## Saturday runoff for 2 power board seats

Last week's power board elections resulted in two new directors, and two runoffs this Saturday. Josh Clark won the 3rd district seat outright, with 55 percent of the vote (271 votes) and incumbent Jeff Holt will keep his 4th district seat, as he was running unopposed (391 votes).

Running against Clark, incumbent David Whitfield had 185 votes, and Tulon McKee had 34.

In the 5th district, there will be a runoff, between incumbent Darrin Caldwell (35%) and Erik McDonald (43%), as neither won at least 50 percent of the total vote. Steve Nunley had 103 votes and 21 percent.

In the Area At-Large race, Colton Sims (47%) and Randy Hickox (40%) will meet again in a runoff. Coney Marlar had 56 votes (12%).

#### Runoff Saturday

The TCEPA Board of Directors election runoff

will be this Saturday, August 20th.

An election runoff will be held Saturday, August 20, 2022, to elect two (2) members for positions on the Board of Directors of Tishomingo County Electric Power Association.

One director is to be elected for a three (3) year term for each of the following supervisor's districts: 5th District and an Area at-large position.

Members of the Association may vote for one person for each position on the ballot.

The polling precincts will be open from 8 a.m. until 6 p.m. so that members may vote. Members may vote at any poll regardless of their place of residence. The polls are as follows:

Customers who are purchasing power using the memberships of another should check with the Association's Main Office to purchase their own membership or to make a proper transfer of membership whenever possible. All members are urged to participate in the Association's elections.



## Historic Iuka sign stolen

Authorities have offered a reward for the return of a landmark historic sign.

The arrow-shaped sign that hung near the Tishomingo County Courthouse Museum at the intersection of Quitman and Fulton Street had to be removed for repairs, explained Harold Lomenick, who helped restore the sign years ago.

The city of Iuka stored the sign in the city maintenance yard, while it awaited repairs to be done by the original restoration company, but someone or some person

removed or stole the sign from the city maintenance yard.

"This sign had been serving the Iuka community for more than 60 years," said Lomenick. "The sign needs to be returned so that it can be restored and placed back in its original location," he urged.

## Deer Park open for building dream homes in Iuka

Availability of places to build a home in Iuka has long been an issue, but a new subdivision has opened up offering affordable lots in the city for families to build their dream home.

Originally designed and developed by Larry Bonds, Deer Park subdivision has space for about 30 homes, and is just off Constitution Drive in Iuka. It's far enough from the business district to qualify as a quiet neighborhood; but conveniently just minutes to schools, shopping, and restaurants.

City utilities already run to the 28 lots that range in size from half to one-and-a-half acre homesites, including city water, wastewater, and power. The roads are paved, with curbs, and there are only two completed homes in the neighborhood, so choice lots are still available. The land has been cleared, and graded –

ready to build homes on.

Recently acquired by Joiner and Raynard Construction, LLC, the company had planned to build single-family homes to help meet the need for affordable homes in Iuka.

With companies announcing hundreds of new jobs coming in, they sought to meet that need, but have changed their construction focus to complete two hotels they are renovating in Iuka, deciding to open up Deer Park to private home builders to build their own homes.

"It's a beautiful, quiet neighborhood close to town, a great place to build a home and raise a family," said developer Julien Raynard. "We look forward to seeing it grow as a neighborhood, bringing other families to the Iuka area we have come to love."

And it would seem so, if you only look at them from the perspective of how they express themselves. From the outside, it looks pretty clear that the MAGA people and the Rainbow people aren't traveling in the same direction. And they're not. Not as individual groups. Does that mean that they have nothing in common? Well, that's where a bit of a deeper look is required.

In my exhausting attempts to wrap my mind around why no one seems to understand and accept anything or anyone else, I have found a much more accurate and simplified way of classifying people, and it has nothing to do with what they look like or believe. The flaw here is that there is value to be lost if we walk away from the traditions and beliefs that have bound us together as a species, as groups, and as nations. These people are the Backer-Uppers.

The other group of people, the Double-Downers, have a whole different strategy to deal with change and new or contradictory information. When presented with ideas or discoveries that call what they believe to be true into question, the Double-Downers will do as the name implies and double their

efforts to prove themselves right. They start with the assumption that whatever they have built their belief system and intellect on is infallible and all new or contradictory information must be wrong. These folks will do some pretty impressive mental gymnastics to twist and mold any contradictory information into a shape that fits into their box. If it doesn't fit in the box, it must not be true. This mindset is designed to maintain the status quo indefinitely. The flaw here is that the overall system which they fight to maintain is in and of itself very flawed, not to mention that the status quo is inherently going to change with or without their input.

