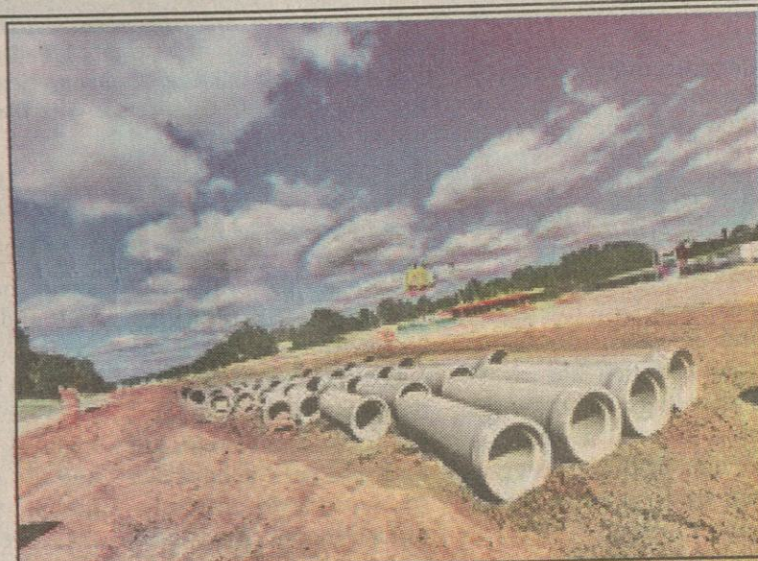

Transportation Commissioner John Caldwell Visits With GOP

The Tishomingo County Republican Party hosted a public meeting at Sparks Drive In on Tuesday, October 26th. The group heard inspiring messages from both Pastor Nathan Hale and Pastor Toby Allison, both of Belmont.

Both Pastor's strongly recommended that we keep our faith in or Lord Jesus in trying times, while reaching out to those that are hurting. This advice is timely and welcomed by the Republican Party as they reach out to all conservatives, not just historically republican voters. "This county voted for Trump at 87%, that means there are a lot of conservatives in Tishomingo County", said Chairman Ken Dulaney. Sheriff's Department Makes Two Arrests in Child Abuse Case

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office has been conducting an investigation into alleged child abuse that involved a 5-year-old minor. On October 29, 2021, Charles Alexander Ewing, 30 years of age, of Iuka, MS and Kayla Marie Owens, 27 years of age, of Iuka, MS were officially charged by the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department with Felonious Child Abuse.

Kayla Marie Owens bond was set at \$20,000. Charles Alexander Ewing bond was set at \$50,000.

This case remains under investigation and more charges may be pending. This case will be presented to the next Grand Jury.

appoint. He drove all the way from Desoto County, and is easily the Commissioner that has visited Tishomingo County the most times. It is clear that he intends to keep his conservative promises from his campaign.

The Commissioner made note of how the MDOT Enforcement is now under the Department of Public Safety, how staff shortages due to covid and budget issues are a real problem when attempting to get things done, and showed the massive crowd how the budget works.

The Department has operated on a flat budget with no increases for over a decade. The Transportation / Infrastructure Bill being debated in Washington will not help Mississippi as much as other states

if at all. (Mississippi will see only 1/1000th of the transportation bill! Some asked how in the world is that possible?) The budget has been 1.2 billion for too long and need to be raised so that North Mississippi can repair roads and bridges in place, much less add new ones. This flat budget will damage our communities over time, no doubt, and Commissioner Caldwell is working hard to get the needed help to keep us on smooth roads.

He also answered questions like "What is happening on Highway 25?" Answers included widening and adding a turn lane in front of the Vo Tech, adding two traffic lights in Iuka, and adding islands or "slow curbs" at locations in Belmont. The group was shocked to see how little our Commis-

sioner has in budget and staff and how long it takes to get even one project through the system.

When asked about highway 72 between Iuka and the Alabama line, the group was encouraged that even though many proposed fixes over the years have faded into nothingness, there is an overlay option that may cost less and be more effective. An area of Mississippi road has seen it stand up well over the past 7 years or so. This may be an option for highway 72.

The Tishomingo County Republican Party thanks the massive crowd for coming out, thanks Commissioner Caldwell for caring so much about our county, and thanks Senator Sparks, Representative Carpenter, & Supervisor Greg Collier for their help and leadership. We also thank Pastors Allison and Hale for lifting our spirits and sharing wonderful encouragements.

