No Shame in Runner-Up Trophies for TC, Belmont Girls

Both the teams from Tishomingo County fell short in their goal of a state championship last week, but their accomplishments of rallying the county behind them was landmark, and their narrow defeats hopefully increased that desire for the gold ball in the county next season.

On Thursday, the Tishomingo County Lady Braves fell to Choctaw Central 56-49, but still ended up highly ranked state wide for their tremendous 31-4 season.

In the Clarion Ledger Super 10, TC was ranked number 8 state wide, after powerhouse teams from Neshoba Central (33-0), Meridian (27-3), Harrison Central (29-3), Clinton (21-8), Germantown (24-7), Choctaw Central (29-4), and Columbus (23-5), and ahead of Jackson Prep and Leake Academy.

That's an accomplishment, no matter how you look at it, and with the team only losing two outstanding seniors, the program is well-positioned for another deep post-season run in 2022-23. "We are excited about our returning

team," said Coach Brian Middleton. "We believe we have the opportunity to be back competing for a gold ball again."

"We are proud of Madison [Bennett] and Clara [Garland] and what they accomplished here; they left the program better than they found it, and we will miss them," said Middleton. "But this also left our underclassmen hungry to return to the Big House. They are excited about the opportunities the future brings."

Clara Garland had 15 points, 11 rebounds and 4 blocks in the finals game. Bennett had 18 points and 3 steals, and Reese Moore had 16 points and 6 rebounds.

The TC fans deserve a special recognition; the absolute sea of blue made some folks wonder if there were any people left in Tishomingo County during the Thursday game! And, they stood up, participated and supported the girls the entire game, giving the dedicated Choctaw Central crowd a run for their money.

Belmont Misses 44-46 to Lake

Belmont fell short by only two points in their bid for a back-to-back state championship, falling to Lake 46-44.

Mary-Grace Storment had 16 points; Carlie Brock had 15 points, Rayleigh Guin had 5 points, and Kat Reno and Kalea Koger had 4 points each.

"I am very proud of this group of girls for what they were able to accomplish this season," said Belmont coach Chris Higginbottom of his seventh trip to the state tournament finals. "They won 27 games, went undefeated in division play and won the division tournament. There are not many players who get to experience what these girls got to experience this season by being able to play for a state championship. I know we did not finish as state champions, but being runner-up in 2A does not take away from the great season that we had this year."

Brooks buys Elm Shopping Center for new store

Local grocers Brooks and Lisa Davis have purchased the Elm Shopping Center in Iuka intending to build a new, larger version of their popular Brooks Grocery.

Timing for construction is still to be determined, reported businessman Brooks Davis on Tuesday. But their intention is to demolish current structures and build something larger than their current 12,500-square-foot store just across Battleground Drive, but smaller than their 20,000-square-foot one they opened in Tupelo in 2021. They also intend to have gas pumps, like at the Tupelo Coley Road store, he said.

on Battleground Drive was built in the 1970s, and was long anchored by Fred's discount store and pharmacy, but Fred's left in recent years and now there are about eight tenants from AutoZone, beside Piggly Wiggly, to where Indian Creek crosses under Battleground Drive. Davis says he thinks that stores south of the former Fred's location will likely remain in place, including the popular Iuka Hospital Wellness Center, AutoZone, McMillians DVD store, and others. Brooks Grocery opened in Iuka in 2009, in the former Nelson's grocery store on Battleground Drive. Grocery entrepreneur Brooks Davis, from Red Bay, Alabama, made many changes, aimed at attracting a larger and more

varied clientele, targeting the needs of not only local shoppers, but also the hundreds of Pickwick Lake visitors. Offerings like ready-to-eat and ready-to-cook foods, their "fresh foods, friendly service" motto, and an intentionally friendly atmosphere appeals to shoppers who enjoy frequenting upscale markets like Whole Foods or Publix, but appreciate being able to get all that in their hometown.

"We'd just like to be able to offer more, and we are out of space in our current location," said Davis. They hope to modify the design of the Tupelo store for the new Iuka store.

County cities mull decision on medical marijuana

Municipalities in Tishomingo County are considering recently enacted medical marijuana state legislation and mulling the decision to opt out within a 90-day window.

If cities or counties do nothing, the law takes effect as written, but for 90 days, counties and cities have the opportunity to pass on medical marijuana business occurring within their jurisdictions. And, they can opt out separately; county can opt out, but cities within can opt in.

"There are just too many unknowns," said Tishomingo Mayor James Tennison said. The town of Tishomingo is setting an open public meeting in early April to get public feedback. But he says he is leaning toward the small town opting out, mostly for financial reasons.

"From what we've been advised, the medical marijuana dispensaries can't bank their money in a regular bank, and it's an all-cash business," said Tennison. The security problem caused by a dispensary having to "warehouse" their own cash would mean hiring more police; always a challenge for a small town's police department, he said.

"I'm not against it; if that kind of treatment would have been available for my father when he was sick, I'd have welcomed it over the awful drugs he had to take," said Tennison. He said he wished the legislature would have allowed for distribution through pharma-

; cies instead.