It is my belief that we need both kinds of people. We need Double-Downers to remind us of where we have been and where we are going. We also need Backer-Uppers to navigate the path in an ever-changing world. One thing is true for us all though. We must all accept that we live in an indescribably huge universe that will never stop changing or teaching us new lessons. A reality-based conversation and our willingness to accept these changes and knowledge will determine if we are going to continue to evolve along with that universe or be one of thousands of extinct species that could not or would not adapt to change. ## Back to Our Roots: Into the Land of the Rising Sun

Our annual Heritage Day festival is right around the corner. I thought it would only be fitting to share with you a series of columns about the true heritage of our small town.

Heritage Day is a wonderful tradition for our citizens, and we have much to study and learn about the rich history of our area before our European ancestors moved into the Tennessee Valley. Hopefully something you read here will resonate and you'll pass the stories along to your own children.

Here in our town, we seemed to have turned much of our attention to progress. Looking ahead to the future is a wonderful goal but we shouldn't forget to hold sacred the parts of our heritage and local history that make us unique. Long, long ago, before the chattering excitement of a new Taco Bell, before the rhythmic blinking of new red lights, before David Hubbard would scout out this small spot of land nestled in between three states, the area in which we live now was inhabited by the gentle indigenous people of the Chickasaw tribe. This is the ancient migration story passed down from generation to generation as it is told by the modern Chickasaw Nation.

Long ago, there came a time when the Chickasaw people needed to move from the West. The ancestors were told by wise prophets of the tribe that they should seek a home in the direction of the rising sun in the East. The guide to the new land would be a long pole made sacred by the Creator. The pole would be set in the ground perfectly straight at night and the following morning whichever way the pole leaned would signal the direction they should travel. They would continue in this fashion until the pole no longer leaned in any direction indicating they had reached their homeland.

To be safe, the tribe decided to travel in two groups. The brave young Minko' Chiksa would lead one group and his brave brother Minko' Chahta would lead the other. The great caravan of people set out into the direction of the rising sun divinely led in search of a promised homeland.

Far in front of the procession was a large white dog. He darted to the right, then to the left, always on alert for the people. They loved their faithful scout who helped keep them safe on this perilous journey. Travel was slow, sickness a constant companion. In cases of snake bite, tribal doctors would summon the big white dog to lick the wound and the victim would miraculously become well again.

One day, as the sun was setting, the two parties came upon a scene beyond their imagination. It was a great river, the likes of which they had never seen before. They stood astonished on the riverbank staring in awe of the mighty watercourse. Today that great river is known as the Mississippi. The people were full of joy believing they had finally reached their promised land. But as the sun rose, the pole leaned east, indicating that somewhere on the other side of the river was the true homeland they were seeking. They hurriedly constructed rafts to cross the river. In a great tragedy, the raft carrying the white dog broke into pieces. They helplessly watched him float away down the river on a broken piece of timber. It would be the last time they saw their faithful companion.

It took many days to safely ferry the people and their belongings to the other side of the mighty river. One morning, the group became excited as they gathered around the sacred pole. Minko' Chiksa believed the pole had wobbled somewhat and the promised land was yet to be found. All of those who believed him were instructed to pack up to leave out. Minko' Chahta and his people stayed behind believing they had found their new home. Minko' Chiksa led his people further eastward until the pole shifted its direction guiding the people westward. It was near what we know as modern-day Tupelo where the pole stood straight as an arrow. Eventually many tribes would spread out into north Mississippi.

Long before we would call it home, the land this town was built upon belonged to the Chickasaw.

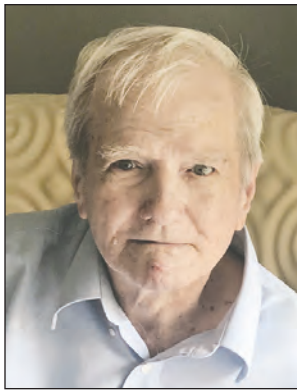


## Howard Ellis

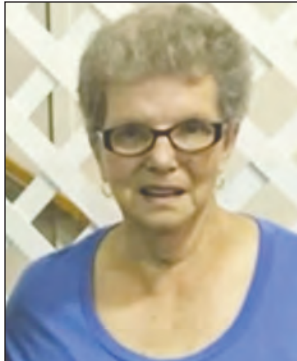


## Judy Rhodes

## Tomato pie is the best taste of summer

Tomato pie two ways: above, my family recipe, prepared in a small pie dish; just enough for two people. Below, country tomato and bacon pie, prepared by Sharon Stegall.

### Only good immediately after it's cooked, but that's OK, because you will want to eat it all!

I know there's something special about that first tomato sandwich of the year for lots of people, but for me, it's having enough tomatoes to make a tomato pie!

