Belmont and Tish. County Girls Progress to Second Round of Playoffs with wins Monday

There were Division winners at both high schools in the county last week, as both the Belmont Lady Cardinals and the Tishomingo County Lady Braves clinched their division with wins in their respective tournaments. Then, both teams were victorious Monday night in the first round of the state playoffs, setting the county up for

second round games Friday night on the home courts of both schools.

### **Division 1-2A Tournament**

Belmont beat perennial rival New Site 43-34 in their 2A tournament last Friday night. Carlie Brock lead the Lady Cards with 18 points, Brooklyn Hodum had 9 points, Kat Reno and Mary-Grace Storment brought in 6 each, and Kalea Koger and Rayleigh Guin contributed 2

In the semi-final game, Belmont defeated Pine Grove 52-46.

In First Round playoff play Monday night, Belmont trounced Charleston 76-26, and will play Choctaw County Friday night at 7 p.m.

### **TCHS Division Tournament**

# MDOT Highway 25 Safety Improvements Should Wrap in Fall 2022

Commuters and travelers have been driving around several construction areas along Tishomingo County's main north-south highway, and MDOT engineers say the work should be done in late fall 2022.

The \$5.7 million in improvements are part of an overall safety improvement plan for about 36 miles of the two-lane main artery through the county - from the Highway 350 intersection in the north to nearly the Itawamba County line south of Belmont.

Traffic engineers from the Mississippi Department of Transportation performed a safety audit of the entire Highway 25 corridor prior to the resurfacing work that was mostly completed last year, according to MDOT District Construction Engineer Jamie McDonald. Based on Department of Public Safety accident data from the past 5-10 years, and the engineering team's survey of the highway, they identified about twentynine locations that needed improvements to enhance safety for the thousands of cars, buses, trucks and tractor trailers that use the road daily.

'The areas where there's

significant work of realignments, turn lanes, crossover improvements and signalization had a history of accidents," said McDonald.

A new box culvert at the intersection of Woodall Mountain Road (County Road 192), and CR 192 and CR 196 just south of Iuka is a major part of the design, which will also include a guard rail along the roadside.

### Two New Traffic Lights

In addition to a new traffic signal, the intersection of Battleground Drive with Highway 25 will get a modified turn lane to cut down the distance for left turning vehicles to get over to the high traffic business area that includes Jack's, McDonald's and Exxon.

The "Sonic" intersection of

Highway 172/Quitman and Highway 25 will also get a new traffic signal, bringing to three the number of stop lights in the county!

### **Limiting Access Points**

Because some federal funds are being used to construct the improvements, MDOT had to abide by federal requirements to limit access to the main highway in many areas where drivers could just pull onto the road anywhere along an extended stretch. These areas create mixing points where traffic winds up hung, explained McDonald, increasing the possibility of accidents, due to limited sight distances. By building curbs and medians, traffic engineers aim to take away conflict points, and also prevent trucks from parking along

the road, improving sight distance. In the high traffic intersection of Highway 30 and Highway 25, there will be some access-limiting curbs installed, and crew are now creating a median on the east side of the intersection. At the nearby gas station Martyville, during busy times, four or five trucks, cars or tractor-trailers attempt to enter the highway, or turn into the gas station/ convenience store at the same time, and engineers are aiming to mitigate the risk in areas like this.

The intersection with Highway 4 in Dennis, and a turn lane at the Tishomingo County Career and Technical Center, and sight distance improvements at Highway 350, Ridge Road south of Belmont and Red Bud Road are other areas in the contract.

The contractor for the project is Cook and Son, LLC, from Smithville.

# City folks need to carry own large items to dump

New policy aimed at improving the looks of Iuka's streets

The City of Iuka has announced a new policy calling for residents to carry their own landfill items to the county landfill, instead of the City workers picking it up.

By March 6th, 2022, property owners must have items like mattresses, construction and renovation waste, appliances and furniture out of their yards, or be cited by the city as a nuisance property. Beginning this month, the city won't pick up these items. Property owners with these items out in the yards are being notified by

The notice also urges landowners place items the city will pick up at the edge of their property, and not in the street.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen are dedicated to improving the visual presence of our community, the city said via a

We encourage every citizen to work with the city and address any cleanup issues by the March 6, 2022

**NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS** 

Employees of the City of Iuka may

only pick up bagged leaves, bagged yard trimmings and trimmed bush/ tree limbs 3 inches in diameter or less and not more than five feet in length from private property. Please note that the City will not enter private property to pick up any item to haul off – proper materials must be left at the edge of the street for pick up. Do not pile any materials in the street. Further, no pile of materials may block the view of the right of way or may be higher than three feet.

