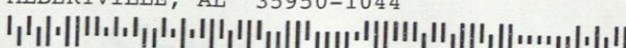

One Arrested After Fatal Wreck in Tishomingo County

Brittany A. Norris, 33 of Counce, TN has been charged with aggravated DUI times three reports MHP Troop F Spokesperson Staff Sgt. Bryan McGee.

Ms. Norris was involved in the September 20, 2021 accident that claimed the life of young Michael Walker of Iuka and seriously injured his mother and sister.

The Walker family was traveling north of Hwy. 365 south of Burnsville in a 2014 Ford Escape when it was hit by a 2011 Ford Explorer driven by Norris.

Brittney Norris was arrested and charged Monday and booked in at the Tishomingo County Jail.

Family spokesman reports that Macie Walker is much improved and now in a private room after undergoing back surgery. Melissa Walker was reportedly undergoing her second surgery on

Tuesday of this week for leg injuries. She underwent surgery last week for intestinal problems. She remains in intensive care.

Ms. Norris remains in the county jail with bond set at \$600,000.00 on 3 counts. According to info on the internet: Harming or killing someone while you are allegedly under the influence of alcohol is known as aggravated DUI and is a felony charge, with the potential penalty of up to 25 years in prison. You may be charged with aggravated DUI if you caused death or mutilation to a victim.

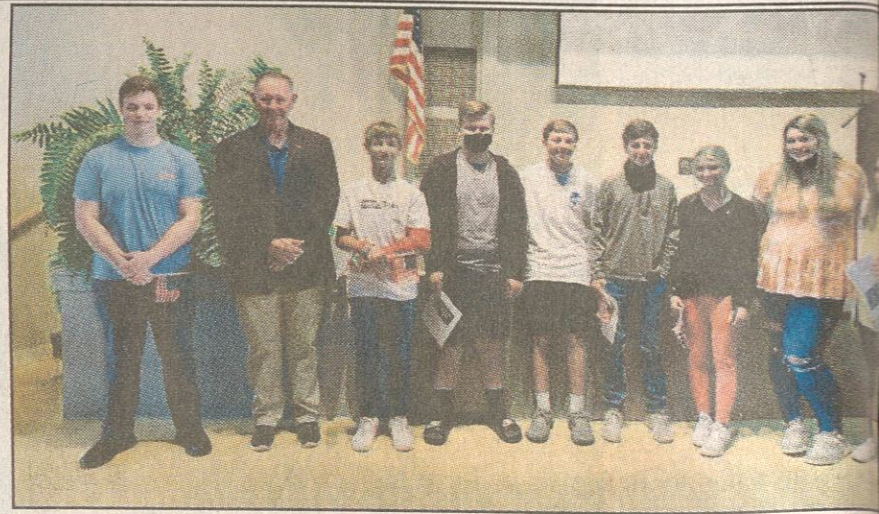

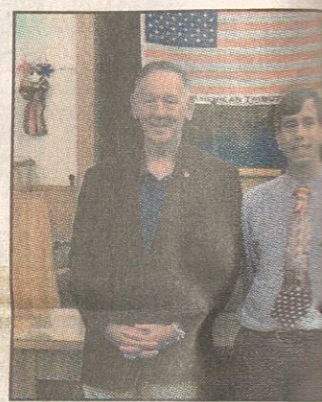
TCSD 9/11 20th Anniversary Speaker Col. Ryan Yantis Visits Schools

On Wednesday September, 22 Col. Ryan Yantis visited the campuses of TCHS, Burnsville Middle School, and Iuka Middle School. Mr. Yantis was in the Pentagon on 9/11/2001 and helped coordinate the rescue efforts when a plane struck the building. He told the students his story and how to prevail in times of trouble. The students got to engage with him and ask questions at the end of each presentation.