I love any kind of pie, even the savory ones, and the cheesy, soupy mess that is tomato pie is right up there among my favorites. The only problem with making tomato pie is there's always enough to feed a crowd, and now, we are empty nesters most mealtimes! So Sunday, I used a small pie pan to make a little pie, just right for two people! (Additionally, this justified having a sinful number of random baking pans!)

There was not much recipe adjustment, since you mostly "measure with your heart" on this anyway. This recipe is like your grandma's biscuit, or gravy recipe - it's more guidelines than cooking science. But that's what teaches you to be adventurous in your cooking!

#### Ingredient information

• Pre-baking the crust would probably help, but be sure to use baking beans or another pie

plate or something; my crust just crumpled down in on itself! Thank goodness I made two pie crusts.

- Definitely try to use Roma tomatoes, or, like I did, use oxheart tomatoes, which have more "meat" to them, and fewer seeds and juice. The less juice, the better in this recipe. After peeling and cutting them up, I put them in a colander allowing the juice to drain off.
- It's optimal to use fresh basil with this, but, being basil deficient this summer, I made it without basil and it was still delicious.

**Preparation:**

- Tomatoes - Fresh, and peeled and sliced/cut up. Enough to fill your pie dish to the top; they will cook down, so feel free to mound them up. Put them in a strainer to drain off excess liquid.
- Pie crust - a frozen one is fine for this, or use your favorite pastry recipe. Let it come to room temperature if it's frozen. You could pre-bake it a bit, but be sure to use baking beans or beads so the pie crust doesn't just sink down in the dish.
- Cheese - Remember that parmesan cheese is salty, and

consider that as you season

- Mayonnaise - about 1 cup for a regular size pie
- Grated parmesan cheese - ¾ cup
- Grated mozzarella cheese - ¾ cup
- Fresh basil, cut finely
- Salt and pepper to taste

Prepare your tomatoes, set aside to drain. Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Combine mayonnaise and cheeses in a bowl. Set aside.

Prepare your pie crust in pie dish of your choice. Lay tomatoes in layers in the prepared crust, lightly seasoning and adding in finely chopped basil, until they are in a mound and evenly distributed. Drop the mayo mixture in dollops across the top, then gently spread to completely cover the tomatoes.

Bake about 30 minutes, until crust and top are golden brown. Eat it all. It does not keep well!

**Bacon Tomato Pie**

My friend Sharon Stegall shared her bacon-tomato pie recipe with me weeks ago, but we were pitifully behind her in having any tomatoes to harvest. She used an actual recipe with the following



measurements:  
2-3 tomatoes, sliced  
19-inch deep dish frozen pie crust, baked to package instructions  
½ cup chopped green onions  
¼ cup cooked and crumbled bacon  
Freshly ground black pepper to taste  
½ cup mayonnaise  
1 cup shredded cheese, mozzarella or cheddar

If using a frozen pie crust, let it defrost about 10 minutes on the counter, then prick with a fork (this keeps the crust from

getting too puffy while baking).  
Bake it using the instructions on the package - usually 400F degrees for about 10-12 minutes.  
Allow crust to cool slightly. Reduce the oven heat to 350.  
Layer tomato slices on the bottom of the pie. Season with pepper. Top with green onions, basil and crumbled bacon.  
In a bowl combine mayonnaise with shredded cheese. Spread the cheese mixture on top of your pie.  
Bake at 350 F degrees for about 30-35 minutes, until golden brown.

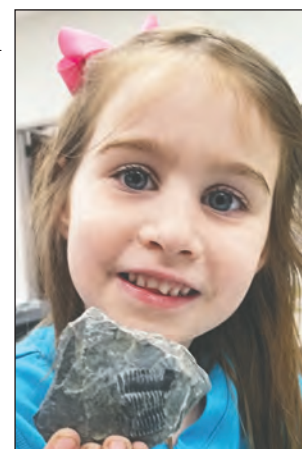
## Trilobites found at Iuka Library Saturday

