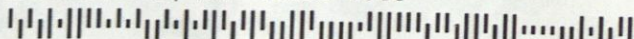

city. We look forward to their reopening under new management and the opportunity it creates for visitors within our area" commented Mayor Robertson.

Joiner and Raynard Construction has been organized by James Joiner and Julien Raynard to develop residential and commercial properties in Tishomingo County. The two men have cumulative experience of 40 years in the industry. The group is motivated by the desire to provide both residential accommodations and new commercial/retail facilities. In the works is a plan for a multifamily rental development of more than 50 units. The site has been acquired and the building plans are being developed. Five properties have been purchased so far and there are plans for others to

be acquired.

Mayor Robertson also stated "we have a lack of available housing within our city as well and their investment into our housing market is highly anticipated because adequate housing access is crucial for our continued growth."

The group is currently looking hire three to five individuals for the operations office in Iuka which they plan to open soon. The current investments will bring 40 to 50 new jobs to Iuka. The group has already contracted projects that total more than eighteen million dollars in new and redeveloped construction projects for the area said James Joiner, co-founder of Joiner and Raynard Construction.

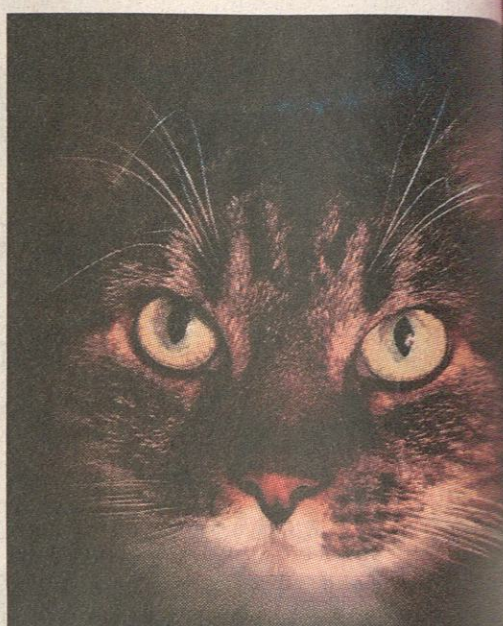

The Winter of 1862 was very severe. Rodney was sent out to do scouting duties but was unable to go because he was running a high fever. It developed into smallpox. He had been vaccinated and had only a mild case.

He was hungry and he thought he should go hunting for some apples, in the snow, he then developed pneumonia and overheard the doctors saying he would probably die in a day or two.

His Bible was found at the hospital and carried back to his Company. His Officer wrote and told his mother that he had died. His Mother mourned for several weeks before he recovered and returned to Camp and wrote home. He also survived the sinking of a pontoon bridge, they were involved in several battles.

June 23, 1864 he was wounded in his left ankle. He was carried to a farmhouse where the bleeding was stopped. He was then taken to a hospital where he found himself on an operating table. His wound looked infected and they were going to amputate. He begged them not to amputate. Stating he would rather die. They decided to give it a chance

to heal and didn't perform the surgery.

After spending time the hospital he was given crutches and sent home on a train. He was not able to return to the War.

Children Invited to Invade Shiloh Battlefield

SHILOH, TN -Park Superintendent Allen Etheridge is pleased to announce a day of fun and educational activities for local children. A Civil War day camp will be held from 10:00 am-2:30 pm on Saturday, November 6, 2021, and there is no charge to participate. The day will consist of exciting hands-on Civil War related activities.

Children will learn how to use signal flags to send messages across the battlefield, and participate in "Artillery Drill," during which they will form cannon crews and learn what it took to load and fire a cannon.

Children ages 10-12 are invited to participate in the day camp. The camp will be located out of doors, so children will need to come prepared to stay outside during the camp. Participants need to bring water, snacks, bug spray, sunscreen, and wear comfortable clothing for outside activities. Participants will also be expected to bring a sack lunch (lunch is not provided).

Isaiah wrote over seven centuries before Jesus was born, but he was right on target about Who Jesus would be and what He would do! Isaiah 25:5-8 will help us here: "Thou shalt bring down the noise of strangers, as the heat in a dry place; even the heat with the shadow of

And in this mountain shall the LORD of hosts make a feast of fat things, a feast of wines on the lees, of fat things full of marrow, of wines on the lees well refined. And He will destroy in this mountain the face of the covering cast over all people, and the veil that is spread over all nations. He will swallow death in victory; and the Lord GOD will wipe away tears from off all faces; and the rebuke of His people shall He take away from off all the earth: for the LORD hath spoken it." BRAVES FALL IN SHOOTOUT AT MOOREVILLE

Mooreville, Miss. - - - The Tishomingo County Braves Football Team traveled to Mooreville to take on the Troopers on Thursday, October 21 in a pivotal Region 1-4A contest. The Braves came out swinging and twice took a first quarter lead, but Mooreville's Air Raid Offense ultimately proved too much for the visitors as the Troopers defeated the Braves 69 to 33 and clinched the number four seed from Region 1-4A in the upcoming MHSAA Playoffs.