Col. Ryan Yantis was serving at the Pentagon as a PR director for the Military during 9/11/2001. He survived the explosion and helped rescue 100s of military members from the Pentagon to safety. He spoke to 7th and 8th grade students about his call to join the military as well as encourage others to serve their country in any way possible.

Mr. Yantis visited New Prospect Baptist Church for a public event later this morning. Mr. Sean Glidewell coordinated these events and secured a grant from the State Educational Foundational to fund the event. We are very grateful to him.

The students who did not get to attend the program live watched county wide grades 7-12.

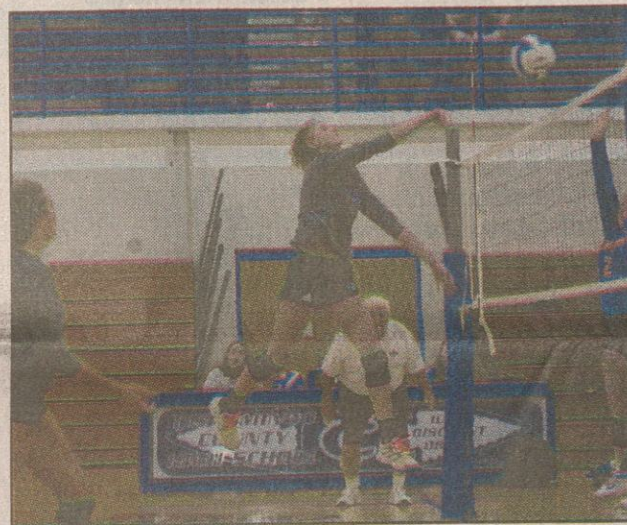
TCHS Volleyball Advance to Playoffs

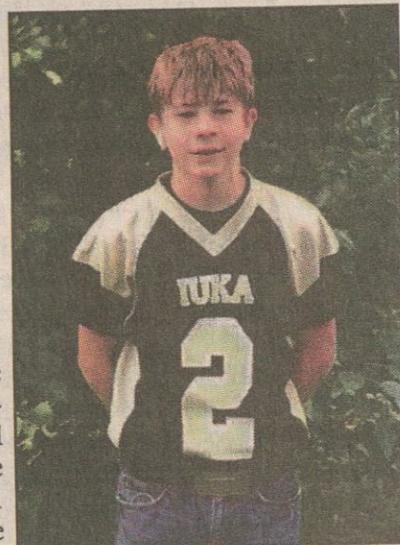

Zippy and her sister Selina never married. They didn't have any men around except cousins! This was 20 years old and desperate! Zippy and Linnie owned 1492 acres on Zippy Creek. They owned a big house for steamboat travelers going up and the Tennessee River. They would not take paper money! So, they placed the gold and silver coins in fruit jars, and buried them in the yard and barn.

Coon, Samuel Sidney Bugg, was given to Zippy and Linnie by his parents, who lived nearby, so he could bury the money, and worked with and for them. As they were passing away they gave deed, land money to Coon. Now Coon was mentally challenged. Charlie said to Coon: son, you know the girls have care of you, all your life, so I will make a deal with you. If you will deed everything to me, I will take care of the rest of my life! So Charlie became one of the men in Tishomingo County. He carried a large stack full of paper money. He traveled to Canada and Mexico and loved horse racing. As far as I know he kept his promise to Coon. Charlie died in a car accident in 1938 in Iuka a short distance past the current National Guard Armory. Coon died in Oklahoma. Charlie owned land. The 1492 acres is now part of a buffer zone area. My dream is to see this land become a National Wildlife Refuge in honor of Chief Red Jacket, the same as the one in Tishomingo and Johnson County in Oklahoma.