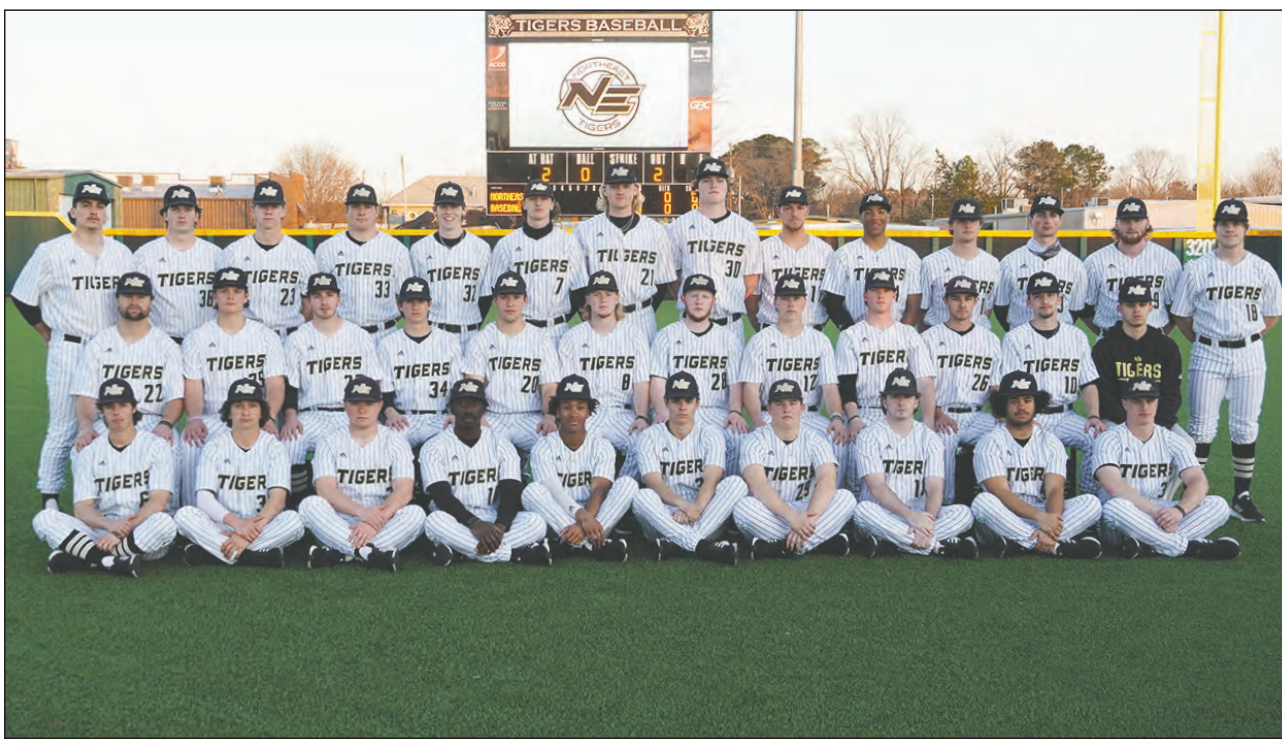

# Northeast baseball collects third straight academic excellence award

The Northeast Mississippi Community College baseball program is wrapping up a great season with another accolade for its achievements away from the diamond.

The Tigers were recipients of the 2022 American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Team Academic Excellence Award presented by Sports Attack.

Northeast obtained this recognition by accumulating an overall grade point average (GPA) of 3.29 on a 4.0 scale. The Tigers were also acknowledged as an All-Academic Team by the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA).

"It does not surprise me one bit that our GPA was that high with this group," said Northeast head coach Richy Harrelson. "When you get high character kids that care about everything, it's amazing to watch them. I'm proud of them."

The Tigers were one of just

four members of the Mississippi Association of Community Colleges Conference (MACCC) that received this decoration. There was a total of 34 NJCAA institutions on the ABCA's scholastic listing.

Twenty Northeast players secured individual honors for maintaining a GPA greater than 3.25. That includes NJCAA All-Academic Award winners Logan Bland (Olive Branch), Hayden Donahue (Booneville), Lock Elliott (Oxford), Colby Holcombe (Florence, Ala.), Eli Jones (Booneville), Jackson McCoy (Booneville), Jackson Owen (Starkville), Carter Phillips (Blue Springs) and Grayson Stone (Tishomingo).

The Tigers pieced together a historic campaign on the field. Northeast finished the regular season with a 27-16 record and brought playoff action to The Plex for the first time in its brief three-year existence.

Northeast won 15 of its last 17 MACCC contests to vault up the standings into a host role. The Tigers had victories over nationally ranked opponents East Central Community College and Pearl River Community College during that stretch.

Among the other highlights for Northeast this year was a combined no-hitter by Holcombe and Reeder against Kaskaskia (Ill.) College. It was the first no-no by the Tigers since March 2008.

Northeast also boasted the NJCAA Defensive Player of the Year in Owen and the MACCC Pitcher of the Year in Holcombe, who also collected first-team All-American laurels from the NJCAA.

The Tigers have now captured the ABCA Team Academic Excellence Award, which is given to programs at all levels of collegiate athletics plus high schools as well, for four of the past five years.