The Braves were forced to punt on the opening drive, but thanks to the timely hustle by Senior Long Snapper Caleb Bonds, the Braves recovered a muffed punt and set themselves up with great field position. On third down and goal to go, Senior Quarterback Blake Counce found Senior Wideout Mason Daniel for a 12-yard touchdown strike. The two would connect again later for a 45-

yard passing touchdown. Daniel added the Extra Point out of the Snap of Sophomore Shea Harwell and the hold of Counce. The Braves Defense forced a quick three and out and had the ball with all of the momentum. However, a dropped pass that would have put the Braves up by two scores seemed to shift momentum back to the Troopers.

The Troopers made quick work of the mistake and tied the game up at seven apiece. The Braves brought their determination with them and marched down the field to again take the lead thanks to a 10-yard rushing touchdown by Sophomore Running Back Triston Stanford. Stanford would have 119 yards rushing on 26 carries on the evening, his first 100-yard rushing performance. Mooreville's quick strike offense answered quickly with a 75-yard strike of their own to tie the game up at 14. The Braves Offense

would have several drives in a row with poor field position thanks to special teams penalties or self-inflicted false start penalties. This allowed Mooreville to have the short field several times throughout the second quarter and they would take a 42 to 21 lead into the locker room at the half.

The Braves would add a Counce to Junior Tight End Jaxson Pryce-Jones 14-yard passing touchdown and a Senior Defensive Back Konnor Tuders 81-yard scoop and score touchdown in the second half, but the Troopers Offense would prove to be too much to handle.

Offensively, the Braves were paced by Junior Fullback and Slot Receiver Chandler Williams who had 55 yards rushing and 149-yards receiving. Blake Counce ended up accounting for 220 passing yards, 5 rushing yards, and 52 kickoff return yards on the evening. Senior Offensive Lineman, Austin Hairrell

set a school record with 13 total pancake/knockdown blocks. Defensively, Pryce-Jones led with 8 total tackles, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery, 3 tackles for loss, a pass breakup, and two Quarterback Hurries. Freshman Linebacker Owen Nash added 3 total tackles, a sack and forced fumble and Sophomore Defensive Lineman Layton Monroe added four quarterback hurries. The Braves as a team broke the school record for All-Purpose Yardage in a Single Game with 190 rushing yards, 220 passing yards, and 109 return yards for 519 total All-Purpose

Yards.

Head Coach Richard Russo had this to say, "All we can ask for as Coaches is for the men to go out and give the school, the towns, and our program every ounce they have in their tank. I believe the majority of our team did that tonight, and for that I am proud of them. Yes, we are eliminated from the Playoffs, but that doesn't mean we can't find joy in spending one more week together, or

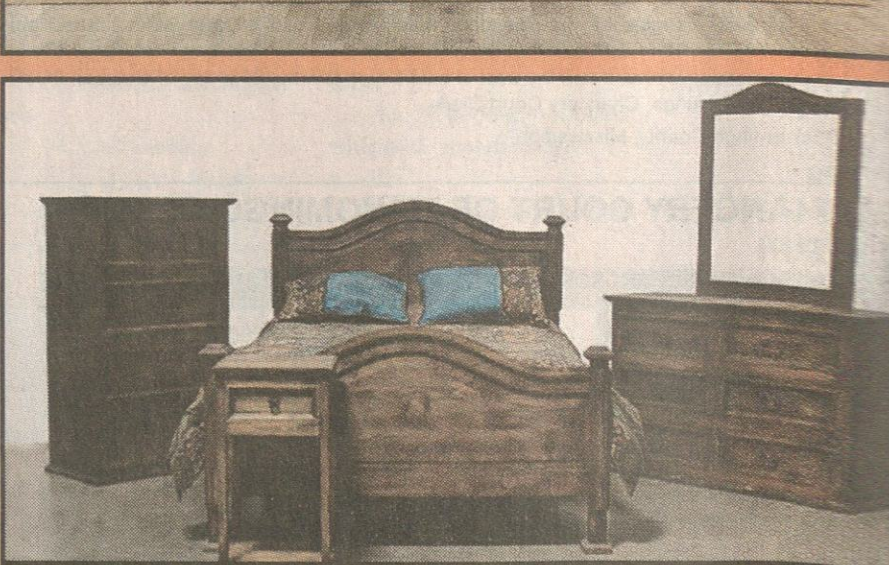

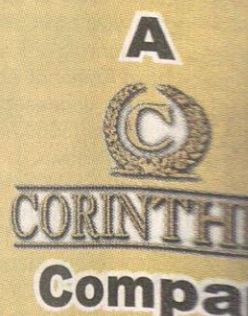