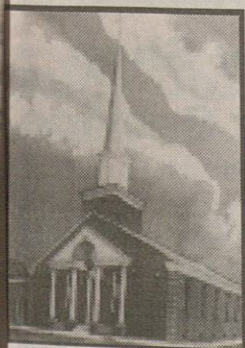

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Iuka called a Special Meeting of the Board of Aldermen at 6:30 p.m., on September 14, 2021 at the City Hall in Iuka, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the called meeting by the Mayor of the City of Iuka was to levy the ad valorem taxes for the next fiscal year, to establish a complete budget of the revenues, expenses and working cash balances of the City of Iuka for the next fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Iuka has received the municipal revenue, expenses and working cash balances estimated for the next fiscal year and has prepared a statement showing aggregate revenues collected during the current fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Iuka has presented to the Board of Aldermen a proposed budget of estimated revenues and expenditures for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022 and the Municipality has held at least one public meeting to allow the general public to comment on the taxing and spending plan incorporated into the proposed budget of the Mayor, according to law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen met on the aforesaid date, and considered all of the above items and determined that the Mayor's recommendation as to the budget of estimated revenues and expenditures for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, should be approved.

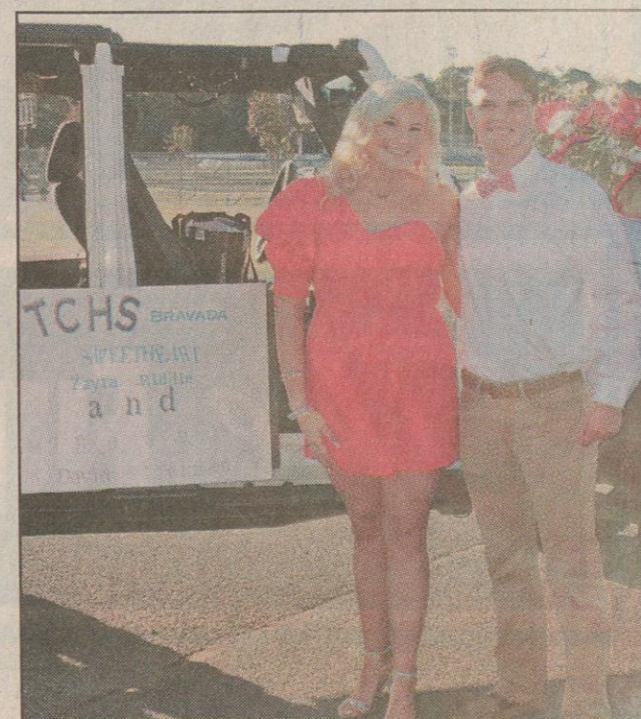

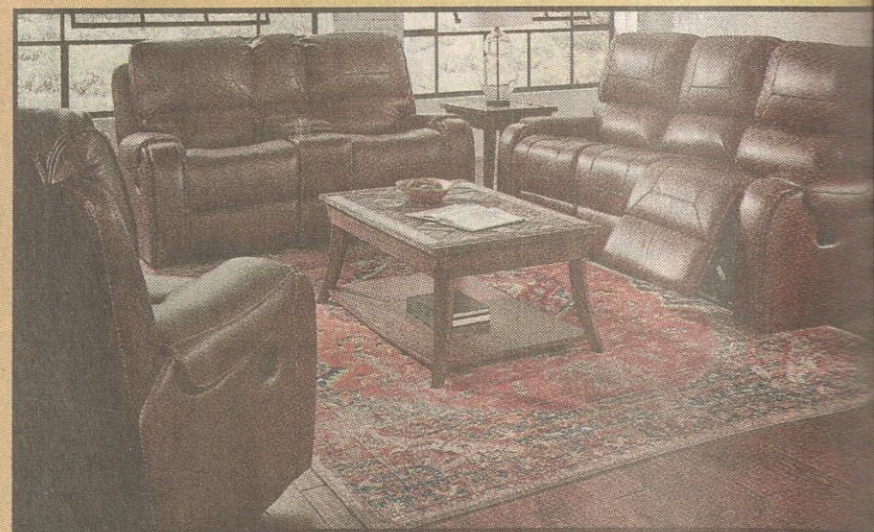
