Hate Roadside Trash in **Tishomingo County? Spring Cleanup Efforts Starting this Weekend**

Most Tishomingo County residents agree that they hate the amount of trash that gets discarded along our roadways, natural areas, and in towns. In addition to just not littering or dumping, and keeping your own property trash and junk-free, there are several opportunities to join with others to keep our county beautiful.

On the River this Saturday

In preparation for Lake Season, our local Keep Iuka Beautiful volunteers will join with ones from Keep the Tennessee River Beautiful for a cleanup day at the Eastport Boat Ramp this Saturday, March 26th.

Volunteers are invited to come to the boat ramp past Eastport Marina from 10 a.m. To 2 p.m. This Saturday to clean up some messes that have accumulated.

"The sites we located have some EXCESSIVE trash," said Kathleen Gibi, one of the Keep the Tennessee River Beautiful organizers. "One site alone has probably 50-75 bags worth of litter and 15 tires at it, so we could use all the help we can get!"

"This cleanup will be a larger cleanup, with our friends at Living Lands & Waters bringing

their five boats to supplement the KTNRB boat. Join us to help remove litter that has collected along the shorelines of the Tennessee River, much of which was brought here by recent flooding," Gibi said. Go to the www.keeptnriverbeautiful. org/pickwick site to register, complete a waiver, and get a tshirt.

Volunteers should bring a mask, bottled water, wear closed-toed shoes and long pants, and are recommended to wear sunblock and bring bug spray.

Family loses all in Monday night fire on Snowdown Road

A Snowdown Road family lost everything in a house fire around 11 p.m. Monday night.

According to Tishomingo County Fire Coordinator Ricky Cummings, the house fire was fully involved when Iuka Fire Department crews arrived on the scene a little after 11 p.m. The structure was already falling in when fire fighters attempted to enter, he said.

Cummings said that home-

owner Gary Bolton was outside when he heard a popping noise, which turned out to be the back porch on fire when he walked around to check. The fire quickly spread and it ended up being a total loss.

Nearby residents heard what sounded like gunshots, but Cummings confirmed that was likely ammunition that was inside the home.

Other units responding included harmony Central and Snowdown-Pleasant Hill volunteer fire departments.

In addition to Gary Bolton, Elizabeth Bolton and two teens were living at the home.

Neighbors and friends are collecting items for the Bolton family, who lost everything but what they were wearing, and their pets.

Cycling Season on Trace Impacted by Closure through Tishomingo County


Spring weather means long rides for bicycling enthusiasts, and the extended closure of a local section the popular Natchez Trace means that some cyclists will be detouring through the county on our busy highways that are not bicycle-friendly.


Truck and automobile drivers are urged to be alert to anyone riding along the detour route, which includes Highway 72 from Cherokee, and Highway 25 from Iuka to Dennis.

The Trace is closed for resurfacing/rehabilitation between milepost 321 and milepost 293, and much of that is through Tishomingo County.

If cyclists are not aware of the detour in advance, it could put them riding bikes down highways that are even less bikefriendly than the Trace, which at least has a low speed limit and multiple signs warning drivers to allow room for cyclists.

The National Park Service, who operates and maintains the 444-mile long Trace, designates the entire trek as a bike route. With scenery and gorgeous vistas instead of utility poles, buildings and commercial vehicles, the Trace attracts many recreational riders each year.





National Park Service map Construction on the Natchez Trace Parkway puts Trace traffic on a detour through Tishomingo County on Highways 25 and







Cajun Chicken Pasta an easy family favorite

Thanks for all the nice comments about Zora Lee's sausage cornbread last week! We have been encouraged to keep this cooking column going!

This week I'm featuring another favorite that's one of my dear husband's specialties: Cajun chicken pasta.

We have been making this a long time, so I don't even remember where we got the original recipe, but it has turned out to be great for weeknights, and even impresses as a Sunday dinner dish. You can spice it up more or less, according to your family's taste.

We in no way pretend to be Cajun or Creole, nor are experts, but we do love the food from our southern neighbors, and have adapted a few dishes for our family. With a perfectly adorable grandbaby in Baton Rouge, it's just lagniappe to also get some great food while we are there visiting him! And his parents.

The recipe calls for Andouille (an-dew-ee) sausage, but don't let that scare you off if you are unfamiliar; smoked sausage is what you want and you can use Conecuh or even Bryan Cajun smoked versions that are easy to find locally.

But we love to make it with the incredible smoked sausage we always make it a point to purchase at Cutrer's stand in Baton Rouge's Red Stick Farmer's Market downtown. Cutrer's (out of Kentwood, Louisiana) says its a 100-year-old secret recipe of Paw Gaylon's. Top quality ingredients and seasoning...I highly advise you to NOT look this up online if you are even slightly hungry!

As if this dish wasn't good enough, sometimes we add some shrimp for the very last 3-4 minutes.

We pair this with a fresh loaf of French bread and a salad for a complete meal. The bread and salad help it to stretch further, so you can take the leftovers for lunch!



Cajun Chicken Pasta

2 teaspoon Cajun seasoning

- 2 boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into thin strips
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Andouille sausage, sliced
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 8 slices green pepper
- 8 slices sweet red pepper
- 6 medium fresh mushrooms, sliced
- 1 green onion, sliced
- 1 to 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- ¹/₄ teaspoon dried basil
- ¹/₄ teaspoon lemon-pepper seasoning
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon garlic powder1/8 teaspoon pepper4 oz. linguine, cooked and drained grated Parmesan cheese, optional

In a large resealable plastic bag, toss Cajun seasoning and chicken to coat.

In a large skillet, sauté chicken in butter over medium heat until no longer pink, about 5-7 minutes. Add sausage in last few minutes. Add vegetables; cook and stir until tender, 2-3 minutes. Reduce heat. Stir in cream and seasonings. Add linguine and toss to coat; heat through. If desired, sprinkle with cheese.

The Braves threatened almost every inning, but only managed to push two runs across as the Braves went down 6-2 to Itawamba Monday night.


The Braves loaded the bases three times, but were unable to turn any of

4-H and Tishomingo County Coalition receive United Way grants

NORTHEAST Miss. - United Way of Northeast Mississippi has officially wrapped up one of the toughest fundraising cycles in its 60-year history with the allocation of 2022-2023 grants to its nonprofit partners.

At their March meeting, the United Way board of directors voted to approve grants totaling \$1,497,467.50 to 53 nonprofit organizations across their eight-county service area. Organizations in Tishomingo County receiving United Way funding include Tishomingo County 4-H (\$2,500), and the Tishomingo County Community Coalition (\$29,340), in addition to regional organizations that serve residents of

Tishomingo County.

"Each organization that applied for United Way funding is doing amazing work," said Dr. Ormella Cummings, who serves as the Community Impact chair on the United Way board of directors. "We wish that we could have given each of them all the money they requested for their programs. However, we had to make some tough decisions based on how much money we had available. I'm proud of the work of our volunteers in making those hard choices."

Continuing challenges presented by the Covid-19 pandemic made raising money more difficult for United Way this past year. They fell short of their

target of \$2.6 million, bringing in just over \$2.43 million (or about 94% of the goal), which affected the amount of money available to grant to partner organizations.

Despite the struggles, the United Way staff and board were thankful for the continued generosity of Northeast Mississippians.

"While we didn't reach our goal, we are very grateful for the support our donors have shown up to support more than 50 agencies and 60 programs that are helping their neighbors in Northeast Mississippi.'

Despite a decrease in campaign donations in 2021, funding for United Way's community