He loves spending time with his mom while she is home but while she is away at college he stays with his Papa, Dr. Jim Perkins, at the animal clinic. He enjoys playing with the resident cats and insists on getting extra pets and snuggles. If another cat is getting attention Hemmy pushes himself in the way. He is so sweet it is hard to say no. His other favorite past times are eating, playing & sleeping. He is loved very much by his mom and all his clinic friends. The most interesting thing about Hemmy is that he is a polydactyl cat. A polydactyl cat is a cat with a congenital physi-

cal abnormality called polydactyly, which causes the cat to be born with more than the usual number of toes on one or more of its paws. Hemmy has extra toes on both of his front paws. Normal cats have a total of 18 toes, with five toes on each fore paw, and four toes on each hind paw; polydactyl cats may have as many as nine digits on their front or hind paws. Polydactyl cats' toes aren't just cute—they provide some benefits to kitties, too. Because polydactyl cats have wider, larger paws, they're better able to balance on various surfaces, climb, hunt, and cap-

Veteran's Day Remembered at Shiloh Park

Shiloh, TN - In observance of Veteran's Day, Shiloh National Military Park will host free guided bus tours for veterans and their families on Thursday, November 11. "The National Park Service cares about many sites dedicated to the American military, and also provides opportunities for our military community to connect with the important history of the battlefield," said Superintendent Allen Etheridge. National parks and military have a long history going back to the establishment of Yellowstone as the world's first national park in 1872. The United States Cavalry fought over America's national parks and

served as park rangers until the National Park Service was created 44 years later.

Many national parks have strong military connections including battlefields, military parks, and historic sites. Shiloh National Military Park was established by the veterans of the battle and signed into law by President Cleveland in 1894. "In order that the armies of the southwest... may have the history of one of their memorable battles preserved on the ground where they fought," Shiloh battlefield was administered by the Secretary of War, and under the direction until 1920, of the Shiloh commission, who were all veterans of the

battle.

In honor of these close ties between the National Park Service and the American military, Shiloh will be offering two free guided bus tours for former and active-duty veterans and their spouses. The tours will take place at 8:30 am and 11:45 am and last about 2 hours 45 minutes. Space is limited, so interested parties must pre-register by calling 731-689-5696.

Shiloh Rangers to Lead Two Indian Mound Hikes during Native American Heritage Month

SHILOH, Tennessee - November is Native American Heritage Month, and in honor of contribution to our nation's diversified history, Shiloh Battlefield hosts two interpretive hikes of the Shiloh Indian Mounds. The hikes will take place on Saturday, November 13, and Saturday, November 27, at 10:00 am.

Within its boundaries, Shiloh National Military Park contains one of the most important archaeological sites in the Lower Tennessee Valley, the Shiloh Indian Mounds National Historic Landmark. The program will focus on the past archaeological

work at the site as well as several aspects of daily life at the Shiloh Mound village in 1250 AD. The interpretive hike will explore Native American life, such as how the people defended themselves, what food items they hunted and gathered, and why they built the mounds.

Anyone interested in participating in one of the two-hour hikes is invited to register in advance by calling the park at 731-689-5696. Participants will meet the ranger at the Indian Mound Shelter at 10:00 am on the scheduled day. The terrain will be moderate and hikers should bring water and wear clothing and footwear appropriate for the weather. Rain or severe weather will cancel the programs.

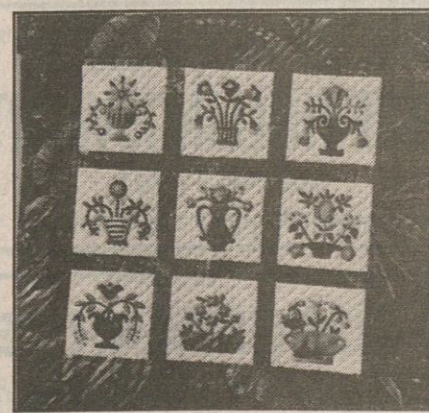

When The Desert Shall Bloom As The Rose

I am making no attempt to cover all of the Book of Isaiah, nor all that will be involved when Jesus returns to earth to bring peace to Israel and the world, but I do want to cover some highlights from several chapters in Isaiah. Isaiah 35:1-4 says, "The wilderness and the solitary place shall be glad for them; and the desert shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose. It shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice even with joy and singing: the glory of Lebanon shall be given unto it, the excellency of Carmel and Sharon, they shall see the glory of the LORD, and the excellency of our God. Strengthen ye the weak hands, and confirm the feeble knees. Say to them that are of fearful heart, Be strong, fear not: behold, your God will come with vengeance, even God with a recompence; He will come and save you." These verses were written by Isaiah primarily for Israel. At the time of his writing Jerusalem and Judah had not yet been captured by Babylon, but in a little over one hundred years they would be. Isaiah is writing to encourage his people concerning God's plan for His people Israel, and for the whole earth.