Towns can opt out once, and choose to opt back in later one time, when policies are firmed up statewide.

Iuka Mayor Joel Robertson said he handed his board members a packet of information to get familiar with before they discuss any action at the next board meeting.

The law passed by the legislature and signed by the governor allows for counties and municipalities to opt out of any one segment of the medical marijuana business while allowing others, including cultivation, processing, sale or distribution. The law limits dispensaries to commercial zones, and they must be a certain dis-

tance from schools, churches, day cares and other dispensaries. Cultivation must occur indoors in secure facilities within the state.

Ridgeland and Pass Christian are among cities in the state who have opted out of the program entirely.

There are steep fees to get into the medical marijuana business: owners of dispensaries will pay a first year license fee of \$40,000, which includes an annual license fee of \$25,000 and non-refundable application fee of \$15,000. The annual renewal is \$25,000. Annual fee for cultivators range from \$2,000 to \$150,000 depending on size, in addition to a one-time application fee.

The Mississippi Department of Reve-

nue ABC Permit Department is set to begin accepting license applicants for dispensaries no later than July 1.

The Mississippi Department of Health will handle licensing for medical marijuana patients and cultivators and plans to begin accepting online applications in June.

Tishomingo applies for \$100K grant to expand walking track

The new part of the trail would run along the ridge from behind the school, through the woods to the ball fields, explained Tishomingo Mayor James Tennyson.

"It would be great for everyone," said Tennyson. "We have to match the money ment."

The town's new maintenance shop should be in use by the end of summer, Tennyson confirmed. The town is building a 2,400 square foot building to house about \$300,000 of equipment they have purchase over the past few years. It would allow them to store the trucks and heavy equipment indoors.

The shop is being constructed by Pearson Construction, and we are glad to be working with local contractors, said Tennyson.

Iuka City Board Board considers rezoning Painted Lady; approves renovating Spring Park courts

According to a legal advertisement, a group is asking the city to rezone to commercial a landmark Victorian home facing Mineral Springs Park so it can be used as an event venue.

The Painted Lady, an antebellum home renovated completely about 2015 by Bill and Kathy Gurley has been on the market more than a year, and a potential investor wants to purchase it and open a bed and breakfast/event venue, depending on the rezoning.

In other City of Iuka business, last Tuesday, the Board of Aldermen voted to approve a bid received by Slocum Construction to resurface tennis and basketball courts at Iuka's Mineral Springs Park for \$39,000. They also approved a \$19,900 bid by Peebles Sports Courts to repaint the courts.

The board heard from Curtis and George Long regarding their property being cited under the new city property clean up ordinance. They asked the city for a list detailing what exactly needed to be cleaned up.

The board approved hiring Joren Lindley and Cameron Williams as full time employees for the Public Works Department with a starting

hourly rate of \$12.00 per hour. The board also approved hiring Landon Pollard as part time employee for Iuka Public Library.

After the 2021 tornado that struck the City of Iuka, the City was granted permission by Charles Stafford to utilize his property for wreckage from storm damage. The City voted Tuesday to assist in the cleanup of those materials that were directed to be placed there by the City during the tornado clean up.

The Board was in executive session for a personnel issue about an hour.

James Morris Morgan subject of UDC February program

The United Daughters of the Confederacy, John Marshall Stone Chapter 394 met February 28, at the Iuka Public Library, there were three present. The UDC rituals were completed, and each gave their reports. We discussed a person of interest who fought in the Korean War and does not have a marker. We are going to check in on this and see what may be done. There was no other business; our February Program was "James Morris Morgan, Fifteen-year-old Rebel Reefer."

James Morris Morgan was born in New Orleans in 1845, the eighth child of Thomas Gibbs Morgan and Sarah Fowler Morgan. He characterized himself as a restless, energetic boy who changed schools three times before entering the U.S. Naval Academy in 1860. He did not like school and only attended school when it suited him. He always loved soldiers.

There was a United States arsenal in Baton Rouge where he was raised. General Zachary Taylor lived on the garrison with his famous old war horse "Whitey," and James recalled the greatest delight that when he was put was the back of "Whitey" when he was grazing. He began his Navel training on the Constitution, known as Old Ironsides.

He was fifteen and small for his age. He was called "Little Morgan," a nickname that would stay with him the rest of his life. He was later told to go home and tell his parents that as soon as the Confederate government established a naval school. he would have one of the first appointments. He was very disappointed, and headed back home. He met his brother Harry in New Orleans. Harry was killed the next day in duel. James and his brother Philip Harry's took remains back to Baton Rouge. Captain Boothe ask James's father for his son for an important assignment and his father gave his consent. The Army wagon and four soldiers brought in this heavy trunk and gave him written orders. He carried the trunk into his brother house with the help of the butler and two truckmen. When awoke the next morning he discovered the trunk missing. His brother Philip claimed to know the contents of the trunk and he scolded James for being so careless. He told James that he had pulled the trunk under his own bed.. James delivered the trunk to Colonel Bogg in Mobile.