The City will not haul yard waste generated by professional landscapers. The City will not haul

off materials such as mattresses, construction and renovation waste, appliances and furniture - disposal of these and other nonconforming items are the responsibility of the land owner solely.

Please have all nonconforming items cleaned from your yard by the end of the day on March 6, 2022 or the City may ticket you as a nuisance property. Thank you for your cooperation.

### County Girls' teams head to 2nd Round Friday night





# Shiloh to Conduct **Prescribed Burns**

SHILOH, Tennessee - "Shiloh National Military Park will conduct a prescribed burn within the next two weeks," announced Superintendent Allen Etheridge. "Prescribed burns are weather dependent, which requires us to work within a window of time waiting for the proper weather conditions." Park staff, with assistance from the Natchez Trace Parkway Fire Management Team, will burn two units: East Branch Shiloh Creek and the Spain Field Unit.

The East Branch Unit is a 231-acre unit bordered by Hamburg-Purdy Road to the north, Eastern Corinth Road to the east, Corinth Road to the west, and, sharing a boundary with the Middle Branch Unit, Peabody Road to the south. The Spain Field Unit is a 163-acre unit bounded by the Hamburg-Purdy Road on the north, the Eastern Corinth Road and Gladden Roads on the west, and all the way to the southeastern boundary of the park around Larkin Bell Field.

Prescribed fire is a beneficial and cost-effective tool for managing several forest types, as well as grasslands. Historically, fire has played a natural role in maintaining a healthy ecosystem. A controlled burn reduces the build-up of dead woody debris and non-native vegetation, decreases risk of catastrophic wildfire, and provides habitat and forage for animals.

Warning signs will be placed along the roads as a safety precaution to motorists and pedestrians. Motorists are expected to travel at a safe speed with their headlights on when smoke is present during the burn. They should also be alert for park rangers, wildland firefighters, and equipment along these roadways.

Grocery store shelves are not like they used to be. Before the pandemic there was plenty of whatever we typically wanted. It's not like that today.

Car dealerships have changed. Before the pandemic most dealers had plenty of new and used cars to sell. We were accustomed to browsing several lots as we shopped and compared models and prices. It's not like that today.

When you needed your car fixed, parts were readily available or just an overnight order away. Today, you might wait three or four months for a part.

I recently looked into adding an additional heating unit to my house and was told, "Order it now and you might have it by summer."

A friend of mine ordered a small boat last August with the hopes he will have it by May or June this year,

The pandemic has changed our lives in more ways than sickness and death. The new normal is having to wait longer on what used to be so available.

If you think America's products, food and merchandise are difficult to get now, then can you imagine if our American truckers all went on strike?

Canadian truckers have recently blocked the flow of goods into the United States. The protest follows rallies over opposition to COVID-19 mandates in cities across Canada. In a show of solidarity with a demonstration in Ottawa that has gone on for more than a week by the socalled Freedom Truck Convoy. The protests have paralyzed the Canadian capital's business district and led the mayor to call for 2,000 extra police officers to quell the nightly demonstrations.

Several people involved in the protest Tuesday in Canada said the demonstrations had expanded from its original purpose, opposing mandates for cross-border truck drivers, and were there in opposition to all vaccine mandates, in addition to supporting truck drivers, the Windsor Star reported.

"Any delay or disruption in the supply chain creates problems, not just for agriculture but the state economy," said Chuck Lippstreu, president of the Michigan Agri-Business Association, which represents businesses that support farmers, early in the closure.

The Canadian Vehicle Manufacturers' Association, which represents the Detroit Three automakers, called for an end to the protest, citing its effect on the country's economy. (NNY.360.com)

I also want to say how much I love every person who ever worked at the paper. So many over the years - again, too many to mention, but I treasure you all and the wonderful times we had. There was never a boss/employee atmosphere; we were just

great times together. We laughed, we cried, we celebrated birthdays and wonderful Christmas




