl I was always doing chores for Miss Beulah, chores she couldn't do for herself. I'd help dust a chicken house full of white leg-horn hens. She sold eggs at Iuka every Saturday. I'd catch them for her, hold them and she'd dust. A nasty job. A few times my brother, George Robert, helped me. One of the hens would steal her nest under the house. She'd call Mom if I could come help. I liked to go help her. I got to go and experience lots of things that little girls didn't get to do. I'd

go with them to all-day singings and dinner on the ground.

They carried me to my first movie, to Mules Trade Day in Columbia, TN, the first Monday seems like April. There I saw all kinds of fine mules, marching bands, parade of soldiers marching and I had no money. But I got more than for the work I'd help her with. I picked up a lot of her mannerisms and my sisters used to call me Beulah. There was just one way to do lots of things and it was Miss Beulah's way. Smile. Ask my nieces, Shelia about her cooking Irish potatoes. We laugh about it every time we got together. She boiled them in lots of water, then pours the water off. She tells me, "I still do".

Another thing I got to do was go to Clarksville, TN and visit. They carried me to see "Gone With The Wind" when it premiered in Nashville, TN. What a treat! Remember all this was in the 1930's.

But back to going to Carter's Branch. I loved to go because some of the children were my age and we had worked and played together. My dad helped

the Stanford's too, on the farm.

When we went into the sanctuary, I was carried to the front pew in the Amen corner. The Stanford's just got lost in a crowd. I sat on the pew like a "Little Miss Nancy Astor" and felt right at home.

Here it is September the 2nd. It seems to me the months are just passing too fast. I went to my garden yesterday and it made me so sad. I hadn't been to the garden to pick anything in two weeks. Too hot. There was nothing to pick except a few faulty tomatoes. So, I picked some nice green ones.

A few days ago we lost another retired teacher, Mrs. Ruthel Comer. She was a lovely lady and the Tishomingo County Retired Teachers send prayers and sympathy to her family. We used to send flowers not we send a donation to our scholarship fund in memory of Ruthel. This is given each year to a Belmont and Tishomingo County graduate.

They who know the sorrows other lives have known never walk alone.

It was the Braves who came out of the gates in a fast manner as the self-proclaimed "Wrecking Crew" Defense forced a Cardinal three and out. The Braves Offense wasted no time as on the third play from scrimmage, Senior Quarterback Blake Counce raced around left end for a 79-yard Touchdown Rush. Senior Kicker Mason Daniel added the Point After out of the hold of Gage Tackett and Snap of Caleb Bonds. 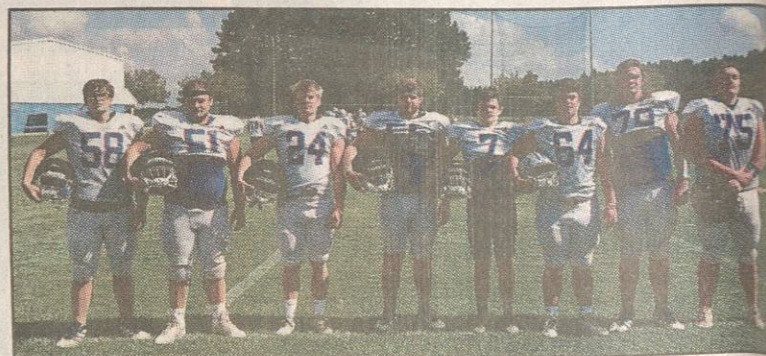