Places of solitude and wilderness conditions are not

very attractive, at least not if one expects to use them for places of habitation, yet Isaiah says that they will be glad for the people of Israel in their final return to their land in peace. At that time, still future today, the deserts of Israel and the whole earth will blossom as the rose. There will be rejoicing and singing in Jerusalem, with people from Lebanon and other parts of the world accompanying Israel! We are looking at redeemed Israel, of course, that is, those who will finally come to receive Jesus as their Messiah. The glory of the LORD (Jehovah is the word behind "LORD", meaning the Self-Existent One) will be seen on Israel and around the earth! So Isaiah gives a message to Israel and asks that weak hands and feeble knees be strengthened; that fearful hearts be strong. The reason being that Israel's God will come with a recompense for Israel's mistreatment by the nations around her, especially Assyria and Babylon in

Old Testament times, but other nations in our day! God, namely the Lord Jesus as God the Son, will be coming for two reasons: to bring peace to Israel and to show the world that He is the Lord over all the earth, including Israel. The word "recompence" (spelled recompence) in our text, means that God the Son will "repay" the nations that have mistreated and misused Israel. Jesus will be coming to "save Israel", not just from sin, for the remnant that will be in the land at this time will have believed in Him, but Jesus will save them from the nations that have wished to destroy them. He will save them from the scoffing and ridicule that they have received throughout the centuries. No, Israel is not ready at this point in time-, for they have not yet recognized Jesus as their Messiah, but a remnant of them will do so in the tribulation.

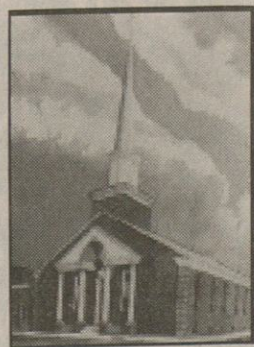

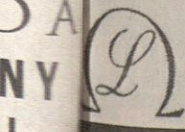

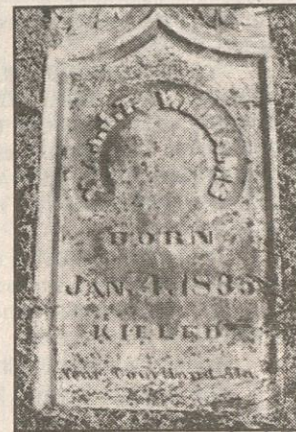
Mystery at Oak Grove Cemetery

Many thoughts and concerns have been on Iuka's Oak Grove Cemetery following the tornado that ripped through the sacred grounds. Jean K. Faulkner, who visits cemeteries often told me a story this week of the reappearance of one of Iuka's founding fathers, J. T. Williams' burial stone.

J. T. Williams' first name was James per the 1850 census. He was of Levi Williams. His younger brother was John Washington Williams had six children. The eldest was James Bayliss Williams who died in Iuka, buried at Oak Grove. Frank Levi Williams, who died in Memphis, buried at Forest Hill Cemetery Midtown, Memphis. The youngest was Marcus Settle Williams. Marcus and his three sisters, Mary Isabelle (Bell), Elizabeth (Lizzie) and Eula lived in the old Williams home on E Street which was torn down many years ago.

Levi Williams name appears in the 1880 Federal Census Mortality Schedule. According to this record Levi died June 1879 in Tishomingo County. Cause of death was murdered. He was buried at Oak Grove just before the graves of his two sons, J. T. and John Washington Williams.

Today, the stone of J. T. Williams, shown below, is missing, and needs to be replaced.

Killed near Courtland, AL.

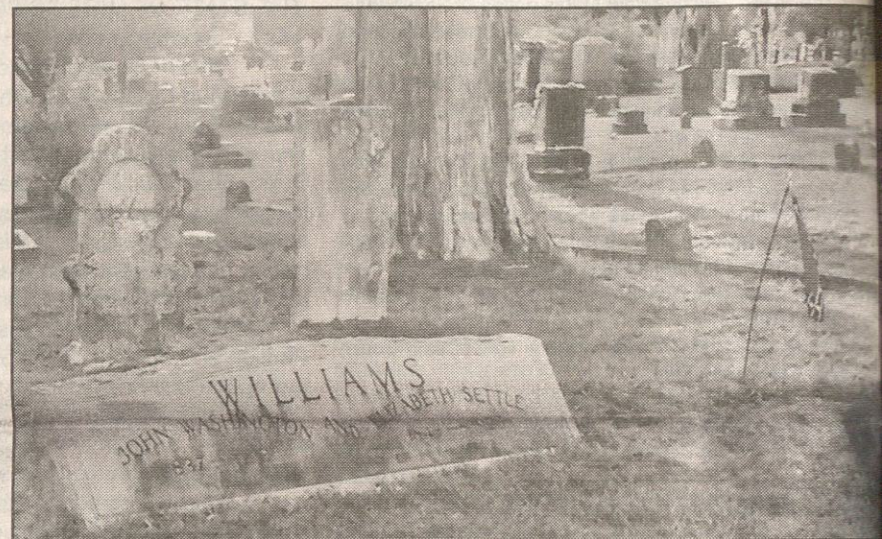

This note about Levi Williams and son, J. T. Williams, was at the Iuka Methodist Church. I don't know the source of information or who wrote the note.

Mr. Levi Williams was one of the pioneers of Tishomingo County, coming from North Carolina soon after the county was formed and no doubt bringing his church letter with him which was later put in the Iuka Methodist Church.

Mr. Williams was the father of Mr. J. W. Williams, a life long devout member and many years an officer of the Iuka church and he was also the father of the civil engineer who gave the name of the Indian Iuka to the town when the railroad first established station here. This young engineer later Major J. Williams was killed in the battle of Courtland and was the first person buried in the Iuka Cemetery.

Many members of the family have been active in the church during the years.

The Gober Family

I have received some information about the Gober family that was featured in last week's attic. Jean Ann Kimberly Faulkner of Iuka reported that the family is distantly related to her father and this photo was of William Thomas Gober and wife Nancy Leulla Humber and family. The family had lived in Franklin, Mississippi before moving to Belmont. She remembers the story of the father taking his daughter, Era Mai and a friend, Helen Whitehead to Red Bay on Christmas Eve to a beauty shop and all were killed at a train crossing in Red Bay. Also one of the sons was killed at a barber shop in Iuka.

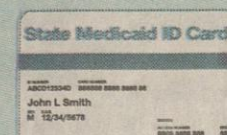

BRAVES FALL TO WARRIORS IN SEASON FINAL

Iuka, Miss. - - On Thursday, October 28, Tishomingo County High School honored 41 Senior Cheerleaders, Dancers, Cross Country Runners, Band Members, and Football Team Members on Senior Night. The Braves fell in the 2021 Season Finale 37 to zero to the visiting Corinth Warriors.

The Braves Offense managed to cross into Warrior territory four times throughout the course of the evening but never managed to cross the Goalline. Defensively, the Braves appeared to have trouble with the Warriors' speed off the edges. The Warriors led by 16 after one quarter of play, took a 30 point lead into the locker room at the half, and finished with seven more points in the

third quarter of play.

Despite the (1-9) record, several school records fell during the 2021 campaign. The Braves posted the largest comeback victory in school history by overcoming a 15-point deficit in the 'Big-bee Bell Rivalry Game. In that same contest, the Braves Offense chewed up the Most Rushing Yards in a Game with 456 Yards. The Braves Offense and Special Teams posted the Most All-Purpose Yards in a Game with 519 total yards in their trip at Mooreville. Senior Offensive Lineman Austin Hairrell posted 13 total Pancake Blocks in that contest against the Troopers, and he broke Nathan Wood's season total from 2020 with 29 this Season. Senior Defensive Line-

man Caleb Bonds broke a record with three forced fumbles also against Belmont. Junior Defensive Back Austin Hankins tied a school record with four kickoff tackles in that same contest. Senior do-it-all Player Bryan Scales tied a school record with 4 fumble recoveries.

Offensively, the 2021 Braves were paced by Senior Blake Counce who accounted for 1,153 total yards, while Junior Chandler Williams added 1,105 total yards. Williams led all rushers with 614 rushing yards and 7 rushing touchdowns as well. Receiving wise, Williams hauled in 291 receiving yards while Senior Mason Daniel compiled 191 receiving yards and two touchdowns. Williams led all teammates in scoring

with 54 total points.

Defensively, the Braves were led by Freshman Linebacker Tristan Poling who compiled 43 solo tackles, 59 assisted tackles, 102 total tackles, 8 for loss, and 1.5 sacks on the campaign. Bonds added 57 total tackles, 17 for loss, 1.5 sacks, and 2 Fumble Recoveries. The other two members of the Linebacking Corps were Junior Jaxson Pryce-Jones and Freshman Owen Nash who added 56 and 50 total tackles respectively. No one contributed more down the Division Stretch than Senior Defensive Back Konnor Tuders who posted 48 total tackles, most of them during Division Play. In the air,

Senior Chase Hopkins led the team with 2 Interceptions and 5 Pass Breakups.

On the Special Teams Front, Mason Daniel was the leading "Special Teams Enforcer." He had 1,416 Kickoff Yards, 1,057 Punt Yards for a 33.0 average and placed 7 inside the 20-Yard Line, and put up 14 Extra Points. Scales added 215 total return yards.

Head Coach Richard Russo had this to say, "First, let me address the outgoing Seniors. We thank you for your years of service and your blood, sweat, tears, and laughter that you put into the Braves Program. It is my hope that you learned a lot more than X's and O's from our Program and
